

In January, 251,400 unemployed jobseekers



the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of January, showing a decrease of 34,400 from the previous year. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 5,100 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.6% of the labour force, which is 1.3 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.



The total number of jobseekers decreased


At the end of January, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 541,100, down 43,400 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 271,200 were men and 269,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 21,800 and the number of women by 21,600.

Of the jobseekers, 160,300 were employed, 137,700 on the open labour market and 22,600 through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 123,200, of whom 35,100 were in services promoting employment and 63,300 in training. Of the jobseekers, 251,400 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 34,400 fewer than the year before. In January, 15,100 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 300 fewer than in December. Since January last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 1,600. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week totalled 6,100, representing a decrease of 2,100 from the year before.

The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in January

At the end of January, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 251,400, down 34,400 on the previous year. Compared with December, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 5,100.


In January, 15,100 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 300 fewer than in December. Since January last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 1,600.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 25,900, down 1,700 from January a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 7,800 at the end of January, down 700 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres


Compared to the same period a year earlier, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in January in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Pirkanmaa (-17%), North Ostrobothnia (-16%), Ostrobothnia (-15%), Kainuu (-15%), North Karelia (-15%) and Lapland (-15%).

Unemployment decreased more among women than men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 144,700 (58%) were men and 106,700 (42%) were women, indicating a decrease of 800 for men and 4,300 for women from the figures for December. Compared with January a year ago, unemployment among men decreased by 16,200 (-10%) and among women by 18,200 (-15%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of January, the total number of unemployed jobseekers aged under 25 was 31,900, representing a decrease of 3,500 from January a year ago. Youth unemployment fell by 1,500 from December. The number of unemployed aged under 20 was 6,000. The number of unemployed aged over 50 was 94,100, representing a decrease of 14,700 on the year before. The number of unemployed aged over 55 was 65,100, representing a decrease of 10,700 on the year before.



Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from January last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-27%), lowest level of tertiary education (-15%), upper secondary level of education (-12%), doctoral or equivalent level (-11%), lower-degree level tertiary education (-11%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (-11%).

UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS by occupational group



Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from January last year; the most among service and sales workers (-7,000), craft and related trades workers (-6,000), professionals (-5,400), technicians and associate professionals (-3,900) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-3,100).


Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of January, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 65,900, down 23,700 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 39,200 were men and 26,600 were women, with the number of unemployed men decreasing by 12,300 (-24%) from the previous year and the number of women by 11,500 (-30%). The number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years was 33,100, down by 13,300 from the previous year.

Slight increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of January, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 122,000, up by 800 on the previous year. Compared with December, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 5,600. The activation rate at the end of January was 32.7%, which is 2.9 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.6% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 58,200, up by 400 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 63,800, also up by 400 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 373,400 at the end of January; a decrease of 33,600 from a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


The number of placements increased in local government

At the end of January, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 23,800, which is the same as the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 31% in local government jobs and 67% in the private sector. Since January last year, the number of placements has decreased by 8% in government jobs and increased by 1% in local government jobs and remained unchanged in the private sector. Of those employed, 49% were men. Placements for men increased by 100, and those for women decreased by 100 from the previous year.


Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of January, labour market training was attended by 18,800 students, up by 1,300 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,500 were men and 9,300 were women. Compared to the previous year, the number of men increased by 200 and the number of women by 1,100. In January, 4,600 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 500 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' at the end of January was people in integration training (6,000), which is 2,400 less than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year





The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of January, the number of persons in training was 2,100, which is 300 less than the year before. Of those in training, the number of men was 1,000 and of women 1,100. Career coaching was provided to 1,200 people; a decrease of 200 from the previous year. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 100 from the previous year.

The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 39,500 people, representing a decrease of 700 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 16,500, down by 200 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 23,000, representing a decrease of 500 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 10,600 persons in the group of 'unknown'; up by 900 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector





The number of job alternation substitutes increased slightly

A total of 3,000 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of January, which is 100 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,000 were men and 2,000 were women. The numbers remained almost the same as in the previous year.

IN TRIALS

More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 25,100 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of January, which is 1,800 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 14,000 were men and 11,100 were women. The number of men increased by 900 and the number of women also by 900 from the previous year.


Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 9,700 participants at the end of January, which is 1,400 fewer than the year before. Of the participants, 4,400 were men and 5,300 were women. The number of men decreased by 500 and the number of women by 900 from the previous year.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during January totalled 87,000, which is 12,400 more than in January last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in January amounted to 134,300, which is 20,400 more than a year ago. A total of 9,300 of these vacancies were filled during January, 4,100 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 39,400 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,800 vacancies were cancelled and 1,100 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of January was 84,200, up by 15,700 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for nine occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and a sales workers (6,500), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,800), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (1,300) and elementary occupations (1,200). The number of new job vacancies decreased only in the 'unknown' (-100) and professional (-100) groups.

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question. The figures also include registered jobseekers who are taking part in local government trial schemes for promoting employment.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
