In February, 245,800 unemployed jobseekers






A total of 245,800 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of February. This is 30,400 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers was down by 5,600 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.4% of the labour force, which is 1.1 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

- 9,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year

The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of February, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 538,500, down 39,200 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 270,500 were men and 267,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 19,500 and the number of women by 19,700.


Of the jobseekers, 161,700 were employed, 138,900 of them were on the open labour market and 22,800 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 124,900, of whom 36,300 were in services promoting employment and 64,100 in training. Of the jobseekers, 245,800 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 30,400 less than the year before. In February, 16,000 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 900 more than in January. Since February last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 900. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 6,000, representing a decrease of 2,100 from the year before.

Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in February

At the end of February, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 245,800, down 30,400 on the previous year. Compared with January, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 5,600.


In February, 16,000 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 900 more than in January. Since February last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 900.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 24,600, down 1,900 from February a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 7,600 at the end of February, down 800 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in February in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-15%), North Karelia (-15%), Southeast Finland (-14%), Ostrobothnia (-14%), Pirkanmaa (-13%) and North Ostrobothnia (-13%).

Unemployment decreased more among women than men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 142,500 (58%) were men and 103,400 (42%) were women, indicating a decrease of 2,200 for men and 3,400 for women from the figures for January. Compared with February a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 14,600 (-9%) and among women by 15,800 (-13%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of February, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 30,500, representing a decrease of 2,900 from February a year ago. Youth unemployment fell by 1,400 from January. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 5,700. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 92,900, representing a decrease of 13,400 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 64,400, representing a decrease of 9,700 on the year before.

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Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from February last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-27%), lowest level of tertiary education (-13%), doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-12%), upper secondary level of education (-10%) and lower-degree level tertiary education (-10%).

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Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from February last year; the most in the groups of service and sales workers (-6,300), craft and related trades workers (-5,500), professionals (-4,800), technicians and associate professionals (-3,500), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-2,800) and elementary occupations (-2,700).



Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of February, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 64,700, down 21,800 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 38,600 were men and 26,100 were women. The number of men decreased by 11,400 (-23%) from the previous year and the number of women by 10,400 (-29%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 32,300, which is 12,600 less than a year ago.



Slight decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of February, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 125,900, down 300 on the previous year. Compared with January, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 3,900. The activation rate at the end of February was 33.9%, which is 2.5 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.7% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 60,200, which is the same as last year. The number of women covered by these services was 65,700, down 300 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 371,800 at the end of February. This is 30,700 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


The number of placements decreased in all sectors

At the end of February, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 24,000, which is 600 less than the year before. Of those employed, 1% were in government jobs, 31% in local government jobs and 68% in the private sector. Since February last year, the number of placements has decreased by 5% in government jobs, by 2% in local government jobs and also by 2% in the private sector. Of those employed, 50% were men. Placements for men decreased by 200, and those for women by 400 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



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
Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of February, labour market training was attended by 20,200 students, up 2,200 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,200 were men and 9,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 700 and the number of women by 1,500. During February, 4,700 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 800 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' consisted of 6,500 people in integration training, which is 1,700 less than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




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The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of February, 2,500 persons were in training, which is 700 less than the year before. Of those in training, the number of men was 1,200 and of women 1,300. Career coaching was provided to 1,400 participants, which is 600 less than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 100 from the previous year.

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The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 40,300 people, representing a decrease of 600 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 16,900, down 100 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 23,400, representing a decrease of 500 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 10,900 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 900 on the previous year.

The number of job alternation substitutes increased slightly

A total of 3,000 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of February, which is 100 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,000 were men and 2,000 were women. The number of both men and women increased by almost 100 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year





A total of 25,900 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of February, which is 1,200 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 14,400 were men and 11,500 were women. The number of men increased by 600 and the number of women also by 600 from the previous year.

Participation in work and training trials decreased


Work and training trials had a total of 10,100 participants at the end of February, which is 2,000 less than a year earlier. Of the participants, 4,600 were men and 5,500 were women. The number of men decreased by 700 and the number of women by 1,300 from the previous year.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during February totalled 77,800, which is 8,700 more than in February last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 161,400 in February, which is 23,000 more than a year ago. A total of 11,400 of these vacancies were filled during February, 4,100 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 52,500 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,700 vacancies were cancelled and 1,500 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of February was 96,100, up 18,500 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for eight occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of craft and related trades workers (2,700), service and sales workers (2,200), elementary occupations (1,900), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (1,000), professionals (1,000) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,000). The number of new job vacancies had decreased the most in the categories of technicians and associate professionals (-900) and 'unknown' (-100).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question. The figures also include registered jobseekers who are taking part in local government trial schemes for promoting employment.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
