



# In October 272,500 unemployed jobseekers






A total of 272,500 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of October. This is 56,400 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 3,100 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 10.4% of the labour force, which is 2.1 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

### Trends:

- The total number of jobseekers decreased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 56,000 compared to the year before
- Services included in the activation rate had 3,000 less people than a year ago
- 8,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year

# All jobseekers



### The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of October, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 583,500, down 58,700 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 288,200 were men and 295,400 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 36,900 and the number of women by 21,800.


Of the jobseekers, 171,900 were employed, 148,100 of them were on the open labour market and 23,800 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 130,700, of whom 35,900 were in services promoting employment and 65,000 in training. Of the jobseekers, 272,500 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 56,400 less than the year before. In October, 10,100 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,000 more than in September. Since October last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 9,600. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 8,500, representing a decrease of 1,700 from the year before.

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### Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in October

At the end of October, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 272,500, down 56,400 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 3,100.


In October, 10,100 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,000 more than in September. Since October last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 9,600.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 26,900, down 3,700 from October a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 7,900 at the end of October, down 1,500 from the year before.

# Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres


Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in October in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Satakunta (-28%), Pirkanmaa (-25%) and Central Finland (-21%).

# Unemployment decreased more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 147,800 (54%) were men and 124,700 (46%) were women, indicating a decrease of 500 for men and 2,600 for women from the figures for September. Compared with October a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 33,100 (-18%) and among women by 23,400 (-16%).

### Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of October, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 32,300, representing a decrease of 8,700 from October a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from September by 1,000. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 7,000. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 106,300, representing a decrease of 19,100 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 74,800, representing a decrease of 13,600 on the year before.

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### Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from October last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-27%), higher-degree level tertiary education (-19%), lower-degree level tertiary education (-19%), lowest level of tertiary education (-18%) and upper secondary level of education (-17%).

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# Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from October last year; the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (-13,900), professionals (-9,000) and service and sales workers (-8,200).


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### Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of October, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 94,700, down 28,100 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 54,000 were men and 40,700 were women. The number of men decreased by 16,900 (-24%) from the previous year and the number of women by 11,100 (-21%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 48,800, which is 9,300 less than a year ago.



# Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of October, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 125,700, down 3,200 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 4,100. The activation rate at the end of October was 31.6%, which is 3.5 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.7% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 60,000, down 1,600 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 65,700, down 1,600 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 398,200 at the end of October. This is 59,600 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services.

# The number of placements increased in local government

At the end of October, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 24,300, which is 800 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 30% in local government jobs and 68% in the private sector. Since October last year, the number of placements has decreased by 20% in government jobs and by 0.3% in the private sector and increased by 16% in local government jobs. Of those employed, 51% were men. Placements for men increased by 100, and those for women by 800 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



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
# The number of persons in labour market training decreased

At the end of October, labour market training was attended by 19,000 students, down 4,400 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,800 were men and 9,200 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 2,300 and the number of women by 2,100. During October, 5,700 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 800 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (8,700), which is 500 less than the year before. In October, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 100, which is 800 less than in October last year.


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### The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of October, 2,800 persons were in training, which is 500 less than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,300 and of women 1,500. Career coaching had 1,600 participants, which is 300 less than the year before. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 200 from the previous year.

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# The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 41,200 people, representing an increase of 2,400 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 17,000, up 1,600 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 24,200, representing an increase of 800 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 9,700 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,600 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector




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### The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,300 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of October, which is 1,000 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,100 were men and 2,200 were women. The number of men decreased by 300, and the number of women by 700.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




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# More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 23,500 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of October, which is 200 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,200 were men and 10,200 were women. The number of men remained the same and the number of women increased by 200 on the previous year.

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
### Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 11,600 participants at the end of October, which is 800 less than the year before. Of the participants 5,100 were men and 6,500 were women. The number of both men and women decreased by 400 from the previous year.

# NEW JOB VACANCIES during the month and during the previous year



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### Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during October totalled 47,700, which is 7,700 more than in October last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in October amounted to 89,500, which is 13,100 more than a year ago. A total of 9,300 of these vacancies were filled during October, 5,300 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 40,100 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 2,100 vacancies were cancelled and 1,500 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of October was 38,900, up 5,500 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for seven occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of elementary occupations (2,300), craft and related trades workers (2,200), service and sales workers (1,700), professionals (1,000) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,000). The number of new job vacancies had decreased most in the category of technicians and associate professionals (-1,300) and 'unknown' (-100).

### Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
