

In January, 285,800 unemployed jobseekers




A total of 285,800 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of January. This is 57,000 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 9,700 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 10.9% of the labour force, which is 2.1 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of January, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 584,400, down 66,500 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 293,000 were men and 291,500 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 39,900 and the number of women by 26,700.


Of the jobseekers, 162,900 were employed, 140,000 of them were on the open labour market and 22,800 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 127,600, of whom 36,100 were in services promoting employment and 63,400 in training. Of the jobseekers, 285,800 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 57,000 less than the year before. In January, 16,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 700 less than in December. Since January last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 6,900. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 8,100, representing a decrease of 2,200 from the year before.

Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in January

At the end of January, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 285,800, down 57,000 on the previous year. Compared with December, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 9,700.


In January, 16,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 700 less than in December. Since January last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 6,900.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 27,500, down 5,100 from January a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 8,500 at the end of January, down 1,500 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres



Unemployment decreased more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 160,900 (56%) were men and 124,900 (44%) were women, indicating a decrease of 3,600 for men and 6,100 for women from the figures for December. Compared with January a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 32,800 (-17%) and among women by 24,200 (-16%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of January, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 35,400, representing a decrease of 8,000 from January a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from December by 2,900. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 6,200. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 108,800, representing a decrease of 20,300 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 75,800, representing a decrease of 14,200 on the year before.

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from January last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-27%), higher-degree level tertiary education (-20%) and lower-degree level tertiary education (-19%).

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from January last year; the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (-13,300), professionals (-8,900) and service and sales workers (-8,800).


Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of January, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 89,600, down 32,200 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 51,500 were men and 38,100 were women. The number of men decreased by 19,300 (-27%) from the previous year and the number of women by 12,900 (-25%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 46,300, which is 12,900 less than a year ago.





Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of January, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 121,200, down 500 on the previous year. Compared with December, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 6,600. The activation rate at the end of January was 29.8%, which is 3.6 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.5% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 57,800, down 300 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 63,400, down 200 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 407,000 at the end of January. This is 57,600 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of January, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 23,700, which is 1,800 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 31% in local government jobs and 67% in the private sector. Since January last year, the number of placements has decreased by 13% in government jobs and increased by 24% in local government jobs and by 3% in the private sector. Of those employed, 49% were men. Placements for men increased by 500, and those for women by 1,200 from the previous year.


The number of persons in labour market training decreased

At the end of January, labour market training was attended by 17,600 students, down 3,900 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,300 were men and 8,200 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 1,900 and the number of women by 2,000. During January, 4,100 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 1,400 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (8,400), which is 600 less than the year before. In January, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 100, which is 800 less than in January last year.

The number of persons in training increased

At the end of January, 2,400 persons were in training, which is 700 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,200 and of women 1,200. Career coaching had 1,400 participants, which is 500 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training increased by 200 from the previous year.

The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 40,200 people, representing an increase of 1,200 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 16,700, up 900 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 23,500, representing an increase of 300 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 9,700 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,400 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector





The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 2,900 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of January, which is 500 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,000 were men and 2,000 were women. The number of men decreased by 100, and the number of women by 300.

A total of 23,300 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of January, which is 800 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,100 were men and 10,200 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 300 and the number of women by 500.

Participation in work and training trials decreased


Work and training trials had a total of 11,100 participants at the end of January, which is 500 less than the year before. Of the participants, 4,800 were men and 6,200 were women. The number of men decreased by 200 from the previous year and the number of women by 300.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during January totalled 74,600, which is 16,200 more than in January last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in January amounted to 113,800, which is 22,500 more than a year ago. A total of 8,300 of these vacancies were filled during January, 4,200 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 35,400 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 2,000 vacancies were cancelled and 1,300 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of January was 68,500, up 16,100 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for ten occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and sales personnel (5,800), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (3,600) and craft and related trades workers (2,700). The number of new job vacancies had decreased in the category of skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-500).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question. The figures also include registered jobseekers who are taking part in local government trial schemes for promoting employment.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
