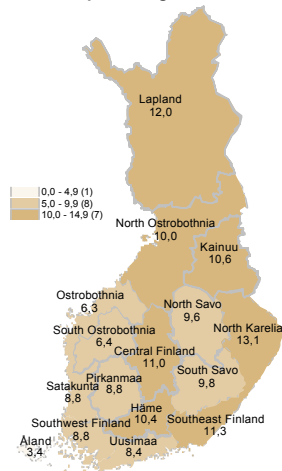

In May, 241,600 unemployed jobseekers

A total of 241,600 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of May. This is 49,900 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 13,000 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.2% of the labour force, which is 1.9 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

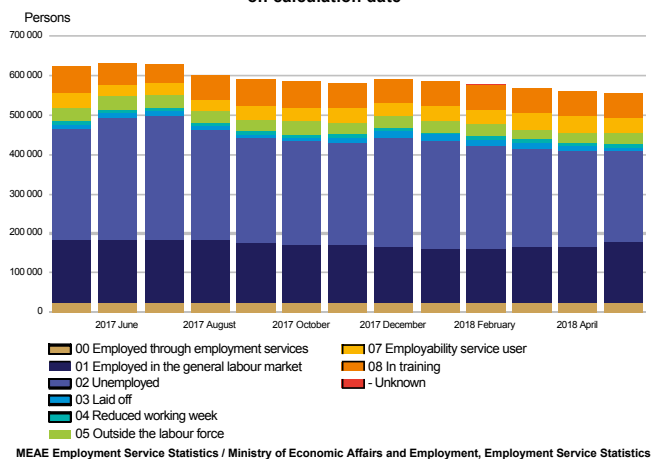

The total number of jobseekers decreased

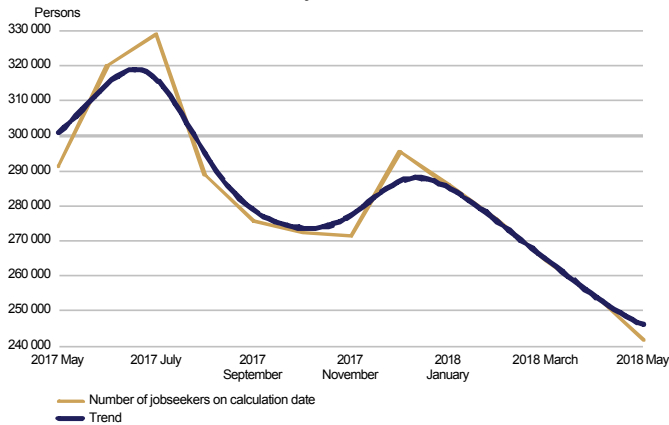
At the end of May, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 556,200, down 64,600 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 273,100 were men and 283,100 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 36,300 and the number of women by 28,300.

Of the jobseekers, 177,100 were employed, 151,700 of them were on the open labour market and 25,400 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 130,500, of whom 39,600 were in services promoting employment and 63,300 in training. Of the jobseekers, 241,600 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 49,900 less than the year before. In May, 8,200 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 3,800 less than in April. Since May last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 4,400. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 7,000, representing a decrease of 2,100 from the year before.

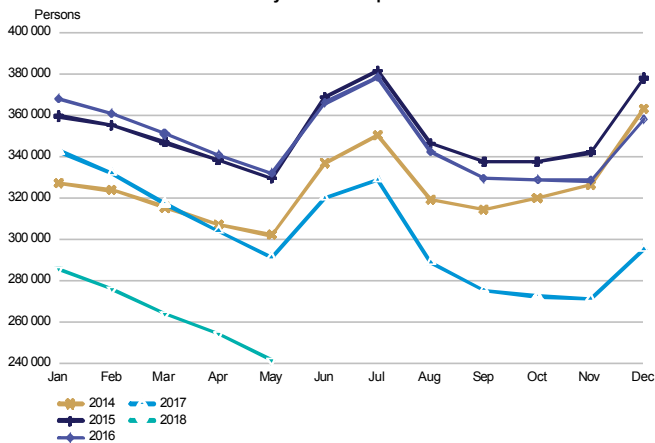
Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in May

At the end of May, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 241,600, down 49,900 on the previous year. Compared with April, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 13,000.

In May, 8,200 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 3,800 less than in April. Since May last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 4,400.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 25,300, down 4,000 from May a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 7,200 at the end of May, down 1,100 from the year before.

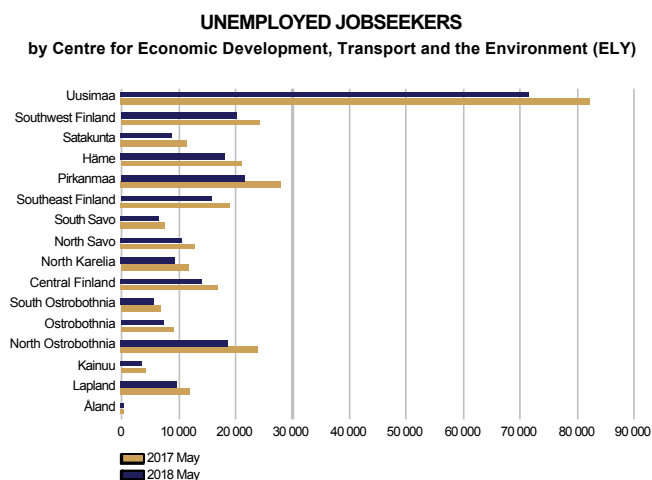
UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in May in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Pirkanmaa (-23%), Satakunta (-23%), North Ostrobothnia (-22%) and Ostrobothnia (-20%).

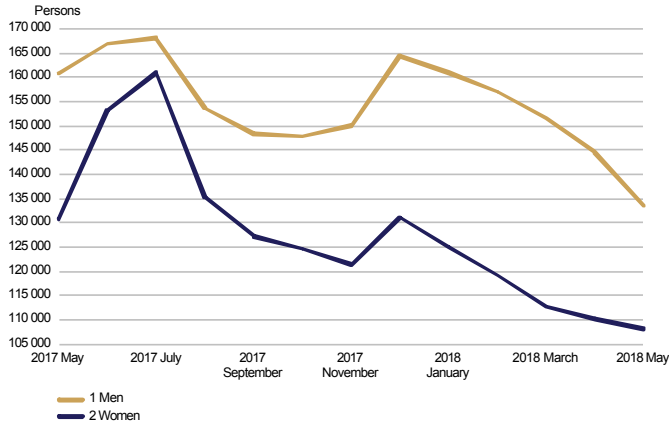

by gender**

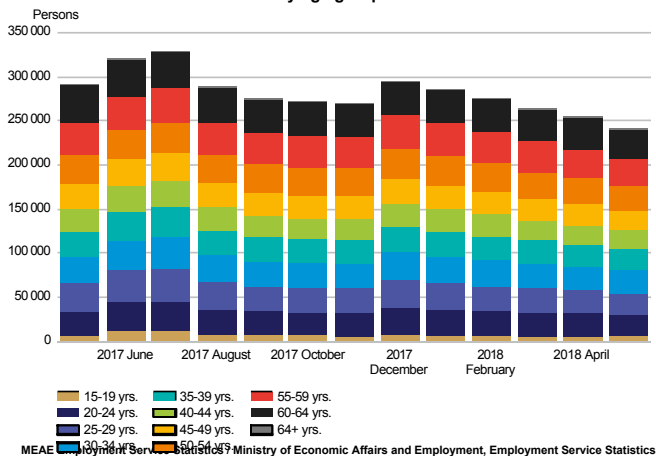

Unemployment decreased slightly more among women than men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 133,600 (55%) were men and 108,100 (45%) were women, indicating a decrease of 11,000 for men and 2,000 for women from the figures for April. Compared with May a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 27,200 (-17%) and among women by 22,700 (-17%).

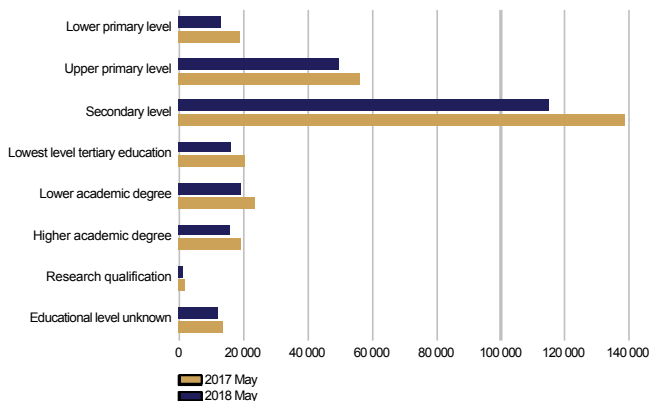
Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of May, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 29,600, representing a decrease of 5,500 from May a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from April by 1,800. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 5,600. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 92,900, representing a decrease of 20,000 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 65,600, representing a decrease of 14,500 on the year before.

by level of education

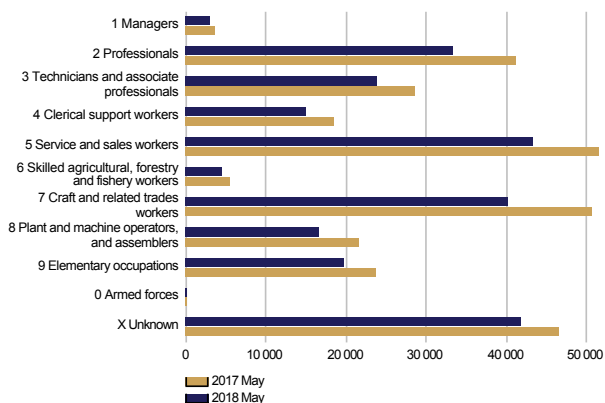

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from May last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-30%), lowest level of tertiary education (-21%), doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-19%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (-18%).

by occupational group

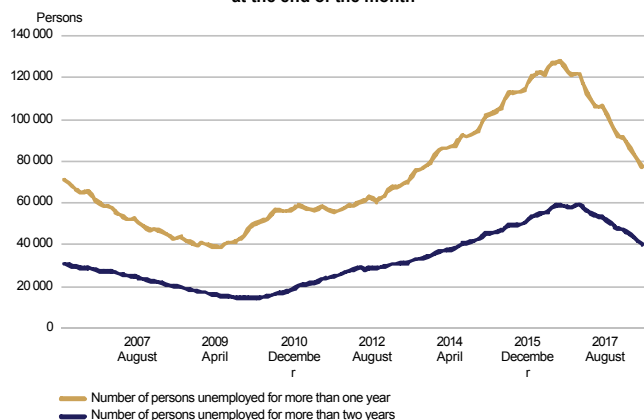

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from May last year; the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (-10,500), service and sales workers (-8,200) and professionals (-7,800).

Decrease in long-term unemployment

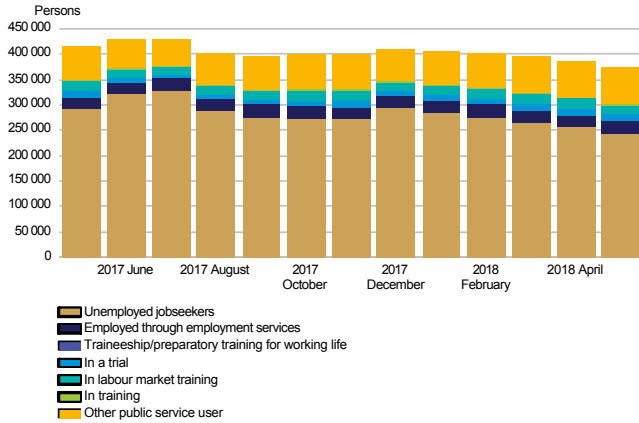
At the end of May, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 77,300, down 29,200 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 44,800 were men and 32,400 were women. The number of men decreased by 16,500 (-27%) from the previous year and the number of women by 12,700 (-28%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 40,200, which is 13,800 less than a year ago.

i.e. unemployed jobseekers and employment services users



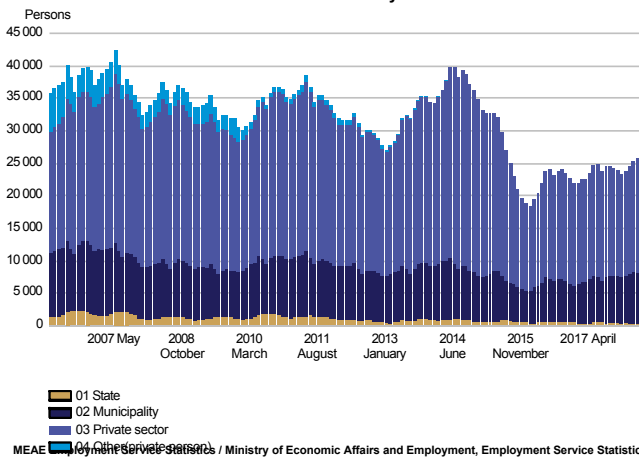
Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of May, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 130,600, up 6,300 on the previous year. Compared with April, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 1,500. The activation rate at the end of May was 35.1%, which is 5.2 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.6% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 63,400, up 2,700 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 67,200, up 3,600 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 372,200 at the end of May. This is 43,600 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.

EMPLOYED THROUGH EMPLOYMENT SERVICES at the end of the month by sector



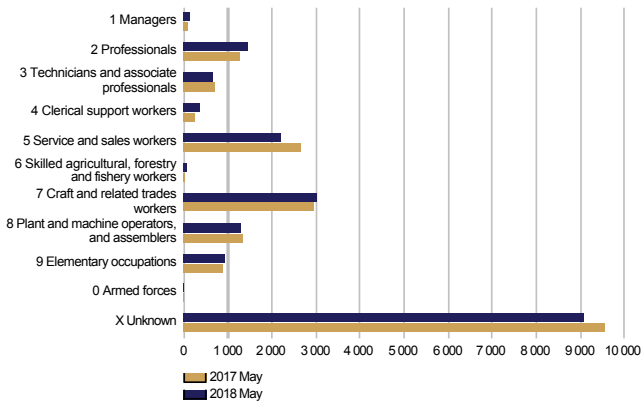
The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of May, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 26,800, which is 2,100 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 30% in local government jobs and 68% in the private sector. Since May last year, the number of placements has decreased by 1% in government jobs and increased by 14% in local government jobs and by 7% in the private sector. Of those employed, 51% were men. Placements for men increased by 800, and those for women by 1,300 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



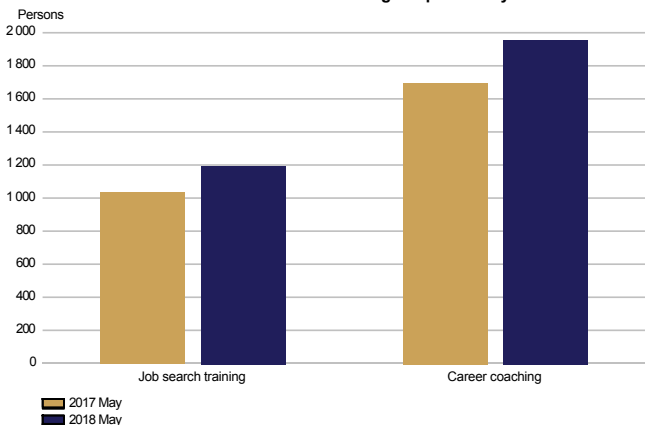

The number of persons in labour market training decreased

At the end of May, labour market training was attended by 19,100 students, down 600 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,200 were men and 9,000 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 400 and the number of women by 200. During May, 3,700 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 600 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,600), which is 1,000 less than the year before.

The number of persons in training increased

At the end of May, 3,100 persons were in training, which is 400 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,500 and of women 1,700. Career coaching had 2,000 participants, which is 300 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training increased by 200 from the previous year.

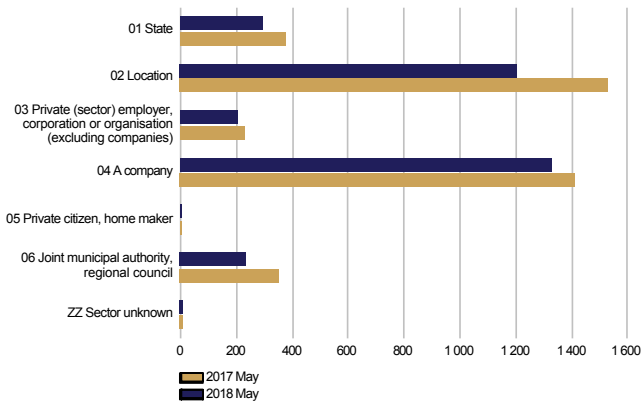
The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 39,700 people, representing an increase of 2,000 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 16,500, up 1,100 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 23,200, representing an increase of 900 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 9,600 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,400 on the previous year.

The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,300 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of May, which is 600 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,100 were men and 2,200 were women. The number of men decreased by 200, and the number of women by 500.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

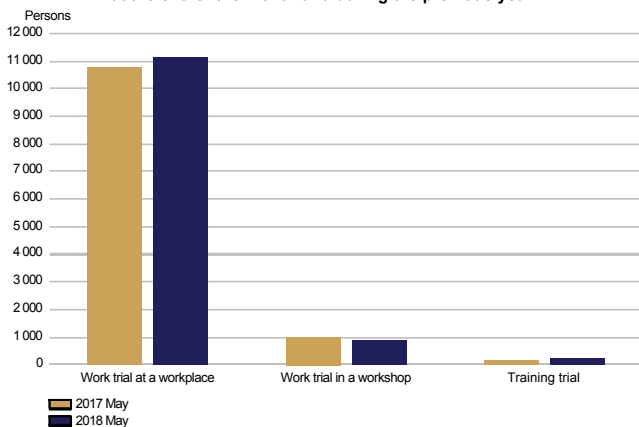

More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 26,300 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of May, which is 2,600 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 14,800 were men and 11,500 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 1,300 from the previous year.

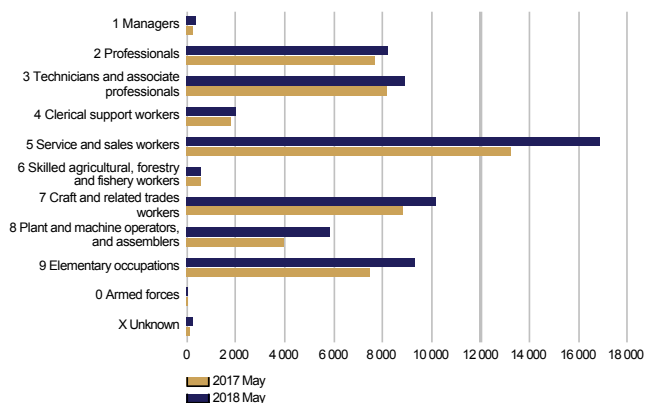
Participation in work and training trials increased

Work and training trials had a total of 12,200 participants at the end of May, which is 300 more than the previous year. Of the participants, 5,600 were men and 6,600 were women. The number of men remained the same and the number of women increased by 300 on the previous year.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during May totalled 62,500, which is 10,400 more than in May last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in May amounted to 118,600, which is 21,100 more than a year ago. A total of 10,800 of these vacancies were filled during May, 5,600 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 53,400 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,900 vacancies were cancelled and 1,400 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of May was 53,400, up 13,200 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for nine occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and sales workers (3,700), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,900), elementary occupations (1,800) and craft and related trades workers (1,400). The number of new job vacancies had decreased only in the category of skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-40).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question. The figures also include registered jobseekers who are taking part in local government trial schemes for promoting employment.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
