



In June, the number of unemployed jobseekers was 272,700







A total of 272,700 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of June. This was 47,400 fewer than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 31,100 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 10.4% of the labour force, which is 1.8 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- The total number of jobseekers decreased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 47,000 compared to the year before
- Services included in the activation rate had 6,000 more people than a year ago
- 6,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year

The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of June, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 567,200, down 63,000 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 275,000 were men and 292,100 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 34,800 and the number of women by 28,200.


Of the jobseekers, 174,300 were employed, 149,200 of them were on the open labour market and 25,100 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 113,600, of whom 35,300 were in services promoting employment and 51,300 in training. Of the jobseekers, 272,700 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 47,400 less than the year before. In June, 9,400 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,200 more than in May. Since June last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 3,200. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 6,500, representing a decrease of 2,200 from the year before.

Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in June

At the end of June, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 272,700, down 47,400 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 31,100. Typical of the summer period, the increase was brought about by the entry into the labour market of the young graduates from various education institutions and termination of certain fixed-term employment contracts for the summer months. The termination of fixed-term contracts in summer increased unemployment particularly among women. Women's unemployment increased from May by 23,200.


In June, 9,400 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,200 more than in May. Since June last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 3,200.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 30,500, down 4,400 from June a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 7,900 at the end of June, down 1,300 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres


Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in June in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Satakunta (-20%), Pirkanmaa (-20%), South Ostrobothnia (-19%) and North Ostrobothnia (-19%).

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UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 141,400 (52%) were men and 131,300 (48%) were women, indicating an increase of 7,900 for men and 23,200 for women compared to the figures in May. Compared with June a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 25,500 (-15%) and among women by 21,900 (-14%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of June, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 38,200 representing a decrease of 7,700 from June a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from May by 8,600. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 10,300. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 96,700, representing a decrease of 16,900 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 67,300, representing a decrease of 12,200 on the year before.

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Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from June last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-28%), lowest level of tertiary education (-17%), doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-16%) and upper secondary level of education (-15%).

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from June last year; the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (-9,600), service and sales workers (-7,800) and professionals (-7,000).


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Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of June, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 77,100, down 28,800 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 44,500 were men and 32,600 were women. The number of men decreased by 15,600 (-26%) from the previous year and the number of women by 13,200 (-29%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 39,800, which is 13,400 less than a year ago.



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Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of June, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 114,000, up 5,600 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 16,700. The activation rate at the end of June was 29.5%, which is 4.2 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.0% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 56,900, up 2,500 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was slightly higher than that of men at 57,100, up 3,100 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 386,700 at the end of June. This is 41,800 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of June, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 26,600, which is 1,900 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 29% in local government jobs and 69% in the private sector. Since June last year, the number of placements has decreased by 3% in government jobs and increased by 12% in local government jobs and by 7% in the private sector. Of those employed, 53% were men. Placements for men increased by 800, and those for women by 1,100 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



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
Slight increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of June, labour market training was attended by 16,100 students, up 300 on the previous year. Of the students, 8,600 were men and 7,500 were women. Compared with last year, the number of men remained the same, and the number of women increased by 200. During June, 1,900 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 500 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,600), which is 400 less than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




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The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of June, 2,100 persons were in training, which is 200 less than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,000 and of women 1,100. Work and training trials had 1,100 participants, which is almost as many as a year ago at the same time. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 100 from the previous year.

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The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 31,500 people, representing an increase of 1,200 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 13,000, up 700 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 18,500, representing an increase of 500 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 7,100 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 2,500 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector




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The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,500 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of June, which is 600 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,200 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of men decreased by 100, and the number of women by 400.

More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 23,700 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of June, which is 2,700 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,700 were men and 9,900 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 1,400 from the previous year.


Participation in work and training trials increased

Work and training trials had a total of 10,500 participants at the end of June, which is 200 more than the previous year. Of the participants, 5,300 were men and 5,300 were women. The number of men decreased by 200 from the previous year and the number of women increased by 300.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during June totalled 50,100, which is 6,000 more than in June the previous year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 102,900 in June, which is 17,800 more than a year ago. A total of 8,000 of these vacancies were filled during June, 4,700 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 49,100 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,300 vacancies were cancelled and 1,500 vacancies could not be fulfilled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of June was 46,100, up 9,600 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for nine occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,700), elementary occupations (1,200), technicians and associate professionals (900), service and sales personnel (900), and craft and related trades workers (800). The number of new vacancies remained the same for the groups of managers and armed forces.

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question. The figures also include registered jobseekers who are taking part in local government trial schemes for promoting employment.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
