

In July, 284,100 unemployed jobseekers





A total of 284,100 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of July. This is 45,000 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 11,300 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 10.8% of the labour force, which is 1.7 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- The total number of jobseekers decreased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 45,000 compared to the year before
- Services included in the activation rate had 6,000 more people than a year ago
- 9,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year

The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of July, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 567,700, down 59,900 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 273,900 were men and 293,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 32,500 and the number of women by 27,500.


Of the jobseekers, 170,600 were employed, 146,500 of them were on the open labour market and 24,100 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 106,800, of whom 31,700 were in services promoting employment and 48,200 in training. Of the jobseekers, 284,100 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 45,000 less than the year before. In July, 11,100 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,700 more than in June. Since July last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 2,800. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 6,200, representing a decrease of 2,200 from the year before.

Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in July

At the end of July, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 284,100, down 45,000 on the previous year. Compared with June, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 11,300.

In July, 11,100 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,700 more than in June. Since July last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 2,800.


The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 32,700, down 4,600 from July a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 8,200 at the end of July, down 1,300 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres



Unemployment decreased more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 144,500 (51%) were men and 139,500 (49%) were women, indicating an increase of 3,100 for men and 8,200 for women from the figures for June. Compared with July a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 23,500 (-14%) and among women by 21,400 (-13%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of July, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 39,200, representing a decrease of 6,500 from July a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from June by 1,000. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 9,800. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 99,000, representing a decrease of 16,700 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 68,600, representing a decrease of 11,700 on the year before.

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from July last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-27%), doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-15%), lowest level of tertiary education (-15%) and upper secondary level of education (-14%).

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from July last year; the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (-9,000), service and sales workers (-7,200) and professionals (-6,800).



Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of July, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 77,000, down 29,200 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 44,400 were men and 32,600 were women. The number of men decreased by 15,600 (-26%) from the previous year and the number of women by 13,500 (-29%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 39,600, which is 13,600 less than a year ago.



Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of July, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 105,900, up 6,100 on the previous year. Compared with June, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 8,100. The activation rate at the end of July was 27.2%, which is 3.9 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 3.8% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 53,200, up 3,000 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 52,600, up 3,100 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 389,900 at the end of July. This is 38,900 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of July, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 25,300, which is 1,600 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 28% in local government jobs and 70% in the private sector. Since July last year, the number of placements has decreased by 3% in government jobs and increased by 9% in local government jobs and by 6% in the private sector. Of those employed, 53% were men. Placements for men increased by 600, and those for women by 900 from the previous year.


Slight increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of July, labour market training was attended by 14,600 students, up 400 on the previous year. Of the students, 7,700 were men and 6,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 100 and the number of women by 300. During July, 900 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 100 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,100), which is 300 less than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




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The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of July, 1,400 persons were in training, which is 200 less than the year before. Of those in training, the number of men and women was 700 respectively. Career coaching had 800 participants, which is almost the same as last year. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 200 from the previous year.

The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 30,800 people, representing an increase of 1,200 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 12,700, up 700 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 18,100, representing an increase of 500 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 7,000 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,300 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector





The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,400 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of July, which is 500 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,200 were men and 2,200 were women. The number of men decreased by 100, and the number of women by 400.

at the end of the month and during the previous year





A total of 22,100 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of July, which is 3,400 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,000 were men and 9,100 were women. The number of men increased by 1,800 and the number of women by 1,600 from the previous year.

Work and training trials had a total of 8,300 participants at the end of July, which is 100 more than the year before. Of the participants 4,500 were men and 3,800 were women. The number of men decreased by 100 from the previous year and the number of women increased by 100.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during July totalled 48,100, which is 8,900 more than in July last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in July amounted to 91,600, which is 16,400 more than a year ago. A total of 6,800 of these vacancies were filled during July, 3,800 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 37,800 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,800 vacancies were cancelled and 1,800 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of July was 45,400, up 7,100 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for ten occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of craft and related trades workers (2,200), service and sales workers (1,900), elementary occupations (1,500) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,400). The number of new job vacancies had decreased only in the category of 'unknown'.

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question. The figures also include registered jobseekers who are taking part in local government trial schemes for promoting employment.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
