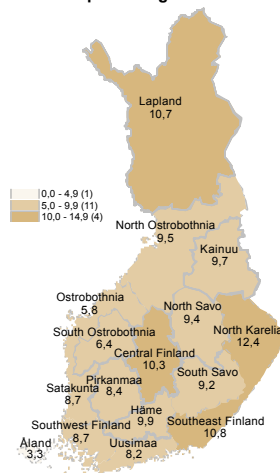

In September 232,100 unemployed jobseekers

A total of 232,100 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of September. This is 43,500 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 11,200 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 8.8% of the labour force, which is 1.7 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

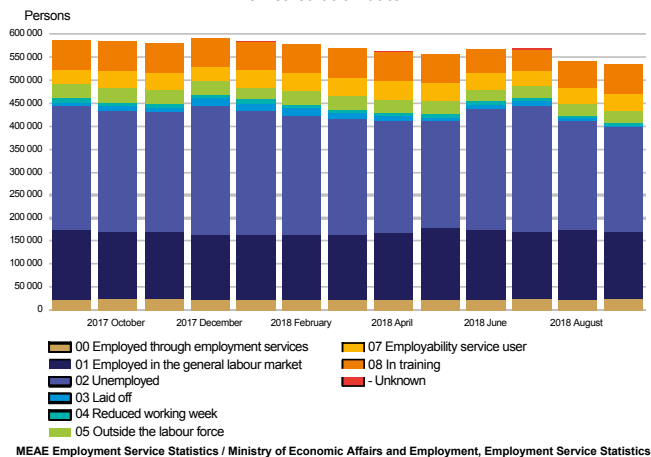

The total number of jobseekers decreased

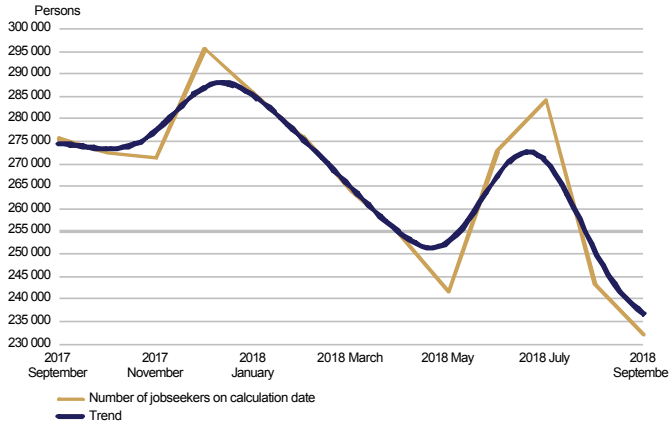
At the end of September, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 534,500, down 53,300 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 261,600 were men and 272,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 28,200 and the number of women by 25,100.

Of the jobseekers, 170,200 were employed, 145,700 of them were on the open labour market and 24,500 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 126,300, of whom 36,300 were in services promoting employment and 64,000 in training. Of the jobseekers, 232,100 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 43,500 less than the year before. In September, 6,700 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 100 less than in August. Since September last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 2,400. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 5,900, representing a decrease of 2,500 from the year before.

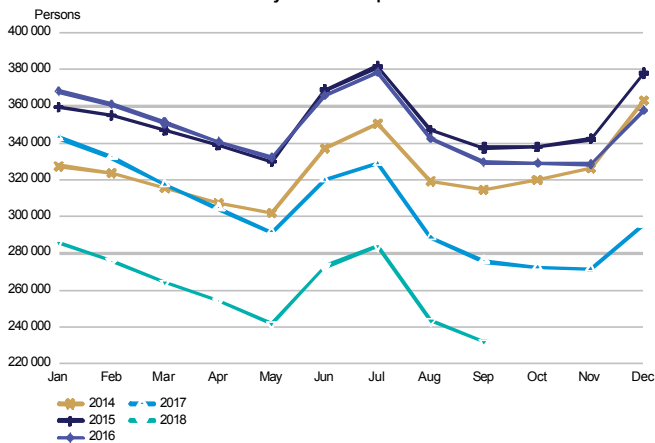
Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in September

At the end of September, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 232,100, down 43,500 on the previous year. Compared with August, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 11,200.

In September, 6,700 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 100 less than in August. Since September last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 2,400.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 24,000, down 3,700 from September a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 6,900 at the end of September, down 1,100 from the year before.

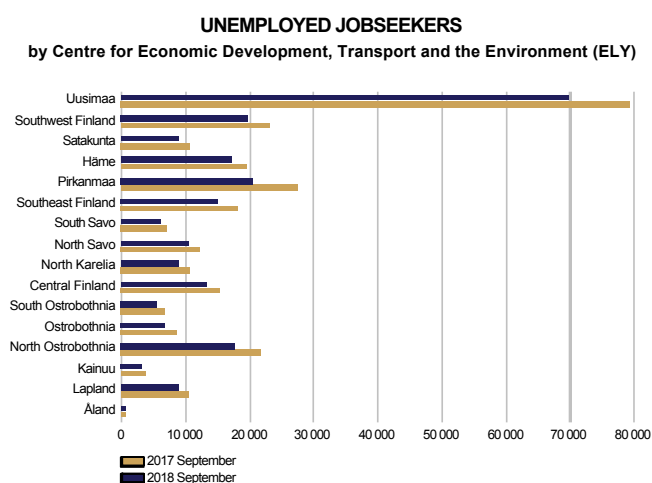
UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in September in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Pirkanmaa (-25%), Ostrobothnia (-23%), South Ostrobothnia (-20%), North Ostrobothnia (-18%) and Satakunta (-18%).

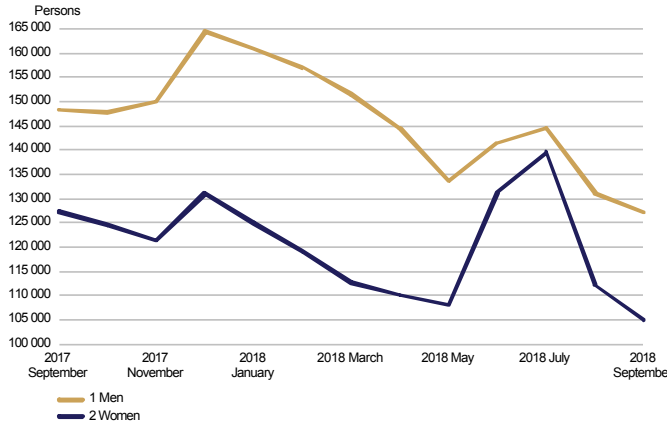

by gender**

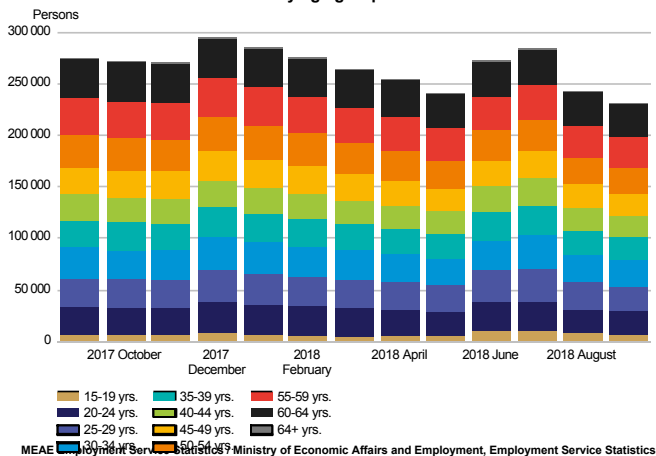

Unemployment decreased more among women than men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 127,100 (55%) were men and 104,900 (45%) were women, indicating a decrease of 3,900 for men and 7,300 for women from the figures for August. Compared with September a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 21,200 (-14%) and among women by 22,300 (-18%).

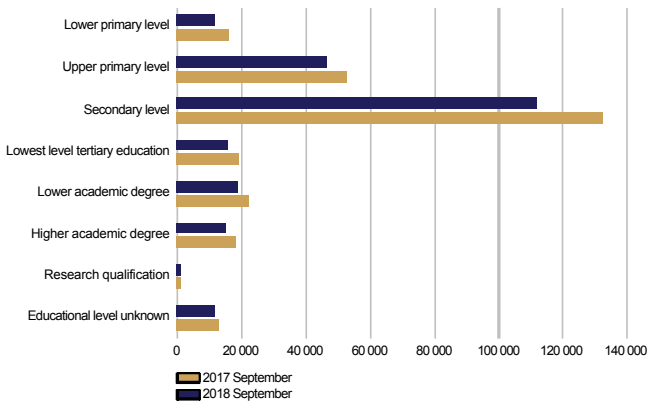
Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of September, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 29,100, representing a decrease of 4,300 from September a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from August by 2,400. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 6,700. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 88,500, representing a decrease of 17,900 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 62,500, representing a decrease of 12,600 on the year before.

by level of education

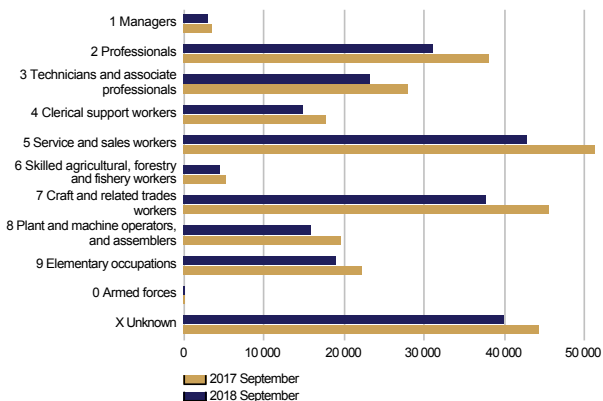

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from September last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-29%), doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-21%), lowest level of tertiary education (-18%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (-16%).

by occupational group

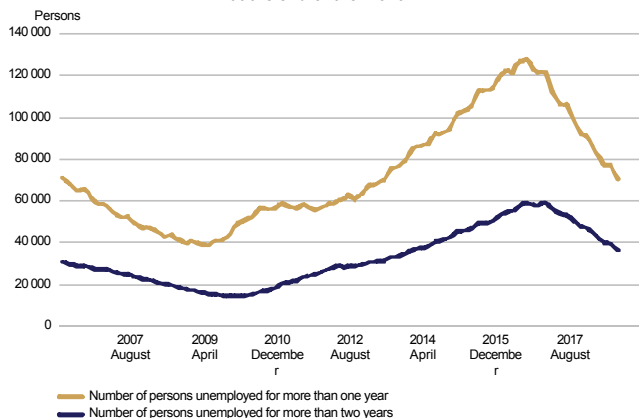

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from September last year; the most in the groups of service and sales workers (-8,300), craft and related trades workers (-7,800), professionals (-7,000), technicians and associate professionals (-4,800) and 'unknown' (-4,500).

Decrease in long-term unemployment

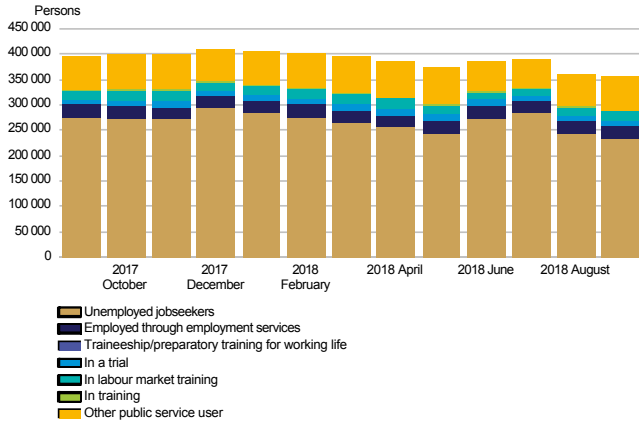
At the end of September, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 70,300, down 27,900 from the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 41,200 were men and 29,100 were women. The number of men decreased by 14,700 (-26%) from the previous year and the number of women by 13,200 (-31%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 36,400, which is 13,900 less than a year ago.

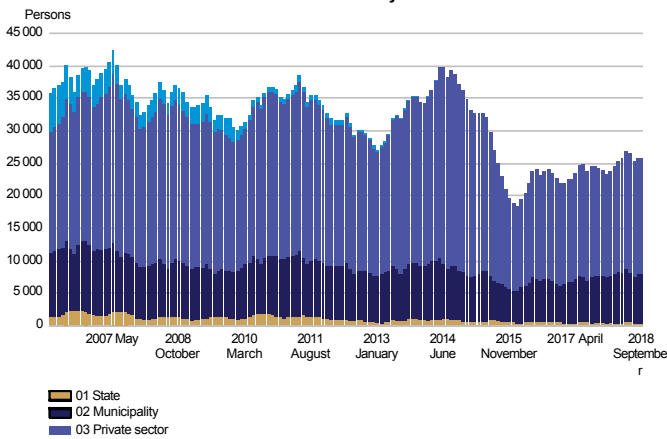
Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of September, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 126,600, up 5,100 on the previous year. Compared with August, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 8,100. The activation rate at the end of September was 35.3%, which is 4.7 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.7% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 60,600, up 2,200 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 66,000, up 2,900 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 358,700 at the end of September. This is 38,400 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.

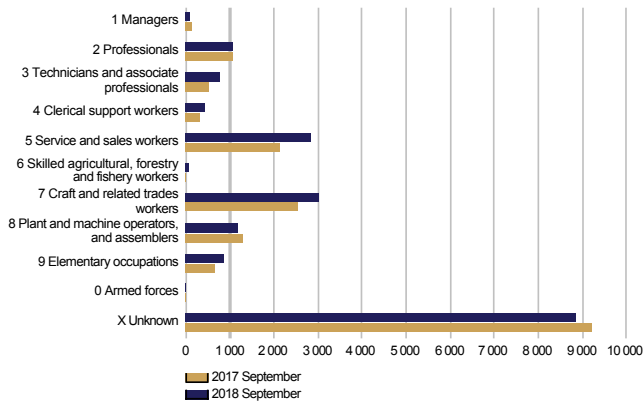
The number of placements increased in all sectors

At the end of September, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 25,700, which is 1,200 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 29% in local government jobs and 69% in the private sector. Since September last year, the number of placements has increased by 1% in government jobs, 4% in local government jobs and 6% in the private sector. Of those employed, 51% were men. Placements for men increased by 400, and those for women by 700 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



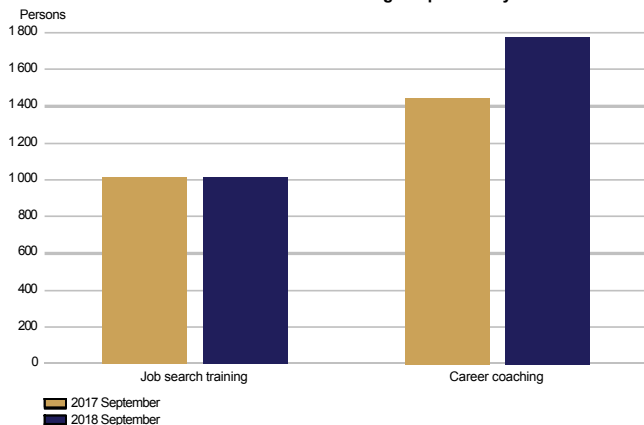

Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of September, labour market training was attended by 19,200 students, up 1,300 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,500 were men and 9,700 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 200 and the number of women by 1,100. During September, 5,800 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 100 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,000), which is 1,400 less than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

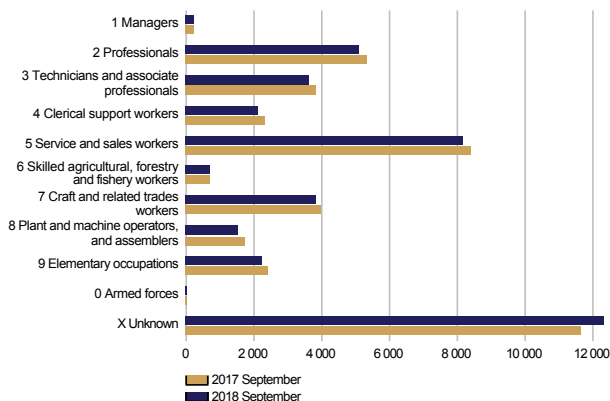

The number of persons in training increased

At the end of September, 2,800 persons were in training, which is 300 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,300 and of women 1,500. Career coaching had 1,800 participants, which is 300 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training was the same as the previous year.

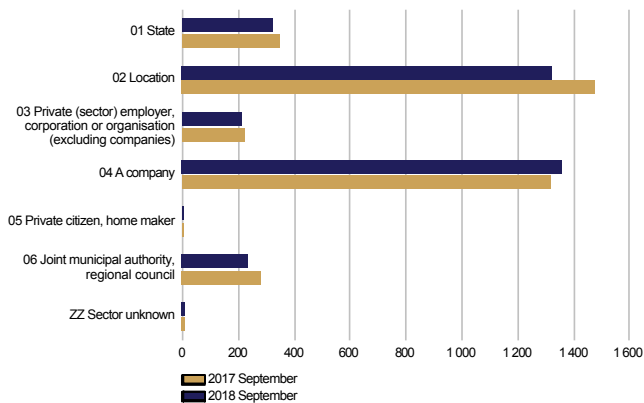
The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 40,000 people, representing a decrease of 700 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 16,600, down 200 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 23,400, representing a decrease of 500 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 10,300 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 800 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector

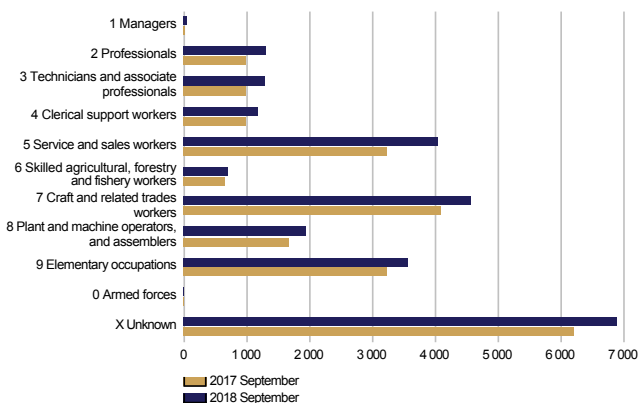

The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,500 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of September, which is 200 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,200 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of men remained almost the same, and the number of women decreased by 200.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

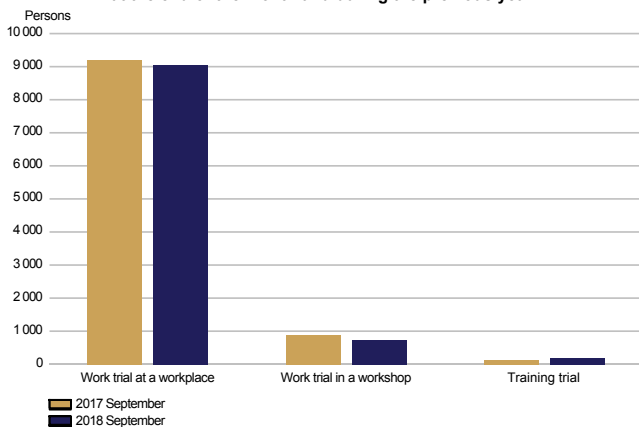

More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 25,500 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of September, which is 3,400 more than a year earlier. Of the participants, 14,300 were men and 11,200 were women. The number of men increased by 1,800 and the number of women by 1,600 from the previous year.

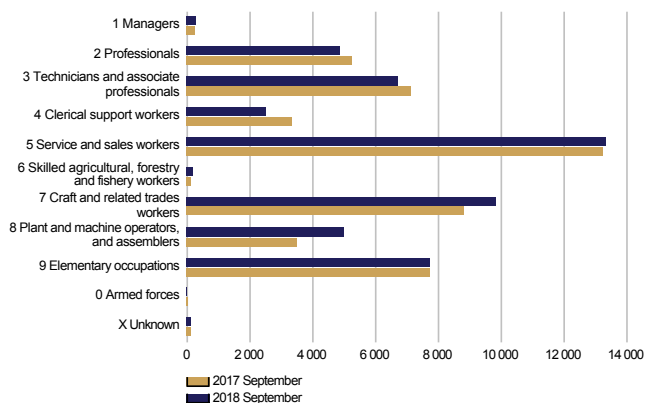
Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 10,000 participants at the end of September, which is 200 less than the year before. Of the participants, 4,600 were men and 5,400 were women. The number of men remained the same and the number of women decreased by 200 from the previous year.

Slight increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during September totalled 50,500, which is 1,000 more than in September last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 100,600 in September, which is 9,600 more than a year ago. A total of 7,400 of these vacancies were filled during September, 3,900 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 44,400 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 2,000 vacancies were cancelled and 1,400 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of September was 49,300, up 6,700 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for five occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,400), craft and related trades workers (1,000) and service and sales workers (100). The number of new job vacancies had decreased the most in the categories of clerical support workers (-900), technicians and associate professionals (-400) and professionals (-400).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question. The figures also include registered jobseekers who are taking part in local government trial schemes for promoting employment.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
