In June, 254,200 unemployed jobseekers






A total of 254,200 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of June. This is 18,600 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 27,600 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.7% of the labour force, which is 0.7 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- The total number of jobseekers decreased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 19,000 compared to the year before
- Services included in the activation rate had 4,000 less people than a year ago
- 3,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year

The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of June, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 534,500, down 32,700 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 260,200 were men and 274,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 14,800 and the number of women by 17,900.


Of the jobseekers, 168,500 were employed, 146,100 of them were on the open labour market and 22,400 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 106,500, of whom 31,600 were in services promoting employment and 50,500 in training. Of the jobseekers, 254,200 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 18,600 less than the year before. In June, 9,500 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,100 more than in May. Since June last year, the number of people fully laid off has increased by 100. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 5,300, representing a decrease of 1,300 from the year before.

Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in June

At the end of June, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 254,200, down 18,600 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 27,600. Typical of the summer period, the increase was brought about by the entry into the labour market of the young graduates from various education institutions and termination of certain fixed-term employment contracts for the summer months. The termination of fixed-term contracts in summer increased unemployment particularly among women. Women's unemployment increased from May by 21,000.


In June, 9,500 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,100 more than in May. Since June last year, the number of people fully laid off has increased by 100.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 29,500, down 1,000 from June a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 7,400 at the end of June, down 500 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres


Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in June in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Häme (-11%), North Karelia (-11%), South Savo (-10%), Southeast Finland (-10%), Lapland (-9%), Kainuu (-9%) and Southwest Finland (-9%).

Unemployment decreased more among women than men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 134,100 (53%) were men and 120,100 (47%) were women, indicating an increase of 6,700 for men and 21,000 for women from the figures for May. Compared with June a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 7,300 (-5%) and among women by 11,200 (-9%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of June, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 35,200, representing a decrease of 2,900 from June a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from May by 6,600. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 9,300. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 89,500, representing a decrease of 7,200 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 62,200, representing a decrease of 5,100 on the year before.

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from June last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-20%), lowest level of tertiary education (-10%), higher level basic qualifications (-6%), upper secondary level of education (-6%) and lower-degree level tertiary education (-6%).



Unemployment decreased in ten occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in ten groups from June last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-5,500), professionals (-4,200), craft and related trades workers (-3,500), technicians and associate professionals (-2,800) and elementary occupations (-2,100). Unemployment increased only in the group 'unknown' (3,100).





Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of June, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 63,800, down 13,300 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 37,600 were men and 26,200 were women. The number of men decreased by 6,900 (-16%) from the previous year and the number of women by 6,400 (-20%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 30,700, which is 9,200 less than a year ago.



Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of June, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 110,100, down 3,900 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 13,700. The activation rate at the end of June was 30.2%, which is 0.7 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 3.9% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by these services, the number of men was 54,900, down 2,000 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 55,100, down 1,900 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 364,200 at the end of June. This is 22,400 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


The number of placements decreased in all sectors

At the end of June, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 24,900, which is 1,700 less than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 28% in local government jobs and 70% in the private sector. Since June last year, the number of placements has decreased by 1% in government jobs, by 10% in local government jobs and by 5% in the private sector. Of those employed, 53% were men. Placements for men decreased by 800, and those for women by 900 from the previous year.


Slight increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of June, labour market training was attended by 16,300 students, up 200 on the previous year. Of the students, 8,300 were men and 8,100 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 300 and the number of women increased by 600. During June, 1,500 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 300 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' consisted of 5,600 people in integration training, which is 900 less than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year





The number of persons in training increased

At the end of June, 2,900 persons were in training, which is 800 more than the year before. Of those in training, 1,500 were men and 1,400 women. Career coaching was provided to 1,700 participants, which is 500 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training increased by 300 from the previous year.


The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 30,400 people, representing a decrease of 1,100 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 12,700, down 300 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 17,700, representing a decrease of 800 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 7,500 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 400 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector





The number of job alternation substitutes increased slightly

A total of 3,600 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of June, which is 100 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,300 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of men increased by 100, and the number of women remained the same compared to the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year





Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 23,400 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of June, which is 200 less than a year earlier. Of the participants, 13,600 were men and 9,900 were women. The number of men decreased by 200 and the number of women by 100 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year





Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 8,500 participants at the end of June, which is 2,000 less than the year before. Of the participants, 4,400 were men and 4,100 were women. The number of men decreased by 900 and the number of women by 1,100 from the previous year.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during June totalled 52,600, which is 2,500 more than in June last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in June amounted to 110,000, which is 7,200 more than a year ago. A total of 9,800 of these vacancies were filled during June, 4,400 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 51,000 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,500 vacancies were cancelled and 1,100 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of June was 50,200, up 4,100 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for eight occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of craft and related trades workers (1,700), elementary occupations (1,000), service and sales workers (600) and clerical support workers (200). The number of new job vacancies had decreased the most in the category of technicians and associate professionals (-1,000).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
