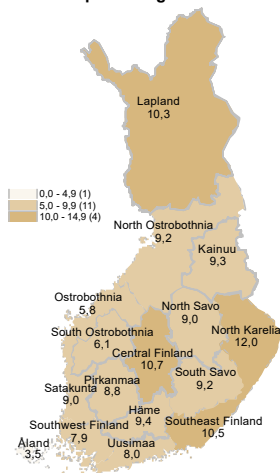

# In September 226,000 unemployed jobseekers

A total of 226,000 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of September. This is 6,000 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers was down by 6,600 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 8.6% of the labour force; down by 0.2 percentage points from the previous year. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

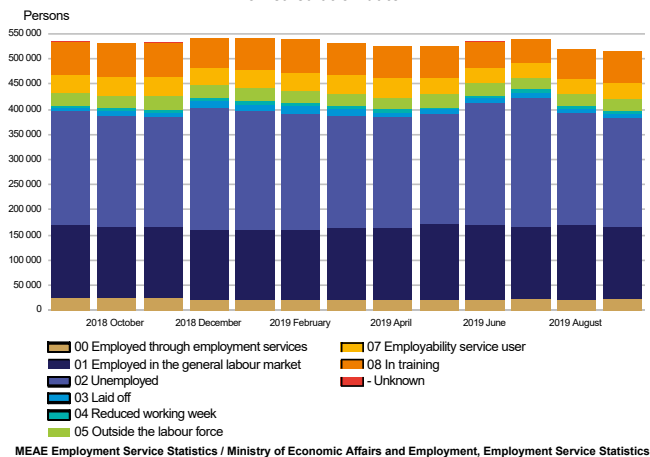

### The total number of jobseekers decreased

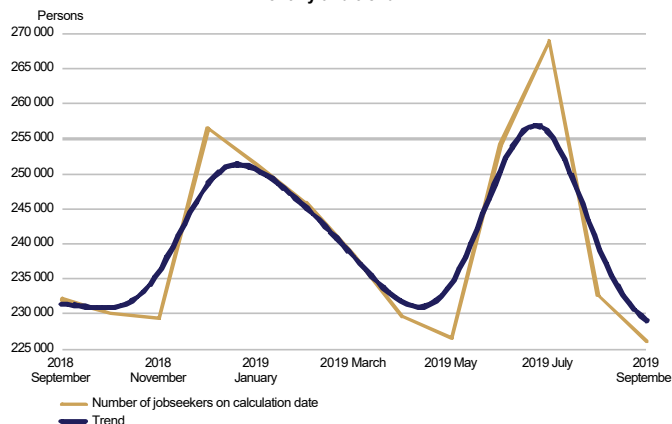
At the end of September, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 515,500, down 19,000 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 255,000 were men and 260,500 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 6,600 and the number of women by 12,400.

Of the jobseekers, 166,100 were employed, 144,400 of them were on the open labour market and 21,700 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 118,100, of whom 32,100 were in services promoting employment and 62,200 in training. Of the jobseekers, 226,000 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 6,000 less than the year before. In September, 8,300 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,000 more than in August. Compared with September a year ago, the number of people fully laid off increased by 1,700. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 5,300, representing a decrease of 600 from the year before.

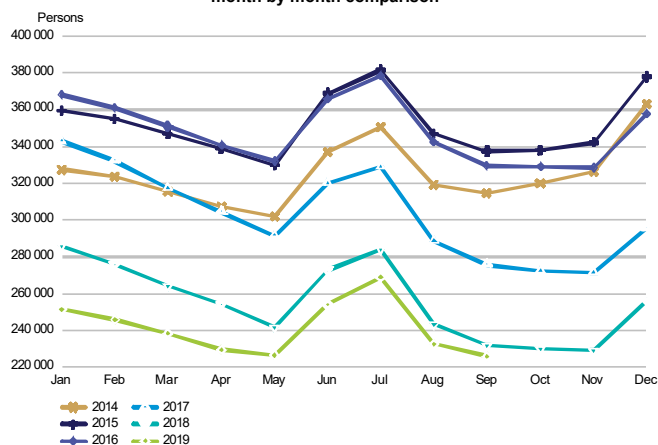
### Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in September

At the end of September, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 226,000, down 6,000 on the previous year. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 6,600 from August.

In September, 8,300 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,000 more than in August. The number of people fully laid off increased by 1,700 from September a year earlier.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 23,600, down 500 from September a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 6,700 at the end of September, down 200 from the year before.

month by month comparison

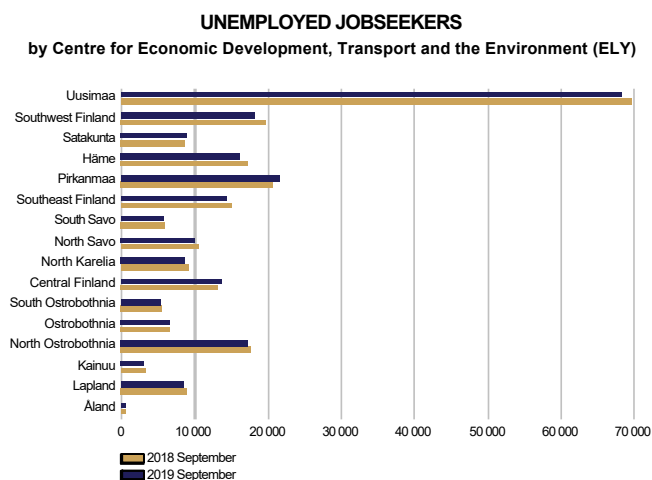

### Unemployment decreased in the areas of twelve ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in September in the areas of 12 Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Southwest Finland (-9%), Häme (-7%), Kainuu (-6%) and South Ostrobothnia (-6%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased in Pirkanmaa (4%), Central Finland (3%) and Satakunta (2%).

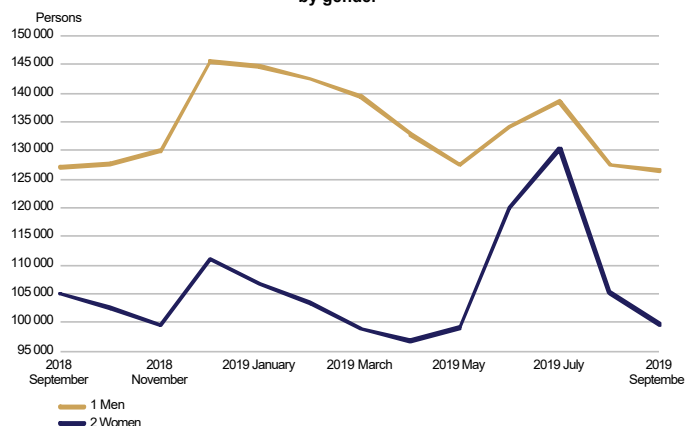

by gender

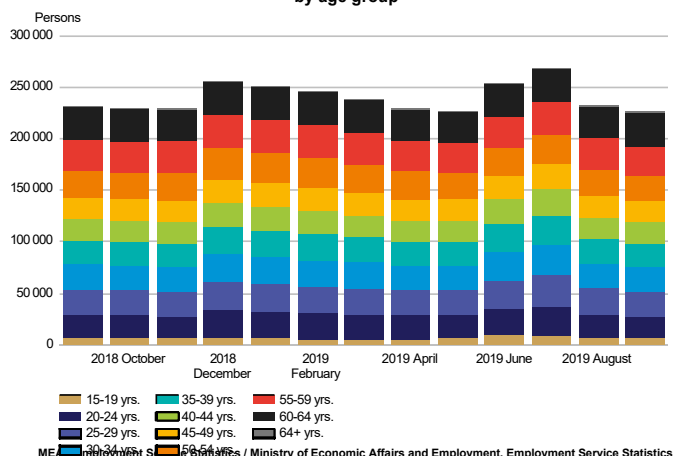

### Unemployment decreased more among women than men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 126,400 (56%) were men and 99,600 (44%) were women, indicating a decrease of 1,100 for men and 5,500 for women from the figures for August. Compared with September a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 700 (-1%) and among women by 5,300 (-5%).

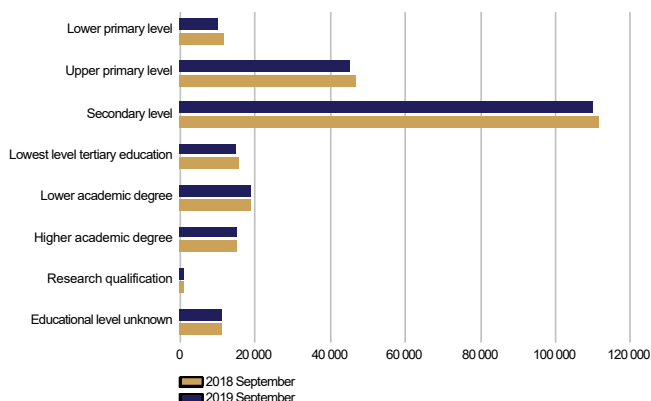
### Unemployment decreased in all age groups with the exception of 35-39-year-olds

At the end of September, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 27,900, representing a decrease of 1,200 from September a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased by 1,700 from August. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 6,600. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 86,200, representing a decrease of 2,300 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 61,000, representing a decrease of 1,500 on the year before.

by level of education**

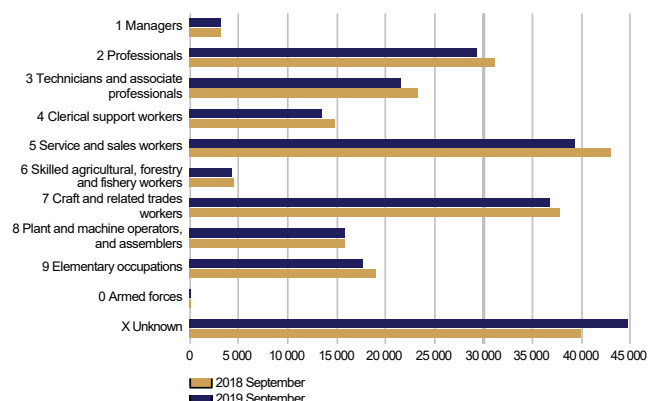

### Unemployment increased among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from September last year at almost all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-15%), lowest level of tertiary education (-6%), higher level basic qualifications (-4%) and upper secondary level of education (-2%). Unemployment grew among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (8%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (1%).

by occupational group**

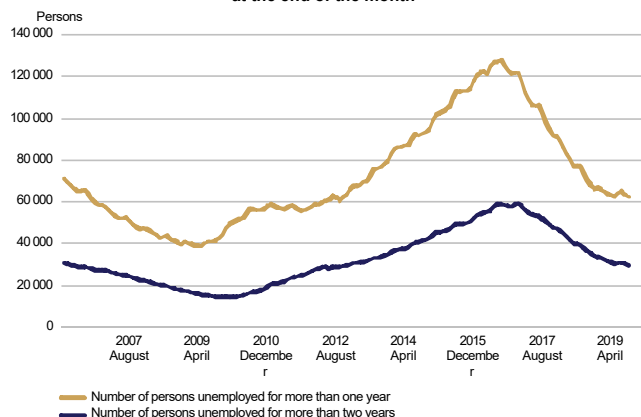

### Unemployment decreased in eight occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in eight groups from September last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-3,700), professionals (-1,800), technicians and associate professionals (-1,700) and clerical support workers (-1,300). Unemployment increased the most in the group 'unknown' (4,800).

at the end of the month**



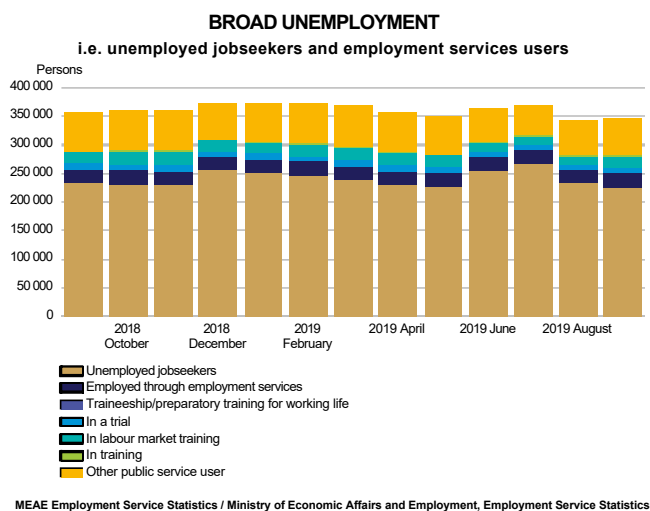

### Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of September, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 62,600, down 7,800 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 37,200 were men and 25,300 were women. The number of men decreased by 4,000 (-10%) from the previous year and the number of women by 3,800 (-13%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 29,700, which is 6,700 less than a year ago.



## Services

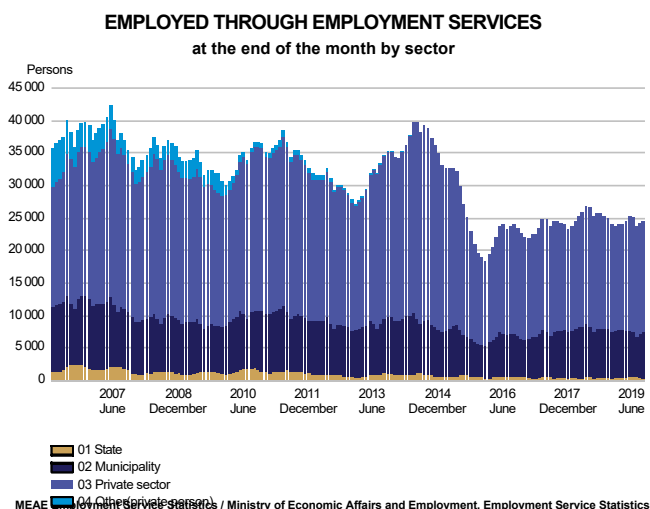


### Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of September, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 120,300, down 6,300 on the previous year. Compared with August, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 8,100. The activation rate at the end of September was 34.7%, which is 0.6 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.4% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 58,000, down 2,700 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 62,400, down 3,600 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 346,400 at the end of September. This is 12,300 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services.



### The number of placements fell in local government and the private sector

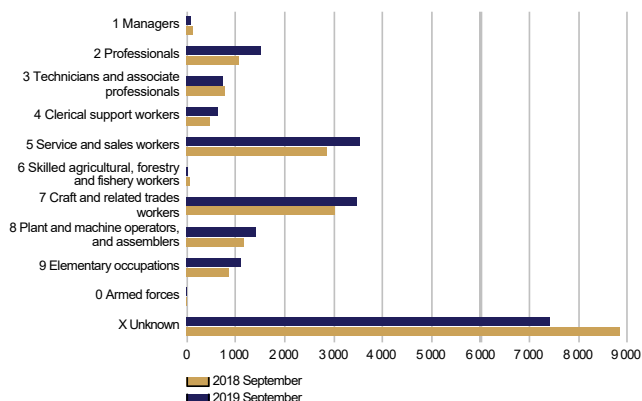
At the end of September, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 24,400, which is 1,300 less than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 29% in local government jobs and 69% in the private sector. Since September last year, the number of placements has decreased by 8% in local government jobs and by 4% in the private sector and remained almost the same in government jobs. Of those employed, 52% were men. Placements for men decreased by 500, and those for women by 900 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



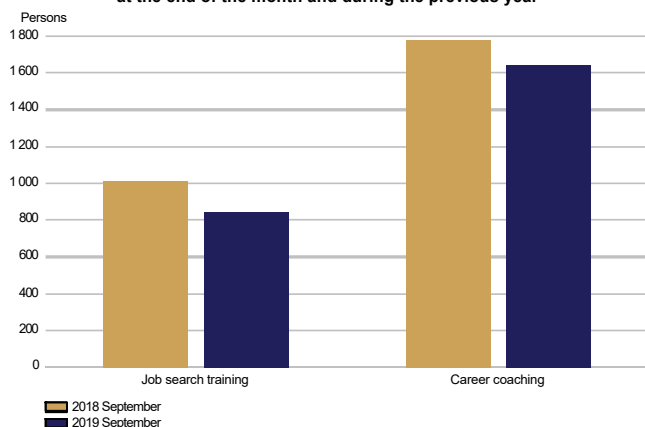

### Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of September, labour market training was attended by 19,900 students, up 700 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,700 were men and 10,200 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 200 and the number of women by 500. During September, 6,900 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 1,100 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,600), which is 500 less than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

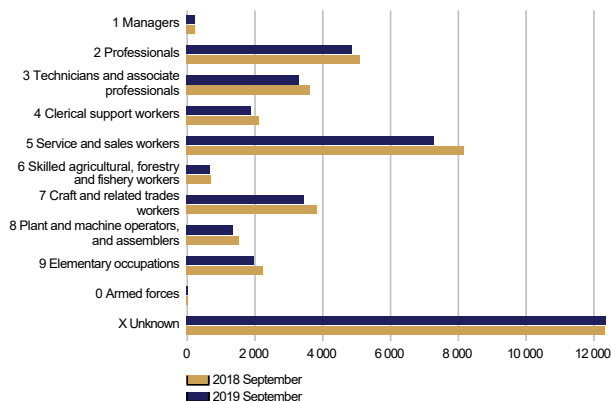

### The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of September, 2,500 persons were in training, which is 300 less than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,300 and of women 1,200. Career coaching was provided to 1,600 participants, which is 100 less than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 200 from the previous year.

### The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 37,400 people, representing a decrease of 2,600 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 15,500, down 1,100 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 21,900, representing a decrease of 1,500 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 10,600 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 300 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector

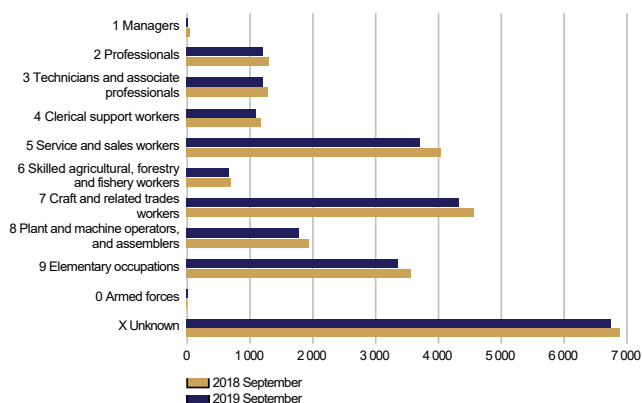

### The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,600 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of September, which is 100 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,300 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of men increased by 100, and the number of women remained the same compared to the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

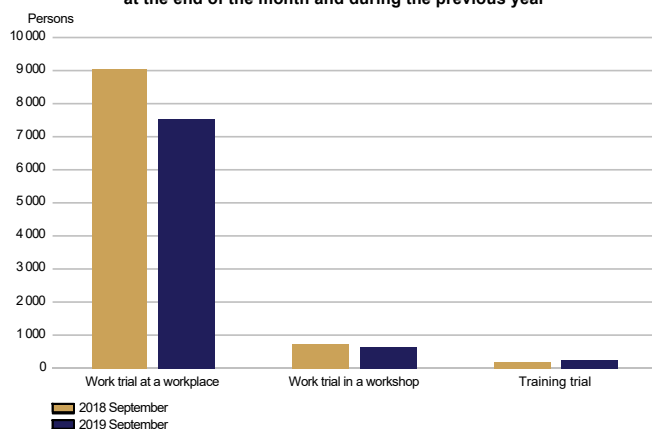

### Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 24,100 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of September, which is 1,300 less than a year earlier. Of the participants, 13,600 were men and 10,600 were women. The number of men decreased by 700 and the number of women by 600 from the previous year.

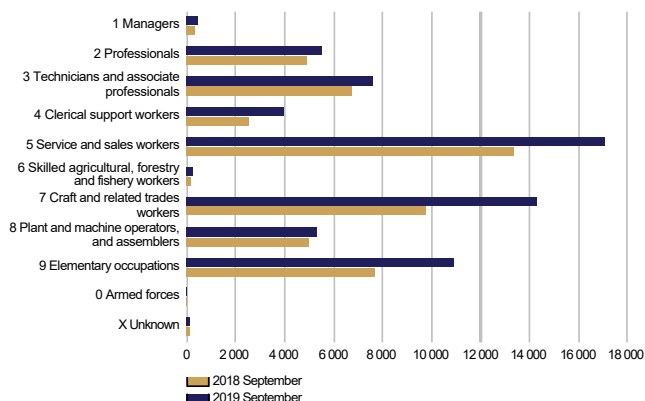
### Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 8,400 participants at the end of September, which is 1,500 less than the year before. Of the participants, 4,000 were men and 4,500 were women. The number of men decreased by 700 and the number of women by 900 from the previous year.

### Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during September totalled 65,400, which is 14,900 more than in September last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 121,500 in September, which is 21,000 more than a year ago. A total of 11,100 of these vacancies were filled during September, 4,500 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 52,400 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number applicants. In addition, a total of 1,700 vacancies were cancelled and 1,300 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of September was 58,700, up 9,500 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for ten occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of craft and related trades workers (4,500), service and sales workers (3,800), elementary occupations (3,300), clerical support workers (1,400) and technicians and associate professionals (900). The number of new job vacancies decreased only in the group 'unknown' (-100).

## Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month.
