



# In October 224,700 unemployed jobseekers







A total of 224,700 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of October. This is 5,400 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 1,300 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 8.6% of the labour force, which is 0.1 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

### **Trends:**

- The total number of jobseekers decreased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 5,000 from the previous year
- Services included in the activation rate had 7,000 less people than a year ago
- 8,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year

### The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of October, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 515,400, down 17,200 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 256,800 were men and 258,700 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 4,800 and the number of women by 12,300.


Of the jobseekers, 164,400 were employed, 143,000 on the open labour market and 21,400 through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 120,600, of whom 33,000 were in services promoting employment and 63,900 in training. Of the jobseekers, 224,700 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 5,400 fewer than the year before. In October, 10,800 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 2,500 more than in September. The number of people fully laid off increased by 2,800 from October a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week totalled 5,700, representing a decrease of 300 from the year before.

### Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in October

At the end of October, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 224,700, down 5,400 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 1,300.


In October, 10,800 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 2,500 more than in September. The number of people fully laid off increased by 2,800 from October a year earlier.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 22,400, down 500 from October a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 6,700 at the end of October, down 200 from the year before.

# Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres except for Pirkanmaa


Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in October in the areas of 14 Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-10%), Southwest Finland (-7%), Lapland (-7%), Häme (-6%), Southeast Finland (-4%) and South Ostrobothnia (-4%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased only in Pirkanmaa (5%).

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

# Unemployment decreased among women and remained almost unchanged among men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 127,600 (57%) were men and 97,200 (43%) were women, indicating an increase of 1,100 for men and a decrease of 2,400 for women from the figures for September. Compared with October a year ago, unemployment among men remained unchanged and decreased among women by 5,400 (-5%).

# Unemployment decreased in all age groups with the exception of 35-44-year-olds

At the end of October, the total number of unemployed jobseekers aged under 25 was 26,700, representing a decrease of 1,700 from October a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from September by 1,200. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 6,000. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 86,200, representing a decrease of 2,300 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 60,600, representing a decrease of 1,500 on the year before.



# Unemployment increased among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from October last year at five levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-17%), lowest level of tertiary education (-6%), higher level basic qualifications (-3%) and upper secondary level of education (-2%). Unemployment grew among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (8%), higher-degree level tertiary education (4%) and lower-degree level tertiary education (2%).

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# Unemployment decreased in eight occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in eight groups from October last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-4,200), technicians and associate professionals (-1,600), professionals (-1,500), elementary occupations (-1,200) and clerical support workers (-1,100). Unemployment increased the most in the group 'unknown' (5,100).

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
### Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of October, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 61,300, down 7,100 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 36,700 were men and 24,600 were women, with the number of unemployed men decreasing by 3,500 (-9%) from the previous year and the number of women by 3,500 (-13%). The number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years was 28,600; down by 6,500 from the previous year.

# Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of October, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 124,100, down 6,800 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 3,700. The activation rate at the end of October was 35.6%, which is 0.7 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.6 % of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 59,600; down 3,000 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 64,500, down 3,800 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 348,800 at the end of October. This is 12,200 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services.

# The number of placements fell in local government and the private sector

At the end of October, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 24,000, which is 1,400 less than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 29% in local government jobs and 69% in the private sector. Since October last year, the number of placements has decreased by 9% in local government jobs and by 5% in the private sector and remained almost the same in government jobs. Of those employed, 52% were men. Placements for men decreased by 500, and those for women by 900 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



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
# Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of October, labour market training was attended by 21,700 students, up 500 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,700 were men and 11,100 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 100 and the number of women by 400. During October, 5,100 new students began labour market training, representing an decrease of 900 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,900), which is 400 less than the year before.

### at the end of the month and during the previous year




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### The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of October, 2,500 persons were in training, which is 500 less than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,300 and of women 1,200. Career coaching was provided to 1,600 people; a decrease of 300 from the previous year. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 200 from the previous year.

### in person's profession at the end of the month



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
# The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 38,400 people, representing a decrease of 2,300 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 15,900, down by 1,000 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 22,500, representing a decrease of 1,200 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 11,000 persons in the group of 'unknown'; up by 400 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector




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### The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,500 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of October, which is 300 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,200 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 100 from the previous year.




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# Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 24,900 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of October, which is 1,700 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,900 were men and 11,000 were women. The number of men decreased by 900 and the number of women by 800 from the previous year.

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
### Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 9,100 participants at the end of October, which is 1,700 less than the year before. Of the participants, 4,200 were men and 4,900 were women. The number of men decreased by 700 and the number of women by 1,000 from the previous year.

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### Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during October totalled 65,100, which is 8,000 more than in October last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in October amounted to 120,900, which is 17,100 more than a year ago. A total of 10,700 of these vacancies were filled during October, 4,500 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 53,900 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 2,000 vacancies were cancelled and 1,300 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of October was 55,500, up 9,000 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for six occupational groups; the increase was the highest in elementary occupations (3,200), service and sales personnel (2,900), construction, repair and manufacturing workers (2,000) and technicians and associate professionals (600). The number of new job vacancies had decreased the most in the categories of clerical support workers (-500), and plant and machine operators and assemblers (-400).

### Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
