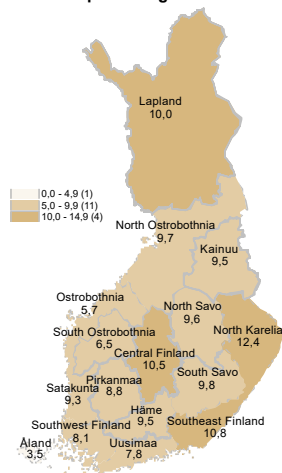

In November, 228,600 unemployed jobseekers

A total of 228,600 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of November. This is 800 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 3,800 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 8.7% of the labour force, showing no change from the previous year. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

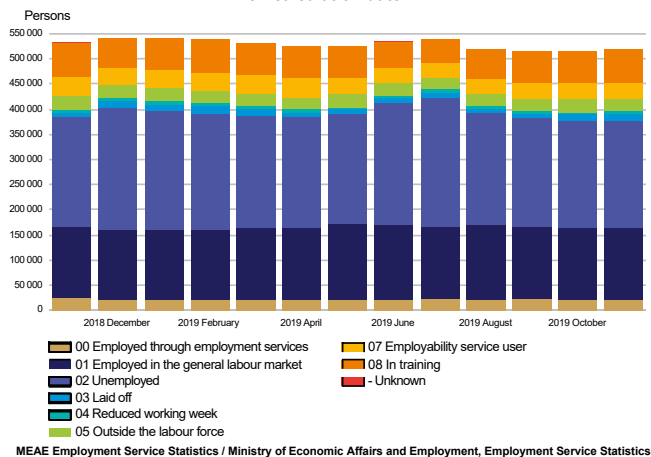
Trends:

The total number of jobseekers decreased

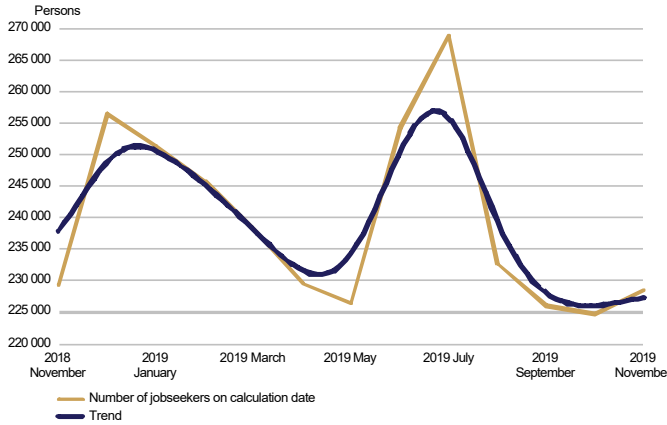
At the end of November, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 518,300, down 12,900 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 260,600 were men and 257,800 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 1,900 and the number of women by 11,000.

Of the jobseekers, 162,400 were employed, 141,200 on the open labour market and 21,200 through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 121,400, of whom 33,700 were in services promoting employment and 63,900 in training. Of the jobseekers, 228,600 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 800 fewer than the year before. In November, 14,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 3,800 more than in October. The number of people fully laid off increased by 4,800 from November a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week totalled 6,000, representing a decrease of 100 from the year before.

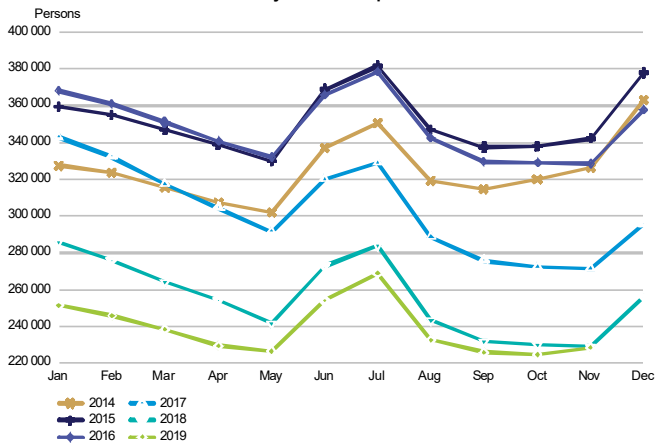
Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in November

At the end of November, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 228,600, down 800 on the previous year. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 3,800 from October.

In November, 14,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 3,800 more than in October. The number of people fully laid off increased by 4,800 from November a year earlier.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 22,800; the same as in November last year. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 7,000 at the end of November, up 100 from the year before.

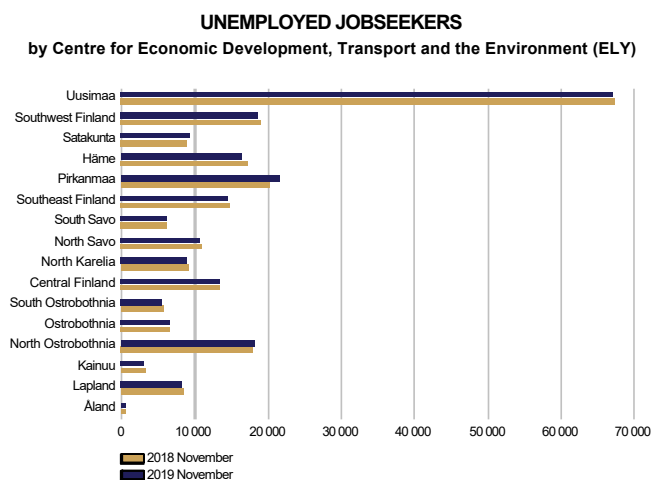
UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased in the areas of eleven ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in November in the areas of 11 Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-8%), Häme (-5%), Lapland (-4%), Southwest Finland (-3%), South Ostrobothnia (-2%) and Southeast Finland (-2%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased the most in Pirkanmaa (7%) and Satakunta (5%).

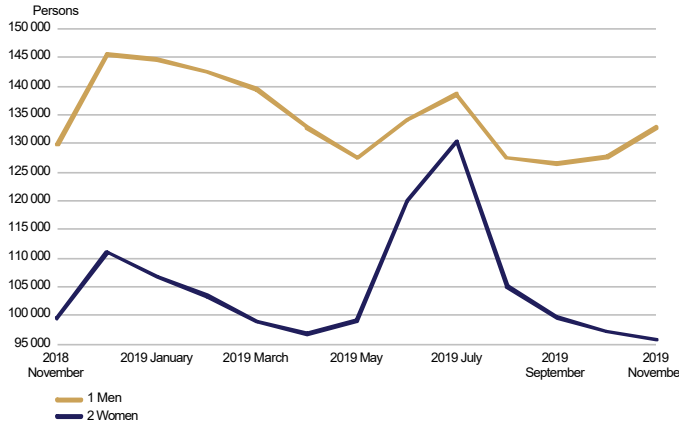

by gender**

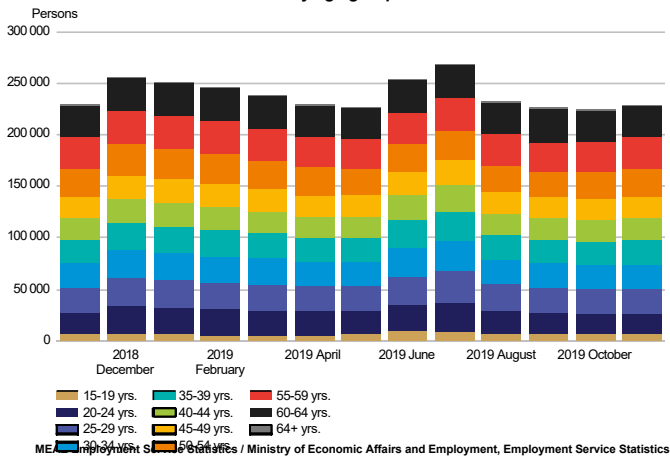

Unemployment decreased among women and increased among men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 132,800 (58%) were men and 95,800 (42%) were women, indicating an increase of 5,200 for men and a decrease of 1,400 for women from the figures for October. Compared with November a year ago, unemployment increased by 2,900 (2%) among men and decreased by 3,700 (-4%) among women.

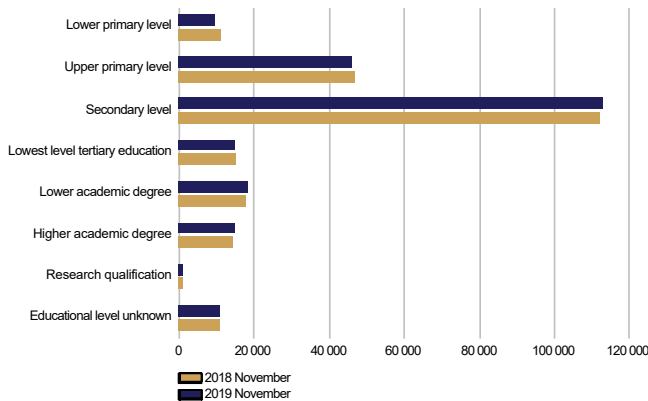
Youth unemployment decreased the most

At the end of November, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 26,600, representing a decrease of 1,000 from November a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from October by 100. The number of unemployed aged under 20 was 5,900. The number of unemployed aged over 50 was 87,900, representing a decrease of 600 on the year before. The number of unemployed aged over 55 was 61,800, representing a decrease of 300 on the year before. In the 35–44 age group, the number of unemployed increased by 1,300.

by level of education

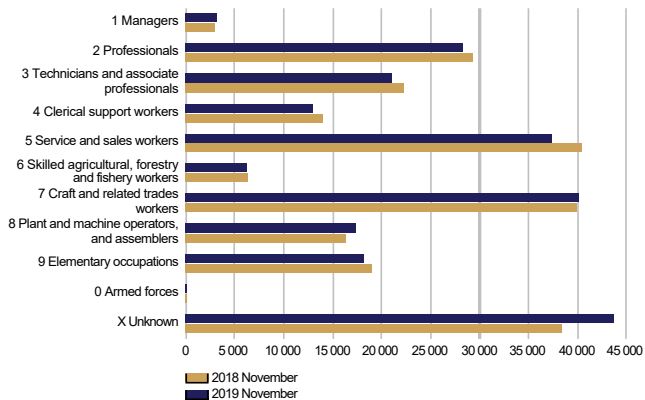

Unemployment increased among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from November last year at three levels of education: lower level basic qualifications (-15%), lowest level of tertiary education (-5%) and higher level basic qualifications (-2%). Unemployment grew the most among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (8%), higher-degree level tertiary education (5%) and lower-degree level tertiary education (4%).

by occupational group

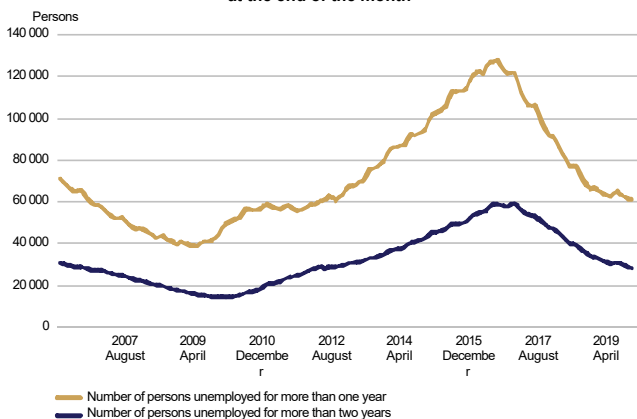

Unemployment decreased in seven occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in seven groups from November last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-3,100), technicians and associate professionals (-1,200), professionals (-1,100), clerical support workers (-900) and elementary occupations (-900). Unemployment increased the most in the group 'unknown' (5,200) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,100).

Decrease in long-term unemployment

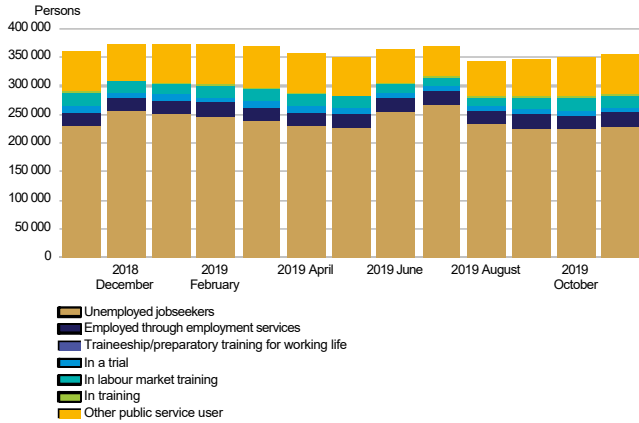
At the end of November, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 61,100, down 5,200 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 36,600 were men and 24,500 were women, with the number of unemployed men decreasing by 2,600 (-7%) from the previous year and the number of women by 2,600 (-9%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 28,300, which is 5,600 less than a year ago.

i.e. unemployed jobseekers and employment services users



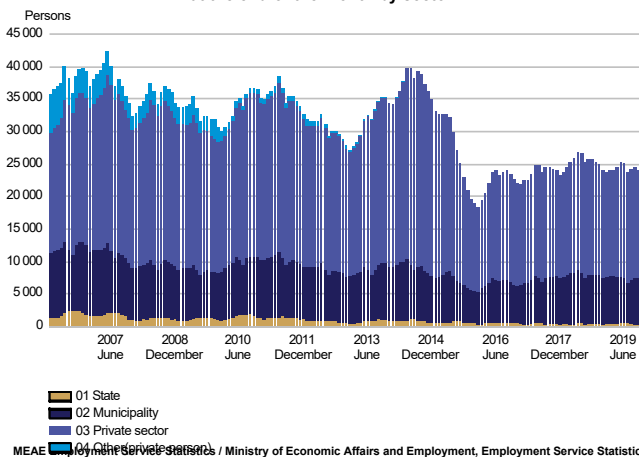
Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of November, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 125,100, down 7,100 on the previous year. Compared with October, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 1,100. The activation rate at the end of November was 35.4%, which is 1.2 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.6 % of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 59,900; down 3,000 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 65,200, down 4,200 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 353,700 at the end of November, showing a decrease of 7,900 from the previous year. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to the decrease in the number of persons covered by services.

EMPLOYED THROUGH EMPLOYMENT SERVICES at the end of the month by sector



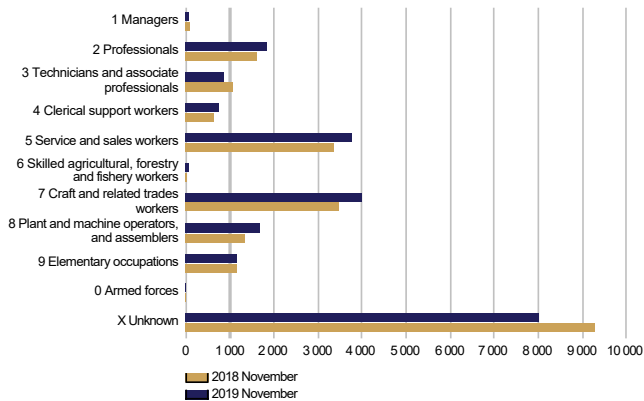
The number of placements fell in local government and the private sector

At the end of November, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 23,800, which is 1,300 less than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 29% in local government jobs and 69% in the private sector. Since November last year, the number of placements has decreased by 8% in local government jobs and by 4% in the private sector, and remained almost the same in government jobs. Of those employed, 51% were men. Placements for men decreased by 400, and those for women by 800 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



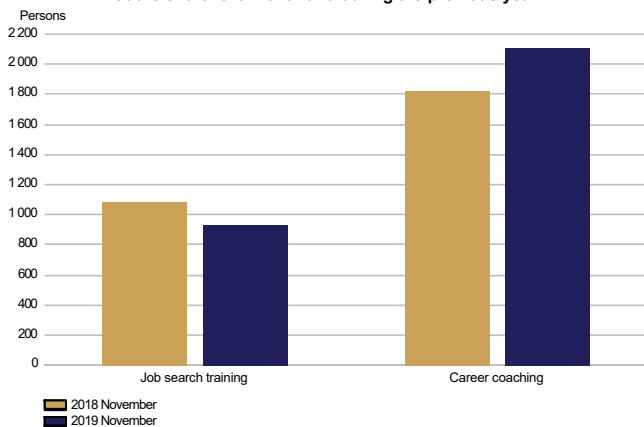

No changes in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of November, labour market training was attended by 22,100 students; the same number as a year earlier. Of the students, 10,800 were men and 11,300 women; the same as in November last year. During November, 4,400 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 300 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,100), which is 200 less than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

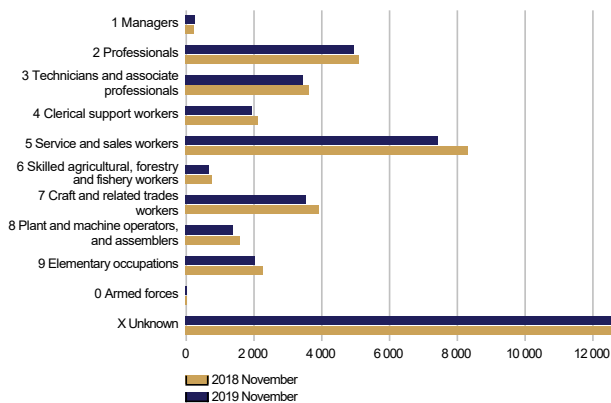

The number of persons in training increased slightly

At the end of November, 3,000 persons were in training, which is 100 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,600 and of women 1,500. Career coaching was provided to 2,100 participants, which is 300 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 200 from the previous year.

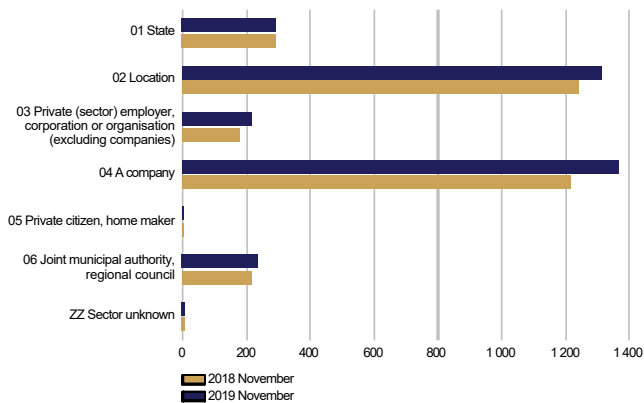
The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 38,400 people, representing a decrease of 2,400 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 15,900, down by 1,100 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 22,500, representing a decrease of 1,300 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 11,000 persons in the group of 'unknown'; up by 300 on the previous year.

The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,400 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of November, which is 300 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,200 were men and 2,200 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 100 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

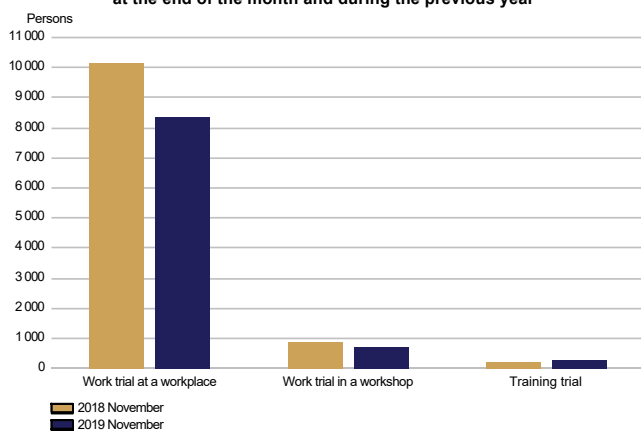

Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 25,100 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of November, which is 2,000 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 14,100 were men and 11,000 were women. The number of men decreased by 1,000 and the number of women by 900 from the previous year.

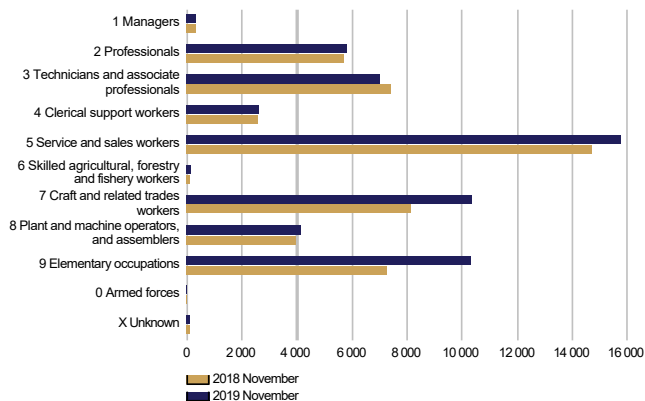
Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 9,300 participants at the end of November, which is 1,900 less than the year before. Of the participants, 4,200 were men and 5,100 were women. The number of men decreased by 800 and the number of women by 1,200 from the previous year.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during November totalled 56,600, which is 6,400 more than in November last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 110,900 in November, which is 14,400 more than a year ago. A total of 9,700 of these vacancies were filled during November, 3,700 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 51,700 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,700 vacancies were cancelled and 1,000 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of November was 51,100, up 7,600 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies increased for nine occupational groups; the increase was the highest in elementary occupations (3,100), construction, repair and manufacturing workers (2,200) and service and sales workers (1,100). The number of new job vacancies had decreased the most in the category of technicians and associate professionals (-400).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
