

In December, 257,700 unemployed jobseekers





A total of 257,700 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of December. This is 1,200 more than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 29,100 from the previous month. The increase in unemployment in December is a phenomenon occurring each year due to graduations from certain vocational education institutions, increases in lay-offs and a higher than normal number of fixed-term employment contracts ending during December. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.8% of the labour force which is 0.1 percentage points more than a year ago. In 2019, the average number of unemployed jobseekers was 240,400, or 15,500 less than the year before. Unemployed jobseekers accounted on average for 9.2% of the labour force in 2019, which is 0.5 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

The total number of jobseekers decreased


At the end of December, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 535,300, down 7,000 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 272,000 were men and 263,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of male jobseekers increased by 1,800 and the number of female jobseekers by decreased by 8,800.

Of the jobseekers, 159,800 were employed, 139,200 on the open labour market and 20,500 through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 111,800, of whom 28,900 were in services promoting employment and 59,000 in training. Of the jobseekers, 257,700 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 1,200 more than the year before. In December, 21,700 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 7,100 more than in November. The number of people fully laid off increased by 6,300 from December a year earlier. Furthermore, the number of jobseekers on a reduced working week totalled 6,000; no change from the year before.

Increase in unemployed jobseekers in December

At the end of December, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 257,700; up 1,200 on the previous year. Compared with November, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 29,100.


In December, 21,700 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 7,100 more than in November. The number of people fully laid off increased by 6,300 from December a year earlier.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 27,300, down 400 from December a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 8,000 at the end of December, up 300 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of six ELY Centres


Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in December in the areas of six Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in South Savo (-6%), Kainuu (-6%), Lapland (-5%), and Häme (-4%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased the most in Pirkanmaa (7%), Satakunta (4%) and North Ostrobothnia (3%).



Unemployment decreased among women and increased among men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 150,300 (58%) were men and 107,400 (42%) were women, indicating an increase of 17,400 for men and 11,700 for women from the figures for November. Compared with December a year ago, unemployment increased by 4,800 (3%) among men and decreased by 3,600 (-3%) among women.

Youth unemployment decreased the most

At the end of December, the number of unemployed jobseekers aged under 25 totalled 32,800, representing a decrease of 600 from December a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from November by 6,200. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 7,200. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 95,100, representing an increase of 100 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 66,100, representing an increase of 300 on the year before. In the 30–44 age group, the number of unemployed increased by 2,100.

Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



Unemployment increased among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from December last year at three levels of education: lower level basic qualifications (-15%), lowest level of tertiary education (-4%) and higher level basic qualifications (-1%). Unemployment grew the most among those with a vocational special education (22%), doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (7%), lower-degree level tertiary education (4%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (4%).

Unemployment decreased in seven occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in seven groups from December last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-3,000), technicians and associate professionals (-1,300), professionals (-1,100) and elementary occupations (-1,000). Unemployment increased the most in the group 'unknown' (5,600), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,700), and construction, repair and manufacturing workers (1,300).



Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of December, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 63,000, down 3,800 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 37,800 were men and 25,200 were women, with the number of unemployed men decreasing by 1,800 (-5%) from the previous year and the number of women by 2,000 (-7%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 28,700, which is 5,000 less than a year ago.



Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of December, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 110,900, down 5,600 on the previous year. Compared with November, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 14,300. The activation rate at the end of December was 30.1%, which is 1.1 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.1% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 53,600; down 2,500 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 57,200; down 3,100 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 368,500 at the end of December, showing a decrease of 4,400 from the previous year. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to the decrease in the number of persons covered by services.


The number of placements fell in local government and the private sector

At the end of December, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 22,800, which is 1,100 less than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 29% in local government jobs and 69% in the private sector. Placements in local government decreased by 8% and in the private sector by 3% from December last year, while placements in central government increased by 5%. Of those employed, 51% were men. Placements for men decreased by 400, and those for women by 700 from the previous year.


Slight decrease in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of December, labour market training was attended by 18,500 students, down 100 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,100 were men and 9,400 were women. The number of men decreased by 100, and the number of women remained the same compared to December in the previous year. During December, 2,200 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 200 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,100), which is 300 more than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year





The number of persons in training increased

At the end of December, 2,300 persons were in training, which is 700 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,300 and of women 1,100. Career coaching had 1,800 participants, which is 700 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training remained the same as the previous year.


The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 35,000 people, representing a decrease of 2,000 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 14,600, down by 900 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 20,400, representing a decrease of 1,100 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 10,100 persons in the group of 'unknown'; up by 400 on the previous year.

The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,300 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of December, which is 300 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,100 were men and 2,100 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 100 from the previous year.

Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 22,300 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of December, which is 1,700 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 12,700 were men and 9,600 were women. The number of men decreased by 900 and the number of women by 800 from the previous year.

Participation in work and training trials decreased


Work and training trials had a total of 6,500 participants at the end of December, which is 1,600 less than the year before. Of the participants, 3,200 were men and 3,300 were women. The number of men decreased by 700 and the number of women by 900 from the previous year.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during December totalled 55,400, which is 9,500 more than in December last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in December amounted to 104,100, which is 14,500 more than a year ago. A total of 8,000 of these vacancies were filled during December, 3,300 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 41,300 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,600 vacancies were cancelled and 1,100 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of December was 54,000, up 8,100 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for seven occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (4,500), other workers (3,600) and process and transport workers (1,200). The number of new job vacancies decreased the most in the categories of professionals (-200) and service and sales workers (-200).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
