

In February, 248,100 unemployed jobseekers






A total of 248,100 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of February. This is 2,300 more than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 3,500 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.5% of the labour force, which is 0.1 percentage points more than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- · The total number of jobseekers decreased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 2,000 from the previous year
- Services included in the activation rate had 7,000 less people than a year ago
- 4,000 new job vacancies fewer than last year




The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of February, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 530,100, down 8,300 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 270,200 were men and 260,000 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 400 and the number of women by 8,000.

Of the jobseekers, 159,100 were employed, 138,900 of them were on the open labour market and 20,200 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 116,800, of whom 31,400 were in services promoting employment and 62,200 in training. Of the jobseekers, 248,100 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 2,300 more than the year before. In February, 18,800 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 400 more than in January. The number of people fully laid off increased by 2,800 from February a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 6,100, representing an increase of 100 from the year before.

Unemployed jobseekers




Increase in unemployed jobseekers in February

At the end of February, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 248,100, up 2,300 on the previous year. Compared with January, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 3,500.

In February, 18,800 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 400 more than in January. The number of people fully laid off increased by 2,800 from February a year earlier.


The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 24,700, up 100 from February a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 7,400 at the end of February, up 200 from the year before.

UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased in the areas of six ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in February in the areas of six Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-8%), Lapland (-4%) and Southwest Finland (-2%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased the most in North Karelia (6%), North Ostrobothnia (3%), Pirkanmaa (3%) and North Savo (3%).

Unemployed jobseekers and jobs vacant in Employment and Economic Development Office by ELY centre



Unemployment decreased among women and increased among men


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 146,600 (59%) were men and 101,600 (41%) were women, indicating a decrease of 1,500 for men and 2,100 for women from the figures for January. Compared with February a year ago, unemployment increased by 4,100 (3%) among men and decreased by 1,800 (-2%) among women.



Youth unemployment decreased the most

At the end of February, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 29,800, representing a decrease of 700 from February a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from January by 1,000. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 5,700. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 93,600, representing an increase of 700 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 65,400, representing an increase of 1,000 on the year before. In the 30-44 age group, the number of unemployed increased by 2,300.

Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



Unemployment increased among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from February last year at three levels of education: lower level basic qualifications (-15%), lowest level of tertiary education (-2%) and higher level basic qualifications (-1%). Unemployment grew the most among those with post-secondary nontertiary education (21%), lower-degree level tertiary education (5%), doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (5%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (3%).

Unemployment decreased in six occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in six groups from February last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-2,000), elementary occupations (-900), technicians and associate professionals (-600) and clerical support workers (-600). Unemployment increased the most in the groups of 'unknown' (4,900) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,200).



Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of February, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 63,200, down 1,500 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 38,000 were men and 25,200 were women. The number of men decreased by 600 (-2%) from the previous year and the number of women by 900 (-3%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 28,500, which is 3,800 less than a year ago.



Services




Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of February, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 119,200, down 6,700 on the previous year. Compared with January, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 3,300. The activation rate at the end of February was 32.4%, which is 1.5 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.4% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 57,100, down 3,100 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 62,100, down 3,600 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 367,300 at the end of February. This is 4,400 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to the decrease in the number of persons covered by services.


The number of placements fell in local government and the private sector

At the end of February, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 22,900, which is 1,100 less than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 29% in local government jobs and 69% in the private sector. Since February last year, the number of placements has decreased by 8% in local government jobs and by 3% in the private sector and remained the same in government jobs. Of those employed, 50% were men. Placements for men decreased by 500, and those for women by 600 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month




Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of February, labour market training was attended by 20,600 students, up 500 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,300 were men and 10,400 were women. The number of men remained the same and the number of women increased by 400 on the previous year. During February, 4,300 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 500 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' consisted of 6,800 people in integration training, which is 200 more than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




The number of persons in training increased

At the end of February, 3,200 persons were in training, which is 700 more than the year before. Of those in training, 1,700 were men and 1,500 women. Career coaching was provided to 2,600 participants, which is 1,200 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 400 from the previous year.

in person's profession at the end of the month




The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 37,300 people, representing a decrease of 3,000 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 15,500, down 1,400 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 21,800, representing a decrease of 1,600 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 11,100 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 200 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector




The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,200 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of February, which is 200 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,100 were men and 2,100 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 100 from the previous year.

REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES


at the end of the month and during the previous year



Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 23,500 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of February, which is 2,400 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,200 were men and 10,300 were women. The number of men decreased by 1,200 and the number of women also by 1,200 from the previous year.

Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 8,400 participants at the end of February, which is 1,700 less than a year earlier. Of the participants, 3,900 were men and 4,500 were women. The number of men decreased by 700 and the number of women by 1,000 from the previous year.

Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during February totalled 73,600, which is 4,200 less than in February last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in February amounted to 164,400, which is 3,000 more than a year ago. A total of 11,300 of these vacancies were filled during February, 3,500 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 64,100 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 2,200 vacancies were cancelled and 900 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of February was 94,000, down 2,100 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for four occupational groups; the greatest increase was in the group of craft and related trades workers (1,900). The number of new job vacancies had decreased the most in the categories of skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-1,700), service and sales workers (-1,400) and professionals (-1,300).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
