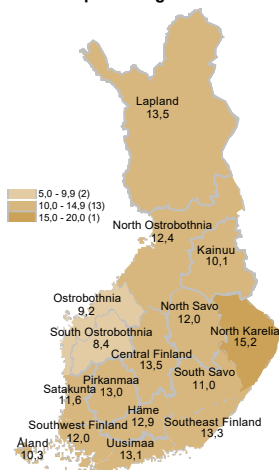

329,700 unemployed jobseekers in August

Unemployed jobseekers' percentage of the workforce by ELY centre



A total of 329,700 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of August; an increase of 97,100 from the previous year. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 57,700 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 12.5% of the labour force, which is 3.6 percentage points more than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

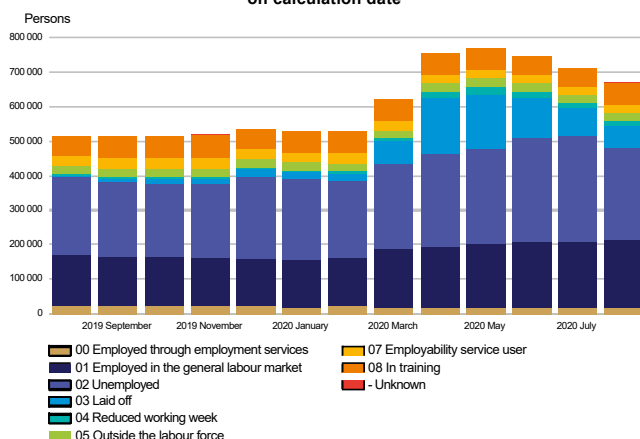
Trends:

- Total number of jobseekers increased by 152,000
- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 97,000 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off increased by 54,000
- Services included in the activation rate had 6,000 less people than a year ago
- The number of new job vacancies decreased by 12,000 from last year

The total number of jobseekers increased

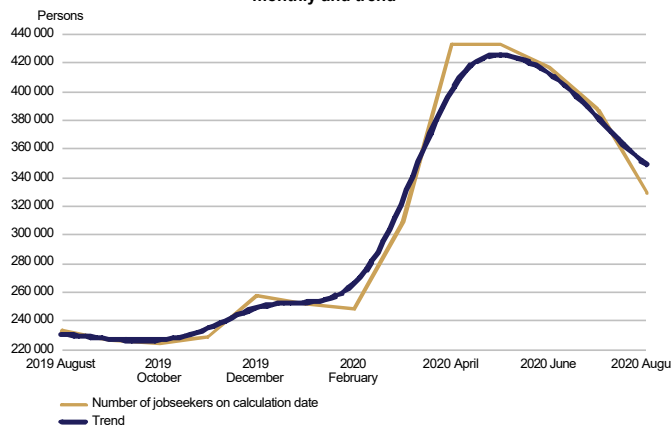
At the end of August, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 669,900, up 152,200 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 339,000 were men and 330,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 84,500 and the number of women by 67,800.

Of the jobseekers, 213,300 were employed, 194,500 of them were on the open labour market and 18,800 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers on the open labour market increased by 46,900 from August a year earlier. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 110,000, of whom 23,900 were in services promoting employment and 63,400 in training. Of the jobseekers, 329,700 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 97,100 more than the year before. In August, 61,000 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, showing a decrease of 21,000 from July. The number of people fully laid off increased by 53,700 from August a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 16,900, representing an increase of 11,900 from the year before.

monthly and trend

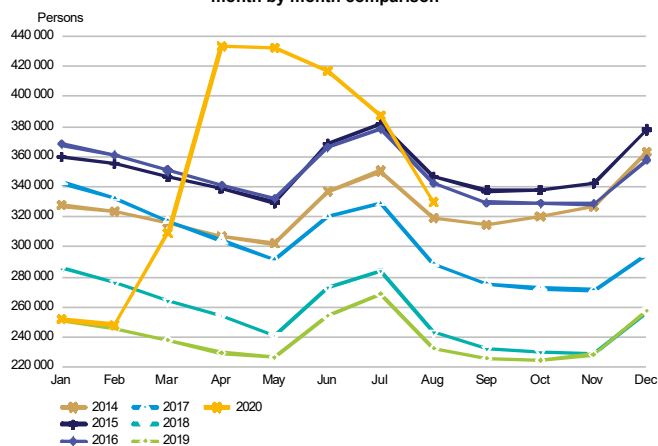


The number of unemployed jobseekers increased in August

At the end of August, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 329,700; up 97,100 on the previous year. Compared with July, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 57,700. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 14,800, up 1,300 from August a year ago. 54,200 periods of unemployment commenced in August, showing a year-on-year increase of 13,100. The number of commencing periods of unemployment decreased by 1,300 from July. The number of commencing periods is always larger than the number of job searches commenced, because unemployment periods also begin in other existing jobseeker groups.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 34,800, up 9,100 from August a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 10,500 at the end of August, up 3,900 from the year before.

month by month comparison

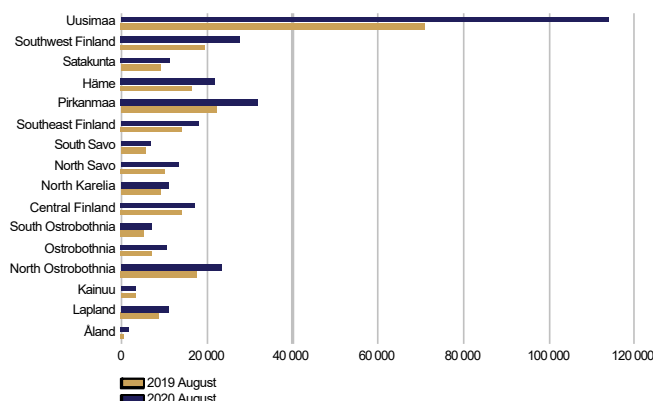


In August, 61,000 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, showing a decrease of 21,000 from July. The number of people fully laid off increased by 53,700 from August a year earlier. In August, 4,500 job searches by those fully laid off commenced, showing a year-on-year increase of 3,500. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 22,200, up 19,100 from August a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs decreased by 4,300 from July. The number of people fully laid off increased in all occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of 'unknown' (11,200), service and sales workers (11,200), craft and related trades workers (7,100), and professionals (6,200).

Unemployment increased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased in August in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Uusimaa (60%), Ostrobothnia (52%), Pirkanmaa (44%) and Southwest Finland (43%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased the least in Kainuu (4%), South Savo (19%), North Karelia (21%), Central Finland (23%) and Southeast Finland (26%). In the Åland Islands, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 217 per cent. Compared to July, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Ostrobothnia (-20%), South Ostrobothnia (-19%) and Kainuu (-19%).

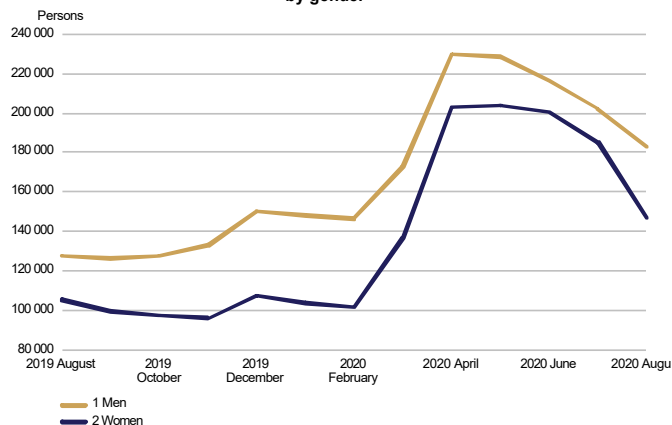

Unemployed jobseekers by gender and age-group

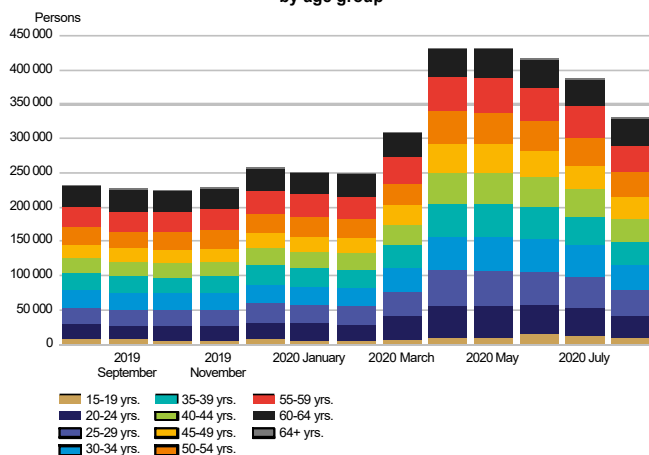
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment increased more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 182,900 (55%) were men and 146,800 (45%) were women, indicating a decrease of 19,500 for men and 38,300 for women from the figures for July. Compared with August a year ago, unemployment increased by 55,400 (43%) among men and by 41,700 (40%) among women.

by age group**



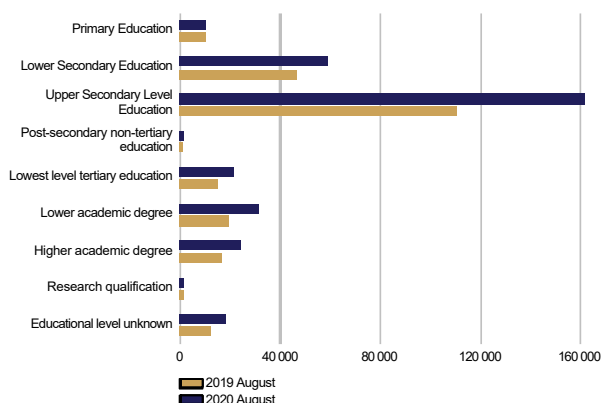
Unemployment increased in all age groups

At the end of August, the number of unemployed jobseekers aged under 25 was 42,000, representing an increase of 12,400 from August a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from July by 12,000. The number of unemployed aged under 20 was 9,600. The number of unemployed aged over 50 was 115,300, showing an increase of 28,200 on the year before. The number of unemployed aged over 55 was 79,500, representing an increase of 18,200 on the year before. Proportionally, unemployment increased most in the age groups 25–29 and 35–44 (on average 50%) and those over 64 (69%). Compared to July, unemployment decreased in all age groups, the most in those aged under 20 (-24%) and those aged 20–24 (-22%).



Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group

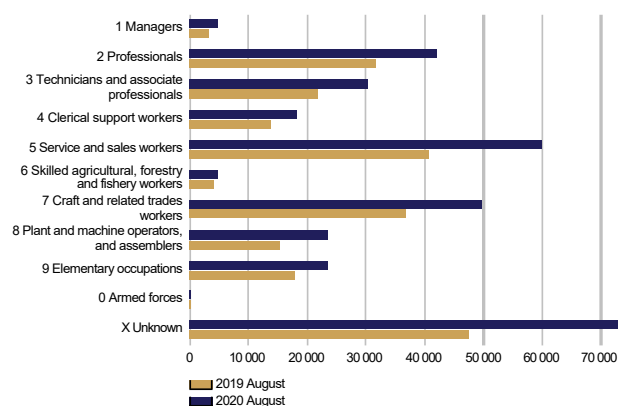
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment increased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment increased from August last year at all levels of education; the increase was greatest among those with post-secondary non-tertiary education (99%), lower-degree level tertiary education (63%), level of education 'unknown' (52%), higher-degree level tertiary education (47%) and upper secondary education (45%).

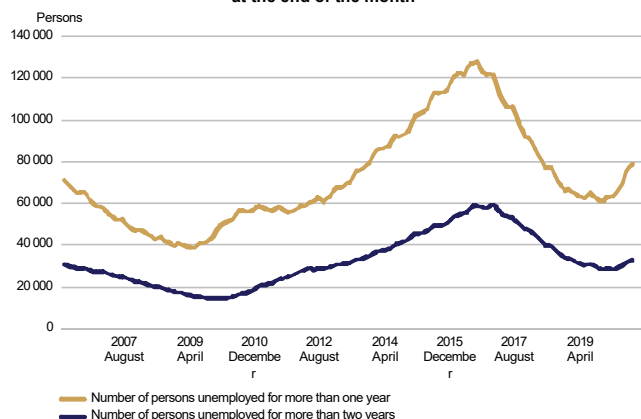
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment increased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment increased in all groups from August last year; the most in the category 'unknown' (25,200), service and sales workers (19,200) and craft and related trades workers (13,200). Unemployment increased the least among soldiers (30), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (600) and managers (1,400).

at the end of the month**

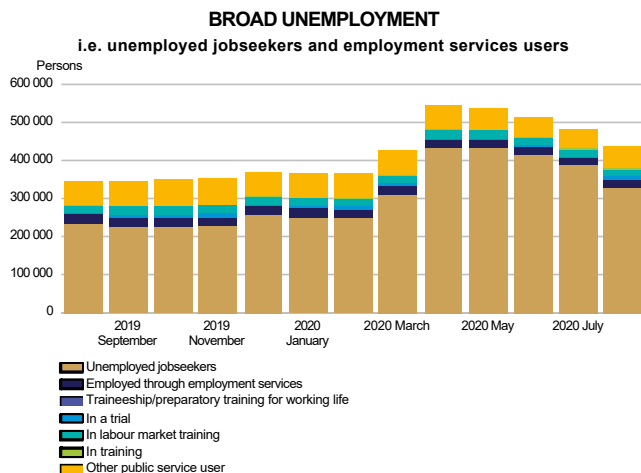


Increase in long-term unemployment

At the end of August, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 78,800, up 15,400 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 46,600 were men and 32,200 were women. The number of men increased by 9,100 (24%) from the previous year and the number of women by 6,300 (24%). The number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years totalled 32,800, an increase of 2,500 from the previous year.



Services



Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

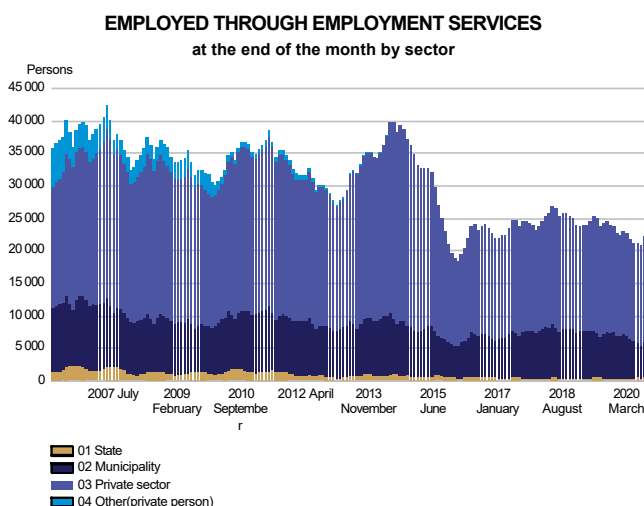
At the end of August, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 106,000, down 6,200 on the previous year. Compared with July, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 11,700. The activation rate at the end of August was 24.3%, which is 8.2 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 3.9% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 51,600, down 3,200 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 54,500, down 3,000 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 435,700 at the end of August; an increase of 90,900 from the previous year. The increase in broad unemployment was mainly due to an increase in unemployment.

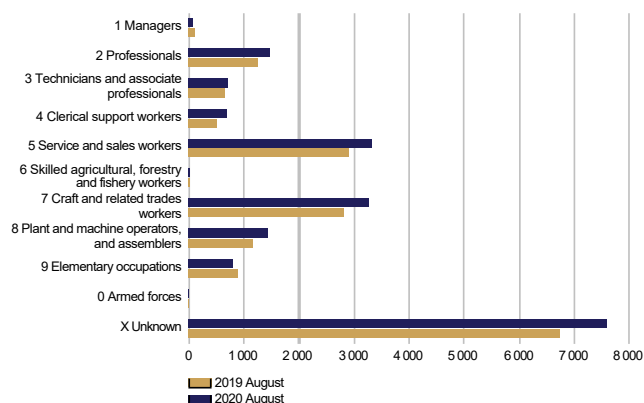
The number of placements fell in local government and the private sector

At the end of August, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 22,100; a decrease of 2,200 from the previous year. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 25% in local government jobs and 73% in the private sector. Since August last year, the number of placements in local government jobs has decreased by 20% and placements in the private sector by 5% but increased by 1% in government jobs. Of those employed, 53% were men. Placements for both men and women decreased by 1,100 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month

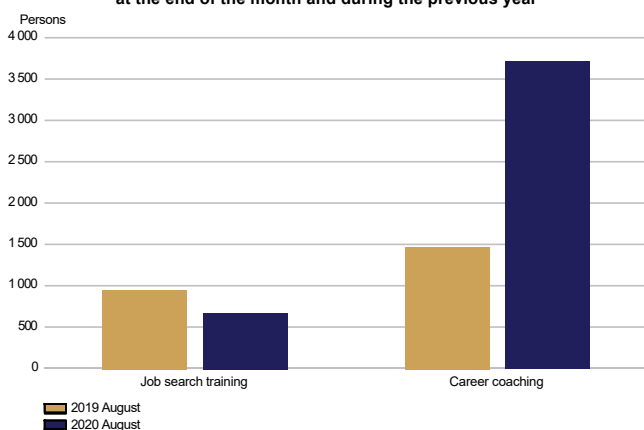


Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of August, labour market training was attended by 19,400 students, up 2,400 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,300 were men and 10,000 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 1,200 from August a year earlier. During August, 7,100 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 1,700 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,900), which is 700 more than the year before.

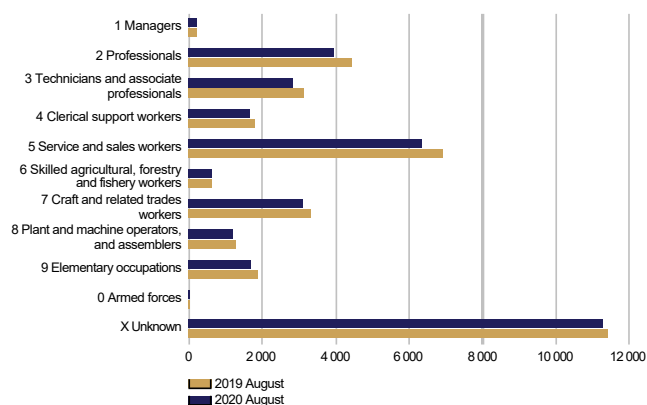

The number of persons in training increased

At the end of August, 4,400 persons were in training, which is 2,000 more than the year before. Of those in training, 2,200 were men and 2,200 women. Career coaching was provided to 3,700 participants, which is 2,200 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training totalled 700, showing a decrease of 300 from the previous year.

in person's profession at the end of the month



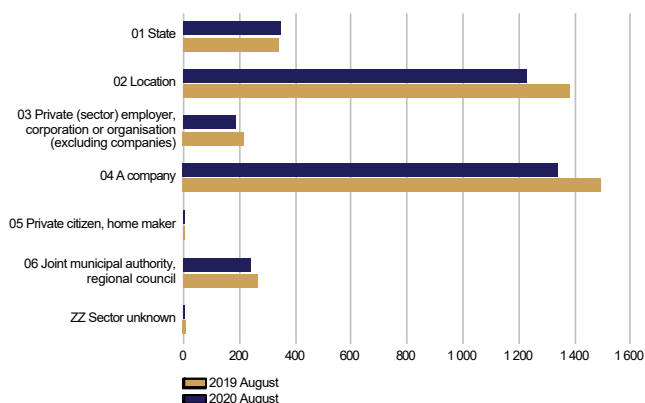
The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 32,900 people, representing a decrease of 2,200 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 13,400, down 1,100 on the previous year. The corresponding number for women was 19,400, representing a decrease of 1,100 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 9,900 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 100 on the previous year.



Job alternation, rehabilitative work and trials

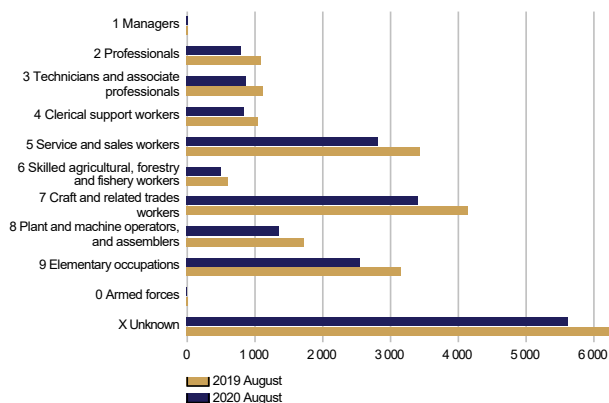
AS A JOB ALTERNATION SUBSTITUTE

The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,300 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of August, which is 400 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,200 were men and 2,100 were women. The number of men decreased by 100, and the number of women by 300 from the previous year.

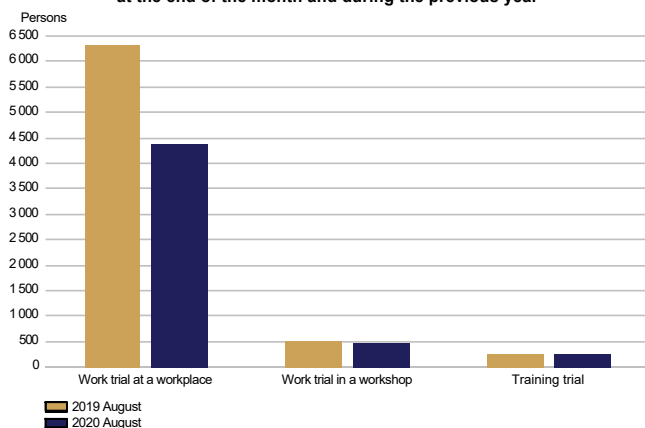
REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES

Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 18,800 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of August, which is 3,700 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 10,900 were men and 7,900 were women. The number of men decreased by 2,100 and the number of women by 1,700 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



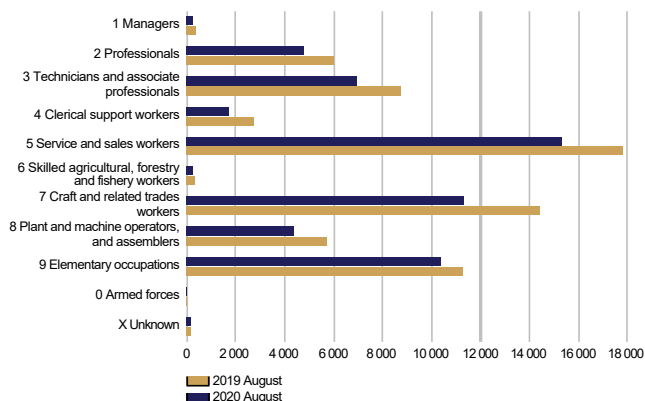
Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 5,100 participants at the end of August, which is 2,000 less than the year before. Of the participants, 2,600 were men and 2,500 were women. The number of men decreased by 900 and the number of women by 1,000 from the previous year.

Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during August totalled 55,500, showing a decrease of 12,000 from August a year earlier. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in July amounted to 98,600, which is 19,500 less than a year ago. A total of 8,400 of these vacancies were filled during August, 3,300 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 42,600 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 2,000 vacancies were cancelled and 1,600 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of August was 47,500, down 12,000 on the previous year.

With the exception of armed forces, the number of new vacancies decreased in all occupational groups. The number of new job vacancies decreased the most in the categories of craft and related trades workers (-3,100), service and sales workers (-2,500) and professionals (-1,800). Conversely, the number of new vacancies decreased the least in the group 'unknown' (-20) and skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-20).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
