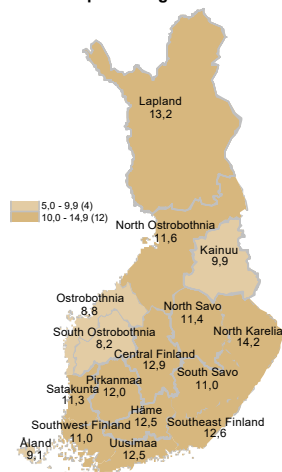

312,700 unemployed jobseekers in October

Unemployed jobseekers' percentage of the workforce by ELY centre



A total of 312,700 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of October. This is 88,000 more than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 3,100 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 11.9% of the labour force, which is 3.3 percentage points more than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

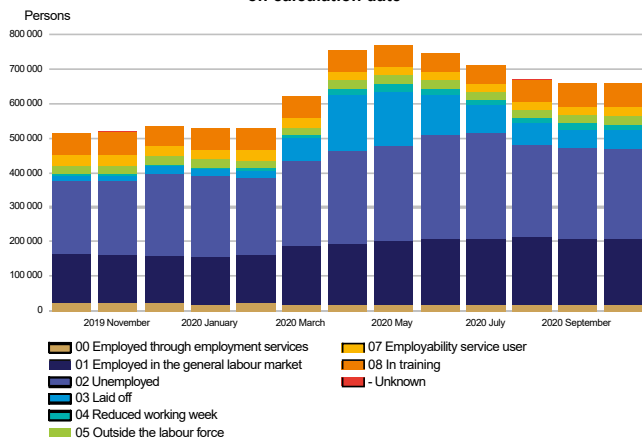
Trends:

- Total number of jobseekers increased by 142,000
- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 88,000 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off increased by 46,000
- Services included in the activation rate had 6,000 less people than a year ago
- The number of new job vacancies decreased by 12,000 from last year

The total number of jobseekers increased

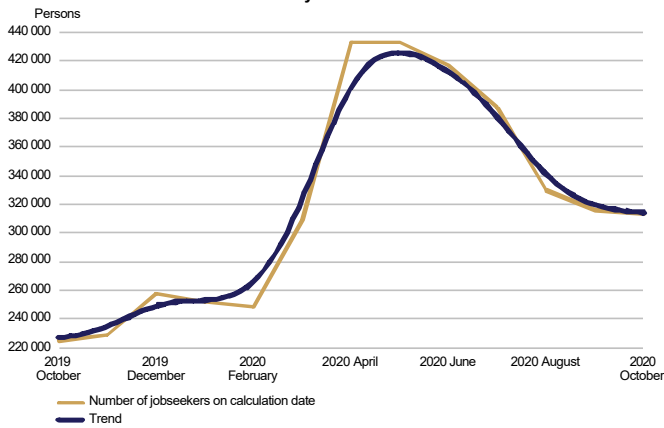
At the end of October, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 657,900, up 142,500 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 335,200 were men and 322,700 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 78,400 and the number of women by 64,000.

Of the jobseekers, 210,100 were employed, 190,600 of them were on the open labour market and 19,500 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers on the open labour market increased by 47,600 from October a year earlier. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 117,400, of whom 28,300 were in services promoting employment and 67,000 in training. Of the jobseekers, 312,700 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 88,000 more than the year before. In October, 57,200 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 400 more than in September. The number of people fully laid off increased by 46,300 from October a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 17,700, representing an increase of 12,000 from the year before.

monthly and trend

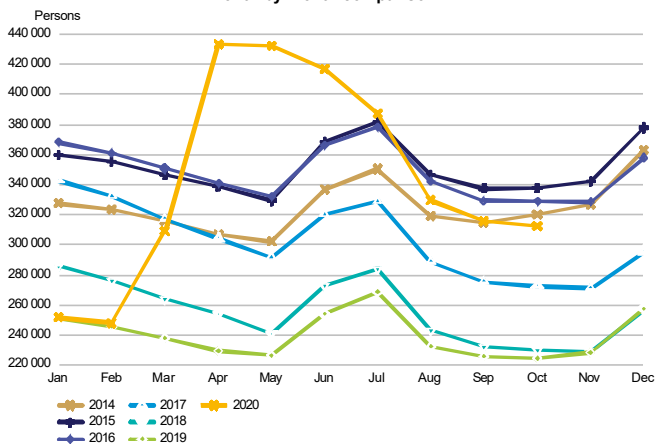


Increase in unemployed jobseekers in October

At the end of October, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 312,700, up 88,000 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 3,100. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 16,000, up 400 from October a year ago. In October, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 57,900, representing an increase of 10,800 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment increased by 3,300 from September. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 32,200, up 9,800 from October a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 10,300 at the end of October, up 4,100 from the year before.

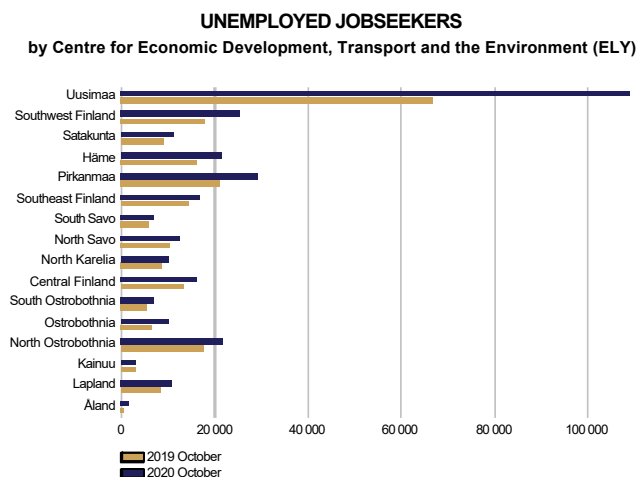
UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

In October, 57,200 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 400 more than in September. The number of people fully laid off increased by 46,300 from October a year earlier. In October, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 5,700, representing an increase of 3,400 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 24,100, up 15,600 from October a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs increased by 2,200 from September. The number of people fully laid off increased in all occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and sales workers (10,600), 'unknown' (9,400), craft and related trades workers (6,500), and professionals (4,800).

Unemployment increased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased in October in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Uusimaa (63%), Ostrobothnia (55%), Southwest Finland (43%) and Pirkanmaa (39%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased the least in Kainuu (7%), South Savo (15%), North Karelia (16%) and Southeast Finland (18%). In the Åland Islands, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 175 per cent. Compared with September, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in the areas of nine ELY Centres; the most in Southwest Finland (-3%), Pirkanmaa (-2%) and North Ostrobothnia (-2%). From September, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased the most in South Ostrobothnia (5%) and Kainuu (4%).

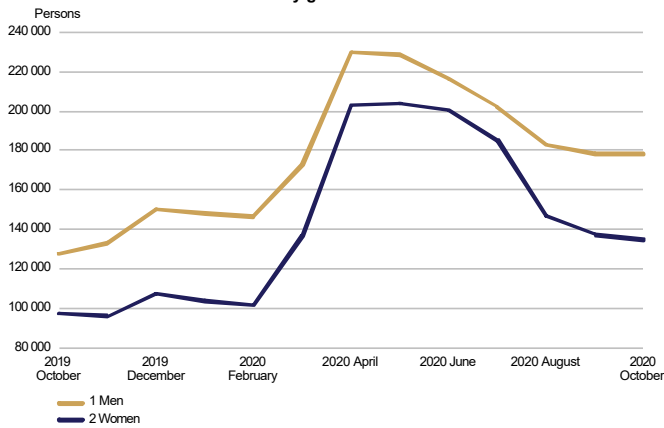

Unemployed jobseekers by gender and age-group

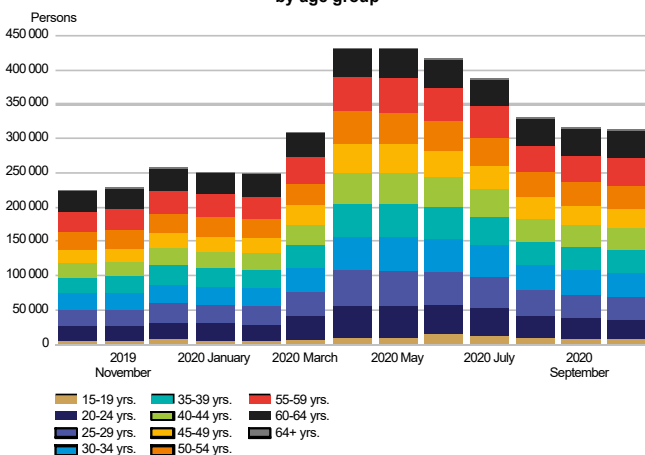
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment increased more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 178,100 (57%) were men and 134,600 (43%) were women, indicating a decrease of 300 for men and 2,700 for women from the figures for September. Compared with October a year ago, unemployment increased by 50,500 (40%) among men and by 37,500 (39%) among women.

by age group**



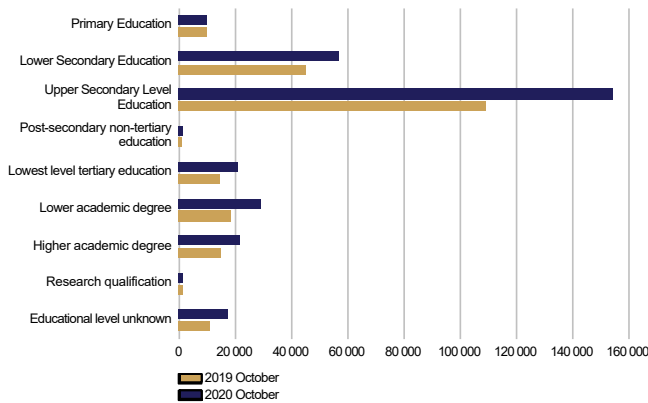
Unemployment increased in all age groups

At the end of October, unemployed jobseekers aged under 25 numbered 36,300, representing an increase of 9,600 from October a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from September by 1,800. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 7,700. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 114,400, representing an increase of 28,200 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 79,900, representing an increase of 19,200 on the year before. Proportionally, unemployment increased most in the age group 25–44 (on average 45%) and those over 64 (92%). Compared with September, unemployment decreased in all age groups with the exception of those aged 55–64, the most among those aged under 20 (-9%), those aged over 64 (-6%) and those aged 20–24 (-4%).



Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group

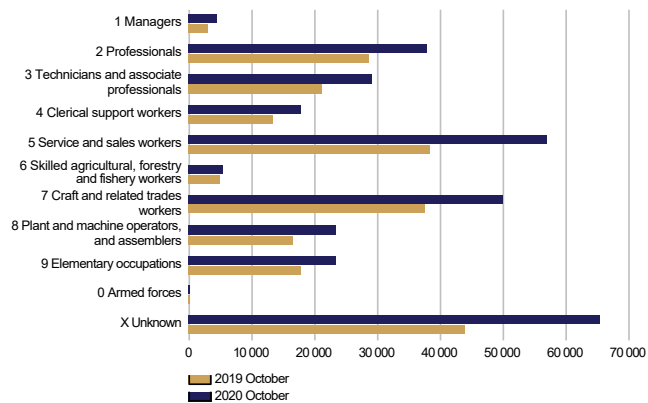
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment increased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment increased from October last year at all levels of education; the increase was greatest among those with post-secondary non-tertiary education (84%), level of education 'unknown' (60%), lower-degree level tertiary education (57%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (43%).

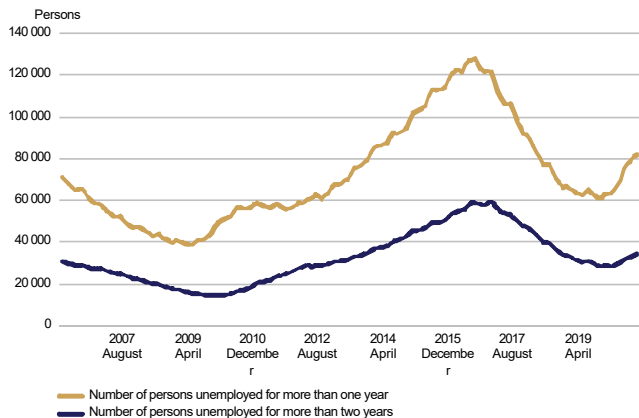
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment increased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment increased in all groups from October last year; the most in the category 'unknown' (21,300), service and sales workers (18,500) and craft and related trades workers (12,300). Unemployment increased the least in the groups of armed forces (30), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (500), and managers (1,300).

at the end of the month**

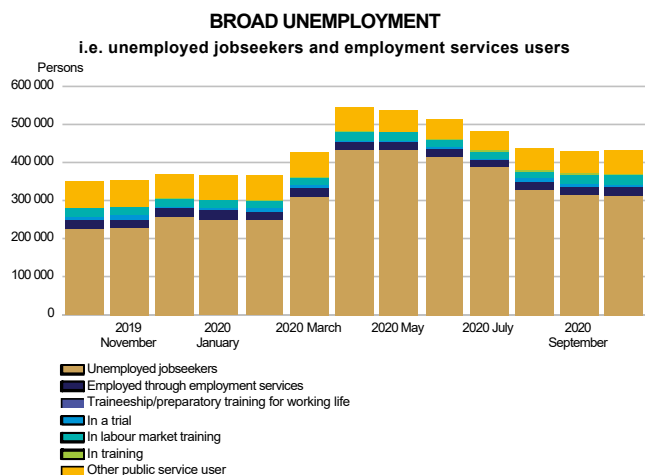


Increase in long-term unemployment

At the end of October, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 82,000, up 20,700 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 49,000 were men and 33,000 were women. The number of men increased by 12,300 (34%) from the previous year and the number of women by 8,400 (34%). The number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years totalled 34,300, an increase of 5,700 from the previous year.



Services

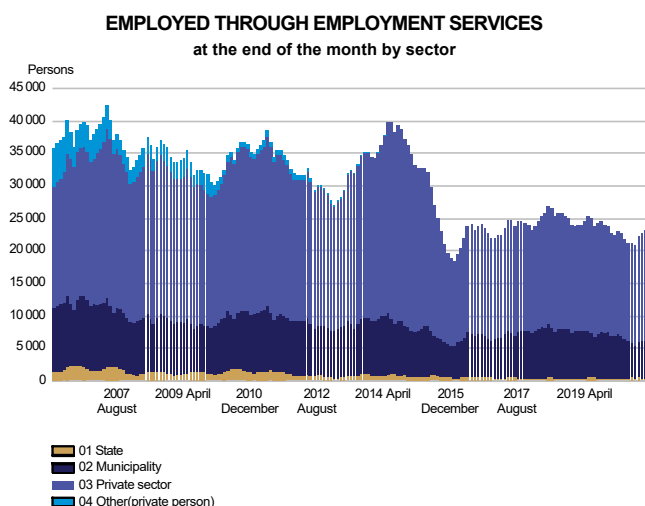


Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of October, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 118,500, down 5,500 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 4,700. The activation rate at the end of October was 27.5%, which is 8.1 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.3% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 56,500, down 3,100 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 62,100, down 2,500 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 431,300 at the end of October. This is 82,400 more than a year earlier. The increase in broad unemployment was mainly due to an increase in the number of unemployed jobseekers.



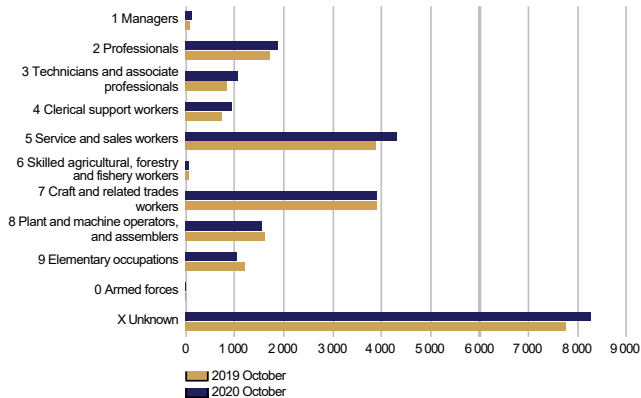
The number of placements fell in local government

At the end of October, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 23,200, which is 800 less than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 25% in local government jobs and 73% in the private sector. Since October last year, the number of placements has decreased by 18% in local government jobs and increased by 7% in government jobs and by 3% in the private sector. Of those employed, 52% were men. Placements for men decreased by 400, and those for women by 300 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month

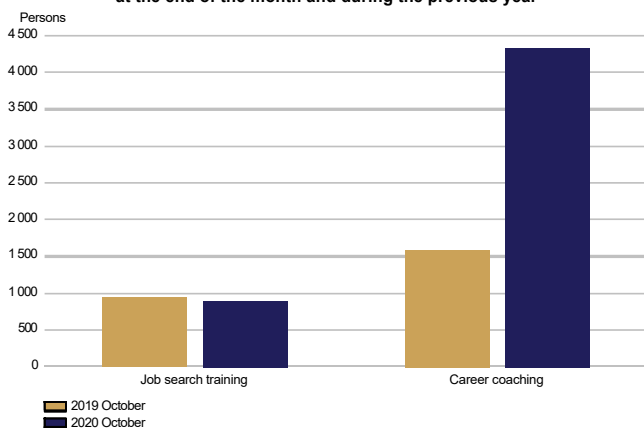


Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of October, labour market training was attended by 23,100 students, up 1,300 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,900 were men and 12,200 were women. The number of men increased by 200, and the number of women by 1,100 from October last year. During October, 5,400 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 300 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' consisted of 7,400 people in integration training, which is 500 more than the year before.

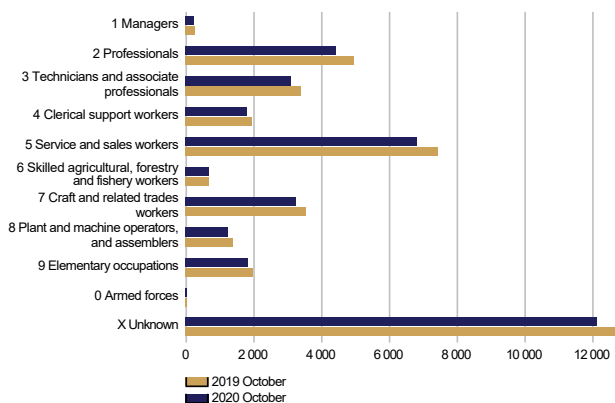

The number of persons in training increased

At the end of October, 5,200 persons were in training, which is 2,700 more than the year before. Of those in training, 2,700 were men and 2,500 women. Career coaching was provided to 4,300 participants, which is 2,700 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training was 900 which is as many as a year ago.

in person's profession at the end of the month



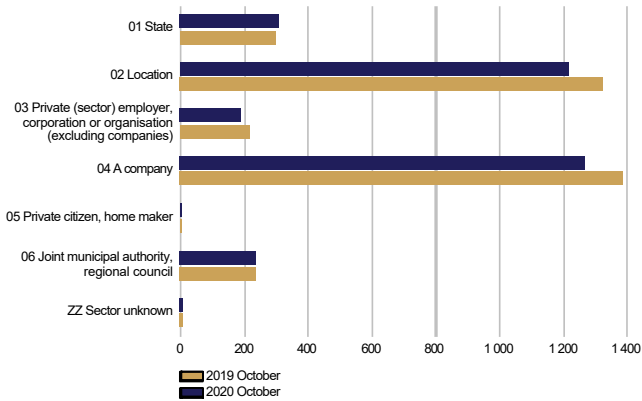
The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 35,500 people, representing a decrease of 2,900 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 14,400, down 1,500 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 21,100, representing a decrease of 1,400 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 10,600 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 400 on the previous year.



Job alternation, rehabilitative work and trials

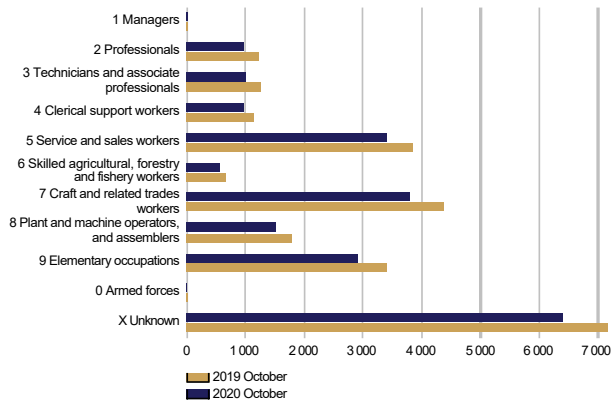
AS A JOB ALTERNATION SUBSTITUTE

The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,200 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of October, which is 300 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,100 were men and 2,100 were women. The number of men decreased by 100, and the number of women by 200 from the previous year.

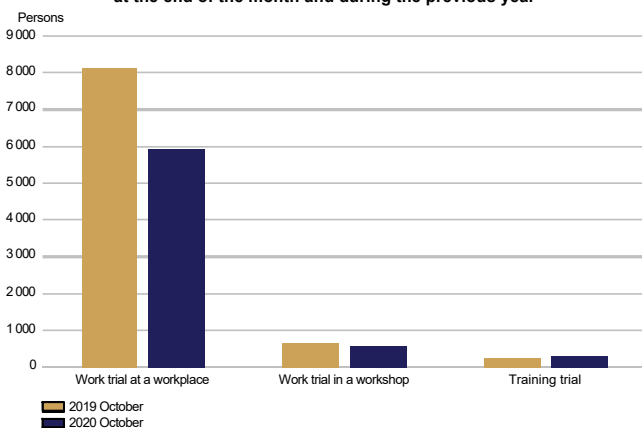
REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES

Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 21,500 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of October, which is 3,400 less than a year earlier. Of the participants, 12,100 were men and 9,400 were women. The number of men decreased by 1,800 and the number of women by 1,600 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



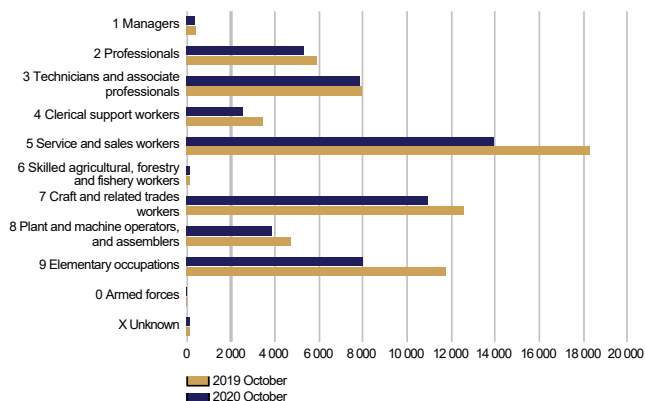
Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 6,800 participants at the end of October, which is 2,300 less than the year before. Of the participants, 3,200 were men and 3,600 were women. The number of men decreased by 1,000 and the number of women by 1,400 from the previous year.

Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during October totalled 53,000, which is 12,100 less than in October last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in October amounted to 100,600, which is 20,400 less than a year ago. A total of 8,700 of these vacancies were filled during October, 3,400 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 46,800 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 2,800 vacancies were cancelled and 1,400 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of October was 44,700, down 10,800 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had decreased in nine occupational groups. The number of new vacancies had decreased the most in the groups of service and sales workers (-4,400), elementary occupations (-3,800), craft and related trades workers (-1,600), clerical support workers (-900), and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-800). The number of new job vacancies had increased in the category of skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (20).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
