



# 357,400 unemployed jobseekers in December






A total of 357,400 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of December. This is 99,700 more than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 42,800 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 13.6% of the labour force, which is 3.8 percentage points more than the year before. In 2020, the average number of unemployed jobseekers was 342,400, or 102,000 more than the year before. The average number of unemployed people who were laid off was 77 800, or 65 400 more than the year before. Unemployed jobseekers accounted on average for 13.0% of the labour force in 2020, which is 3.8 percentage points more than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 100,000 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off increased by 56,000
- Services included in the activation rate had 3,000 less people than a year ago
- The number of new job vacancies decreased by 5,000 from last year





# The total number of jobseekers increased

At the end of December, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 690,500, up 155,200 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 358,100 were men and 332,400 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 86,100 and the number of women by 69,100.

Of the jobseekers, 206,000 were employed, 187,300 of them were on the open labour market and 18,700 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers on the open labour market increased by 48,100 from December a year earlier. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 108,300, of whom 25,300 were in services promoting employment and 61,000 in training. Of the jobseekers, 357,400 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 99,700 more than the year before. In December, 77,800 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 19,800 more than in November. The number of people fully laid off increased by 56,100 from December a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 18,800, representing an increase of 12,800 from the year before.

#### Increase in unemployed jobseekers in December

At the end of December, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 357,400, up 99,700 on the previous year. Compared with November, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 42,800. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 21,400, up 3,500 from December a year ago. In December, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 80,200, representing an increase of 24,200 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment increased by 29,900 from November. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.


The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 37,700, up 10,300 from December a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 12,200 at the end of December, up 4,600 from the year before.

In December, 77,800 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 19,800 more than in November. The number of people fully laid off increased by 56,100 from December a year earlier. In December, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 9,500, representing an increase of 5,000 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 38,800, up 24,900 from December a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs increased by 19,000 from November. The number of people fully laid off increased in all occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and sales workers (13,100), 'unknown' (10,800), craft and related trades workers (9,000), and technicians and associate professionals (5,400).


# Unemployment increased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased in December in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Uusimaa (61%), Ostrobothnia (51%), Southwest Finland (43%), Pirkanmaa (35%) and Lapland (35%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased the least in Kainuu (8%), North Karelia (19%), Southeast Finland (20%) and South Savo (22%). In the Åland Islands, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased 142%. Compared to November, the number of unemployed jobseekers also increased in the areas of all ELY Centres; the most in South Ostrobothnia (27%), Southwest Finland (23%) and Central Finland (18%).

#### Unemployed jobseekers and jobs vacant in Employment and Economic Development Office by ELY centre



# Unemployment increased more among men than women


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 207,600 (58%) were men and 149,800 (42%) were women, indicating an increase of 26,300 for men and an increase of 16,600 for women from the figures for November. Compared with December a year ago, unemployment increased by 57,300 (38%) among men and by 42,400 (39%) among women.



# Unemployment increased in all age groups

At the end of December, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 43,700, representing an increase of 10,900 from December a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from November by 7,700. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 9,500. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 127,200, representing an increase of 32,100 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 88,300, representing an increase of 22,200 on the year before. Proportionally, unemployment increased the most in the age group 25–49 (on average 44%) and those over 64 (92%). Compared with November, unemployment increased in all age groups, the most among those aged under 20 (24%) and those aged 20–24 (21%).


### Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



#### Unemployment increased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment increased from previous December at all levels of education; the increase was greatest among those with post-secondary non-tertiary education (89 %), level of education 'unknown' (58 %), lower-degree level tertiary education (56%), lowest level of tertiary education (42%), upper secondary education (41%) and higherdegree level tertiary education (41%).


#### **UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS** by occupational group



#### Unemployment increased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment increased in all groups from December last year; the most in the groups of service and sales workers (22,000), category 'unknown' (21,300) and craft and related trades workers (14,700). Unemployment increased the least in the groups of armed forces (50), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (400), and managers (1,600).

#### LONG-TERM UNEMPLOYED




#### Increase in long-term unemployment


At the end of December, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 91,900, up 28,900 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 54,800 were men and 37,100 were women. The number of men increased by 17,000 (45%) from the previous year and the number of women by 11,900 (47%). Longterm unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 36,400, which is 7,700 more than a year ago.

# Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of December, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 107,700, down 3,200 on the previous year. Compared with November, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 12,500. The activation rate at the end of December was 23.2%, which is 6.9 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.0 % of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 51,700, down 1,900 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 56,000, down 1,200 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 465,100 at the end of December. This was 96,500 more than a year earlier. The increase in broad unemployment was mainly due to an increase in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


# The number of placements fell in local government

At the end of December, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 22,600, which is 200 less than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 24% in local government jobs and 74% in the private sector. Since December last year, the number of placements has decreased by 19% in local government jobs and increased by 6% in government jobs and by 7% in the private sector. Of those employed, 50% were men. Placements for men decreased by 200, and those for women remained largely unchanged from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month




# Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of December, labour market training was attended by 20,100 students, up 1,600 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,700 were men and 10,500 were women. The number of men increased by 500, and the number of women by 1,100 from December last year. During December, 2,000 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 200 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,600), which is 600 more than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




# The number of persons in training increased

At the end of December, 3,600 persons were in training, which is 1,300 more than the year before. Of those in training, 1,900 were men and 1,700 women. Career coaching had 3,100 participants, which is 1,400 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training was 500, representing a decrease of 100 on the year before.

# The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 32,700 people, representing a decrease of 2,300 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 13,400, down 1,200 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 19,300, representing a decrease of 1,100 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 9,400 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 800 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector




# The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,100 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of December, which is 200 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,100 were men and 2,000 were women. The number of both men and women decreased by 100 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




# Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 20,300 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of December, which is 2,000 less than a year earlier. Of the participants, 11,600 were men and 8,700 were women. The number of men decreased by 1,100 and the number of women by 900 from the previous year.

# Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 5,300 participants at the end of December, which is 1,300 less than the year before. Of the participants, 2,700 were men and 2,600 were women. The number of men decreased by 500 and the number of women by 700 from the previous year.

# Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during December totalled 50,400, which is 5,000 less than in December the previous year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices in December amounted to 92,800, which is 11,200 less than a year ago. A total of 6,500 of these vacancies were filled during December, 2,200 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 37,700 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,800 vacancies were cancelled and 1,200 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of December was 47,200, down 6,900 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had decreased in seven occupational groups. The number of new vacancies had decreased the most in the groups of elementary occupations (-2,300), craft and related trades workers (-1,700), and service and sales workers (-1,300). The number of new vacancies had increased the most in the groups of technicians and associate professionals (800) and professionals (100).

### Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
