



In May, 301,200 unemployed jobseekers






At the end of May, a total of 301,200 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 131,500 less than a year earlier, but 74,600 more than in May two years ago. The number of unemployed jobseekers was down by 17,200 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 11.4% of the labour force, which is 5.1 percentage points less than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

- The number of people fully laid off decreased by 117,000
- Services included in the activation rate had 8,000 more people than a year ago
- 36,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year


The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of May, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 642,700, down 126,000 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 324,600 were men and 318,000 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 55,800 and the number of women by 70,200. Of the jobseekers, 232,100 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

Of the jobseekers, 216,700 were employed, 195,600 of them were on the open labour market and 21,100 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of job seekers on the open labour market increased by 9,300 from May a year earlier. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 109,900, of whom 25,900 were in services promoting employment and 63,600 in training. Of the jobseekers, 301,200 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 131,500 less than the year before. In May, 41,200 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 12,700 less than in April. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 117,000 from May a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 14,900, representing a decrease of 8,300 from the year before.

Unemployed jobseekers



At the end of May, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 301,200, down 131,500 on the previous year. Compared with April, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 17,200. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 154,500 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 10,200, down 12,100 from May a year ago. In May, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 38,800, representing a decrease of 58,300 on the year before. The number of






Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by more than 25% in May in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in South Ostrobothnia (-44 %), Ostrobothnia (-40 %), Pirkanmaa (-36 %) and North Savo (-35 %). The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased the least in Uusimaa (-26 %), Central Finland (-26 %) and Häme (-28 %). The number of unemployed jobseekers fell the most in Åland, by 46%. Compared to April, the number of unemployed jobseekers also decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres; the most in South Ostrobothnia (-11 %), South Savo (-10 %), Satakunta (-10 %) and Kainuu (-9 %).

Unemployment decreased more among women than men


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 170,400 (57 %) were men and 130,700 (43 %) were women, indicating a decrease of 11,900 for men and a decrease of 5,300 for women from the figures for April. Compared with May a year ago, unemployment decreased by 58,300 (-25 %) among men and by 73,200 (-36 %) among women.

Unemployment decreased in all age groups under the age of 65

At the end of May, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 36,100, representing a decrease of 20,200 from May a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from April by 2,500. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 6,900. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 110,500, representing a decrease of 31,200 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 79,000, representing a decrease of 15,100 on the year before. Unemployment decreased the most among those between 20 and 29 (-36 %) and those between 40 and 44 (-35 %). Among those over 64, unemployment increased by 2 % from the previous year. Compared with April, unemployment decreased in all age groups; the most among those between 20 and 24 (-7%) and those between 50 and 54 and those between 25 and 29 (-6%).


Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from May last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower-degree level tertiary education (-44 %), post-secondary non-tertiary education (-40 %) lowest level of tertiary education (-37 %) and higher-degree level tertiary education (-36 %). Unemployment fell the least among those with higher level basic qualifications (-17 %), doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-20 %) and lower level basic qualifications (-20 %).

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from May last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-34,900), 'unknown' (-30,400), professionals (-15,100) and technicians and associate professionals (-14,900). Unemployment decreased the least in the groups of armed forces (-10), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-700) and managers (-1,700).



Increase in long-term unemployment

At the end of May, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 110,900, up 41,100 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 66,000 were men and 44,900 were women. The number of men increased by 24,400 (59%) from the previous year and the number of women by 16,700 (59%). The number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 42,200, which is 11,700 more than a year ago.



Services




Increase in the number of persons in services

At the end of May, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 113,400, up 7,800 on the previous year. Compared with April, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 3,600. Of those covered by services, 59,900 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The activation rate at the end of May was 27.4 %, which is 7.8 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.0 % of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 54,900, up 4,000 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 58,600, up 3,700 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 414,600 at the end of May. This is 123,800 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to a decrease in the number of unemployed.

 04 Other(private person)


The number of placements increased particularly in the private sector

At the end of May, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 27,600, which is 6,300 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2 % were in government jobs, 26 % in local government jobs and 72 % in the private sector. Since May last year, the number of placements has increased by 14 % in government jobs, by 23 % in local government jobs and by 33 % in the private sector. Of those employed, 53% were men. Placements for men increased by 3,600, and those for women by 2,700 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month




Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of May, labour market training was attended by 22,400 students, up 2,400 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,600 were men and 11,800 were women. The number of men increased by 700, and the number of women by 1,700 from May last year. During May, 3,800 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 600 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,300), which is 700 more than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of May, 2,500 persons were in training, which is 1,500 less than the year before. Of those in training, 1,200 were men and 1,200 women. Career coaching was provided to 1,900 participants, which is 1,100 less than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 400 from the year before.

The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 31,500 people, representing a decrease of 3,300 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 12,700, down 1,700 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 18,800, also representing a decrease of 1,700 on the year before.



AS A JOB ALTERNATION SUBSTITUTE



The number of job alternation substitutes remained the same

A total of 3,500 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of May, which is 100 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,300 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of men increased by almost 50 and the number of women increased by close to 100 from the previous year.


REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES at the end of the month and during the previous year



More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 19,800 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of May, which is 2,200 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 11,200 were men and 8,600 were women. The number of men increased by 1,400 and the number of women by 700 from the previous year.

Participation in work and training trials increased

Work and training trials had a total of 6,200 participants at the end of May, which is 1,600 more than the previous year. Of the participants, 3,100 were men and 3,000 were women. The number of men increased by 800 from the previous year and the number of women also increased by 800.

Increase in the number of new vacancies from the year before

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during May totalled 80,800, which is 35,700 more than in May last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in May amounted to 154,800, which is 57,900 more than a year ago. A total of 12,500 of these vacancies were filled during May, 3,700 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 70,000 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 4,400 vacancies were cancelled and 2,000 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of May was 71,200, up 24,100 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased in almost all occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and sales workers (10,300), craft and related trades workers (7,000), elementary occupations (5,800), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (5,300), professionals (3,300) and technicians and associate professionals (2,800). The number of new vacancies decreased only in the group of skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-400).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year.
