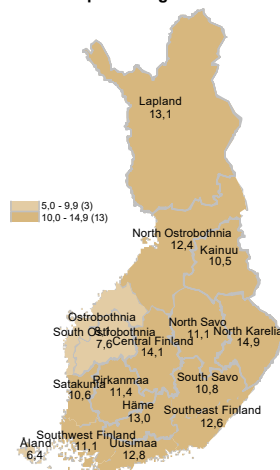

## In June, 316,200 unemployed jobseekers

Unemployed jobseekers' percentage of the workforce by ELY centre



At the end of June, a total of 316,200 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 100,700 less than a year earlier, but 62,000 more than in June two years ago. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 15,100 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 12.0% of the labour force, which is 3.8 percentage points less than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

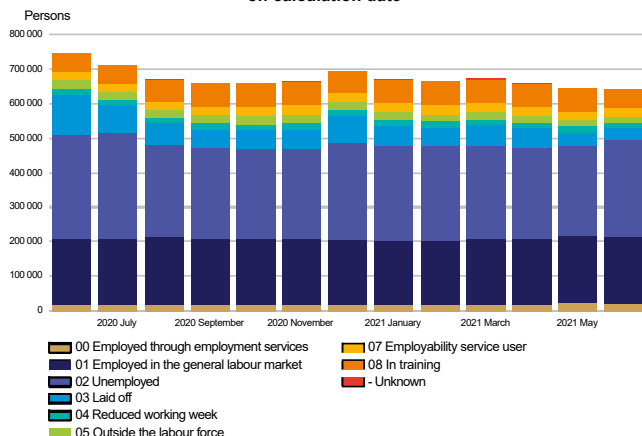

### The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of June, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 641,800, down 105,000 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 320,500 were men and 321,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 48,300 and the number of women by 56,700. Of the jobseekers, 238,700 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

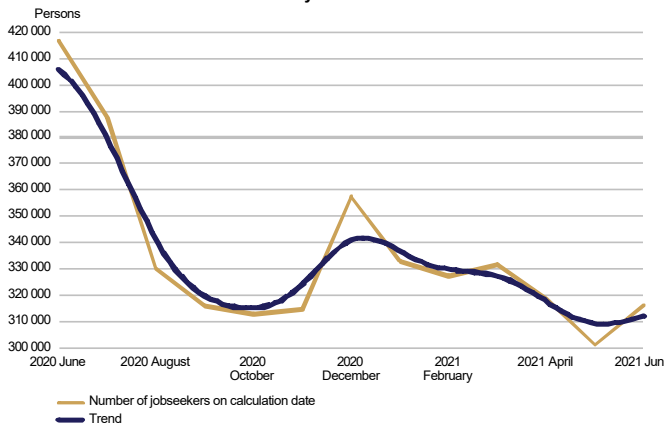
Of the jobseekers, 214,700 were employed, 193,400 of them were on the open labour market and 21,300 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of jobseekers on the open labour market increased by 2,200 from June a year earlier. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 97,800, of whom 24,000 in services promoting employment and 53,900 were in training. Of the jobseekers, 316,200 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 100,700 less than the year before. In June, 34,100 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 7,100 less than in May. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 82,800 from June a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 13,100, representing a decrease of 7,500 from the year before.

monthly and trend

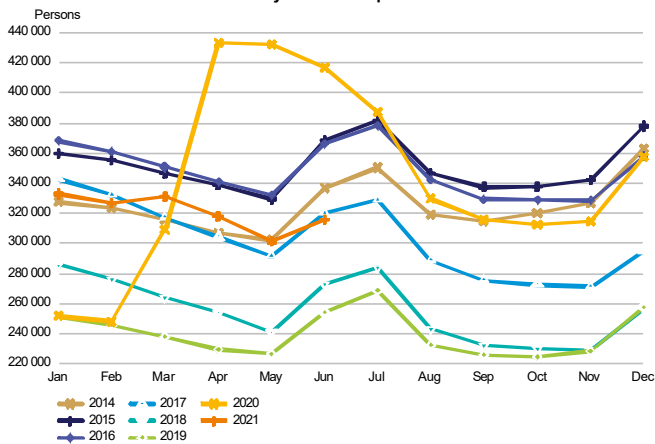


### Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in June

At the end of June, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 316,200, down 100,700 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 15,100. Typical of the summer period, the increase was brought about by the entry into the labour market of the young graduates from various education institutions and termination of certain fixed-term employment contracts for the summer months. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 163,500 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 17,800, down 10,000 from June a year ago. In June, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 59,600, representing a decrease of 37,900 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment increased by 20,800 from May. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 37,600, down 5,100 from June a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 10,900 at the end of June, down 1,600 from the year before.

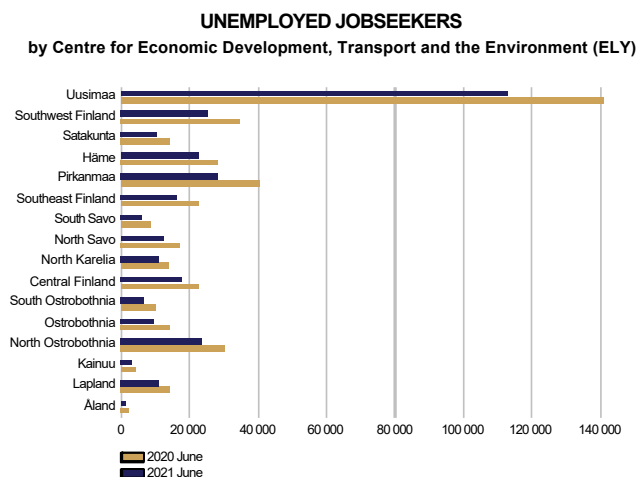
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS**

In June, 34,100 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 7,100 less than in May. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 82,800 from June a year earlier. In June, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 1,600, representing a decrease of 7,600 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 7,000, down 41,500 from June a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs decreased by 600 from May. The number of fully laid off people decreased in all groups; the most in the groups of 'unknown' (-19,000), service and sales workers (-18,500), professionals (-11,200), technicians and associate professionals (-9,100) and craft and related trades workers (-7,800).



## Unemployed jobseekers by region



### Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in June in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Ostrobothnia (-35 %), South Ostrobothnia (-33 %) and Pirkanmaa (-30 %). The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased the least in Uusimaa (-20 %), Häme (-21 %) and Central Finland (-21 %). The number of unemployed jobseekers fell the most in Åland, by 50%. Compared to May, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased in the areas of all ELY Centres; the most in Ostrobothnia (11 %), North Ostrobothnia (9 %), North Karelia (8 %), South Ostrobothnia (8 %) and Central Finland (8 %). In Åland, the number of unemployed jobseekers fell compared to May (-11 %).

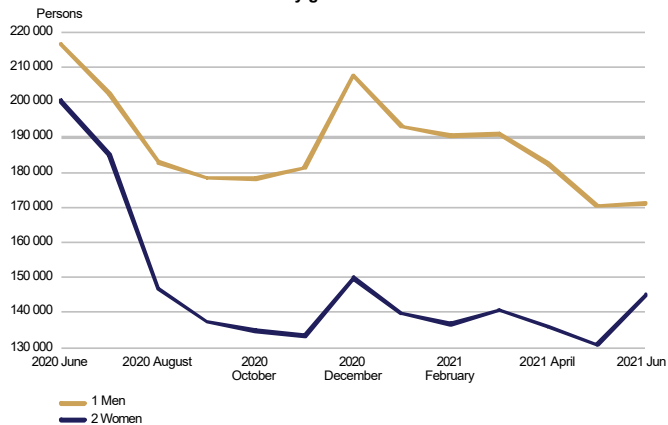

## Unemployed jobseekers by gender and age-group

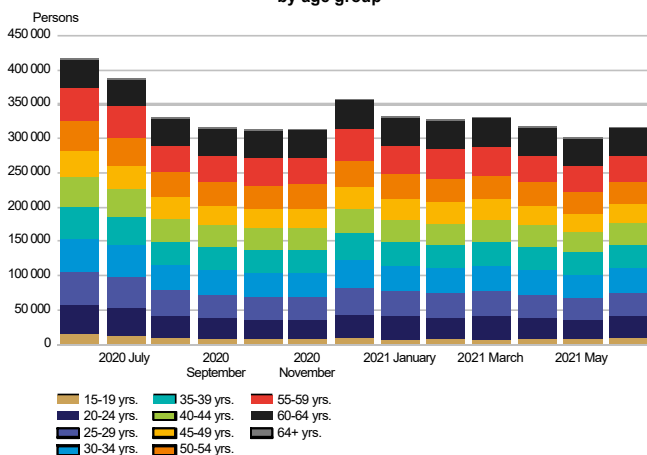
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

### Unemployment decreased more among women than men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 171,200 (54 %) were men and 145,000 (46 %) were women, indicating an increase of 800 for men and 14,200 for women from the figures for May. Compared with June a year ago, unemployment decreased by 45,200 (-21%) among men and by 55,400 (-28 %) among women.

by age group**



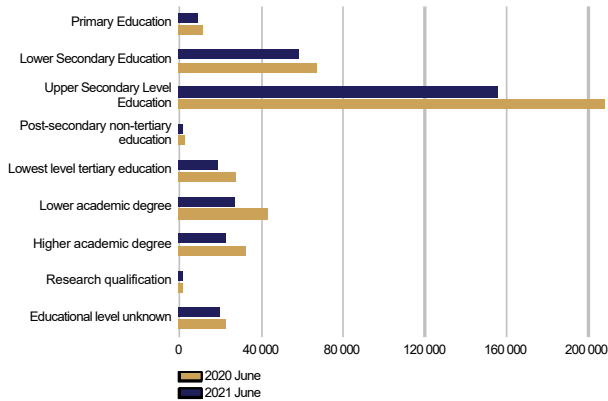
### Unemployment decreased in all age groups under the age of 65

At the end of June, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 40,400, representing a decrease of 18,400 from June a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from May by 4,300. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 9,500. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 111,600, representing a decrease of 23,000 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 79,500, representing a decrease of 10,600 on the year before. Unemployment decreased the most among those under 25 (-31 %), those between 25 and 29 (-28 %) and those between 50 and 54 (-28 %). Among those over 64, unemployment increased by 8 % from the previous year. Compared with May, unemployment increased in all age groups; the most among those between 15 and 19 (38 %) and those between 25 and 29 (7 %).

### Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from June last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower-degree level tertiary education (-37 %), post-secondary non-tertiary education (-31 %), lowest level of tertiary education (-30 %) and higher-degree level tertiary education (-29 %). Unemployment fell the least among those with higher level basic qualifications (-13 %), level of education 'unknown' (-15 %) and doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-16 %).

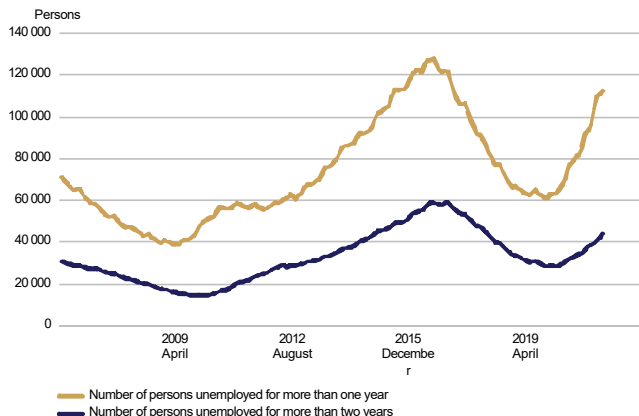
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

### Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from June last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of 'unknown' (-25,900), service and sales workers (-23,300), professionals (-13,100) and technicians and associate professionals (-10,900). Unemployment decreased the least in the groups of armed forces (-10), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-600) and managers (-1,500).

at the end of the month**

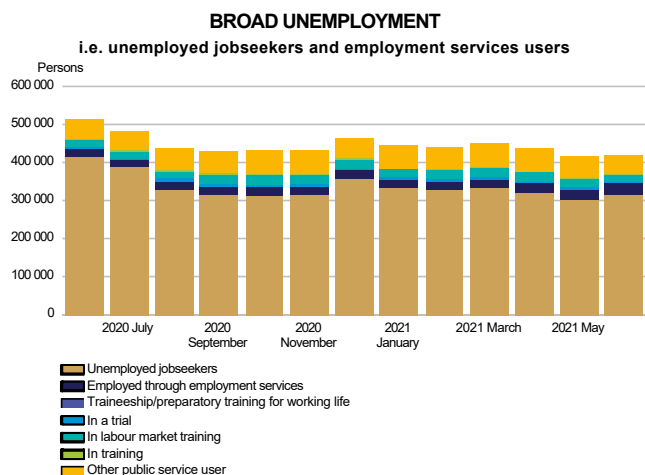


### Increase in long-term unemployment

At the end of June, the number of long-term unemployed who have been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 112,400, up 37,300 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 66,300 were men and 46,100 were women. The number of men increased by 22,100 (50 %) from the previous year and the number of women by 15,200 (49 %). The number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 43,900, which is 12,300 more than a year ago.



## Services

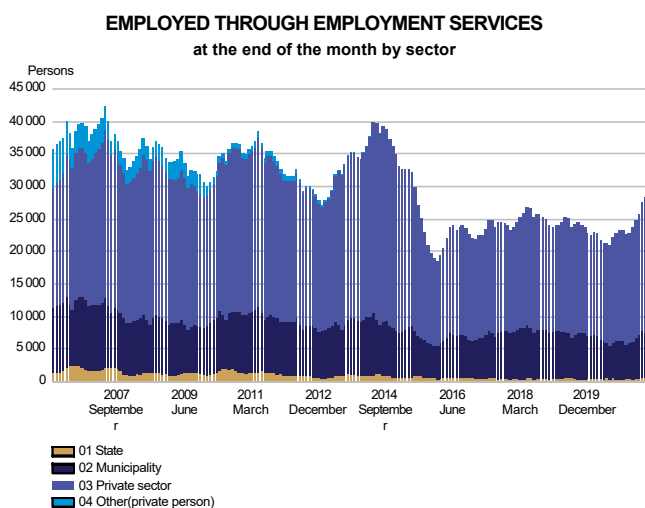


### Increase in the number of persons in services

At the end of June, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 104,000, up 5,600 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 9,500. Of those covered by services, 54,400 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The activation rate at the end of June was 24.7 %, which is 5.6 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 3.6 % of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 51,000, up 2,300 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 52,900, up 3,300 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 420,200 at the end of June. This is 95,000 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to a decrease in the number of unemployed.



### The number of placements increased particularly in the private sector

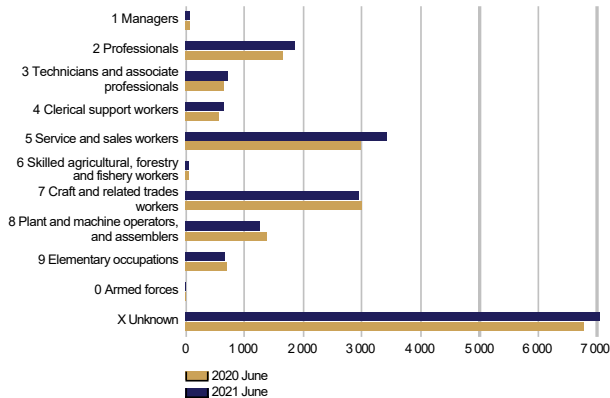
At the end of June, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 28,300, which is 7,000 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 25 % in local government jobs and 73 % in the private sector. Since June last year, the number of placements has increased by 11 % in government jobs, by 30 % in local government jobs and by 35 % in the private sector. Of those employed, 54% were men. Placements for men increased by 3,700, and those for women by 3,300 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month

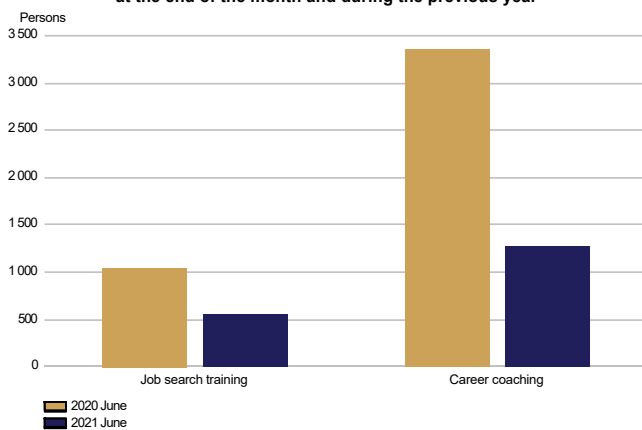


### Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of June, labour market training was attended by 18,700 students, up 1,000 on the previous year. Of the students, 8,800 were men and 9,800 were women. The number of men increased by 100, and the number of women by 900 from June last year. During June, 1,700 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 1,000 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,700), which is 400 more than the year before.

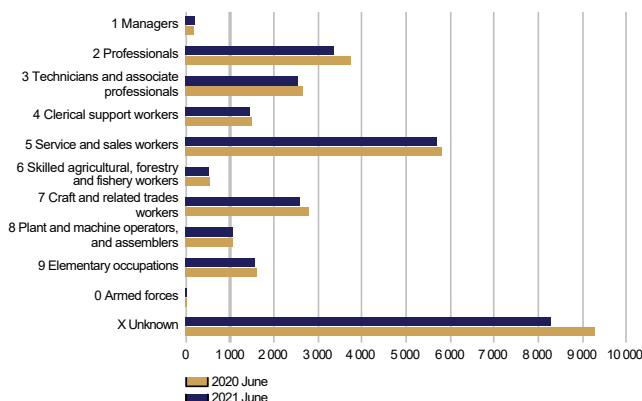
**IN TRAINING**

### The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of June, 1,800 persons were in training, which is 2,600 less than the year before. Of those in training, 900 were men and 900 women. Career coaching was provided to 1,300 participants, which is 2,100 less than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 500 from the year before.

in person's profession at the end of the month



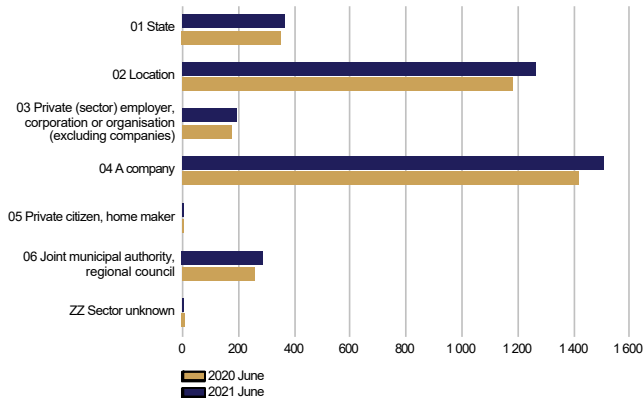
### The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 27,300 people, representing a decrease of 1,900 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 11,000, down 1,100 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 16,300, representing a decrease of 800 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 7,300 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 800 on the previous year.

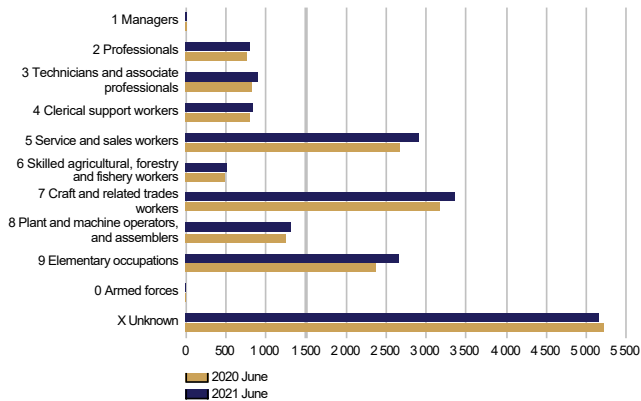
**AS A JOB ALTERNATION SUBSTITUTE**

### The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,600 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of June, which is 200 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,300 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 100 from the previous year.

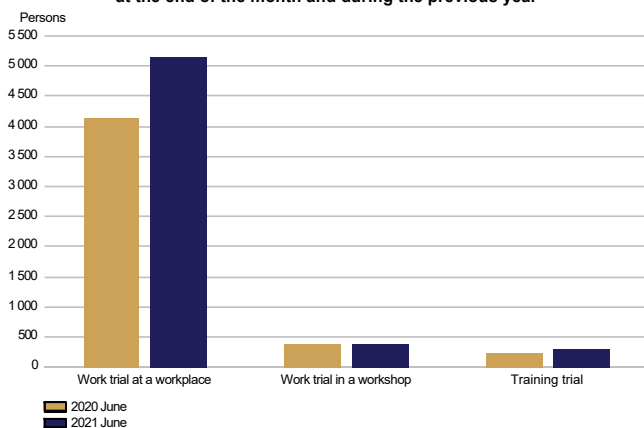
**REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES**

### More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 18,400 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of June, which is 900 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 10,600 were men and 7,800 were women. The number of men increased by 400 and the number of women by 500 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



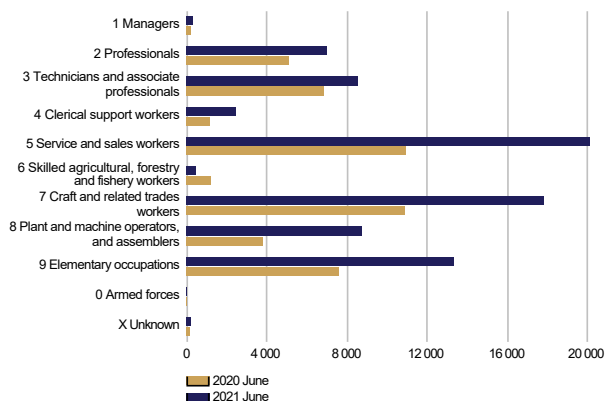
### Participation in work and training trials increased

Work and training trials had a total of 5,800 participants at the end of June, which is 1,000 more than the previous year. Of the participants, 3,100 were men and 2,700 were women. The number of men increased by 500 from the previous year and the number of women increased by 600.



## Jobs vacant

### Increase in the number of new vacancies from the year before

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during June totalled 79,000, which is 31,300 more than in June last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in June amounted to 145,300, which is 52,300 more than a year ago. A total of 10,000 of these vacancies were filled during June, 2,900 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 67,700 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 3,700 vacancies were cancelled and 1,700 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of June was 64,500, up 24,700 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased in almost all occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and sales workers (9,200), craft and related trades workers (6,900), elementary occupations (5,800), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (5,000) and professionals (2,000). The number of new vacancies decreased only in the groups of skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-800) and armed forces (-10).

## Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
