



In August 281,000 unemployed jobseekers






At the end of August, a total of 281,000 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 48,700 less than a year earlier, but 48,400 more than in August two years ago. The number of unemployed jobseekers was down by 41,500 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 10.7% of the labour force, which is 1.8 percentage points less than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- Total number of jobseekers decreased by 63,000
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 49,000 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off decreased by 36,000
- Services included in the activation rate had the same number of people than a year ago
- 35,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year




The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of August, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 606,800, down 63,100 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 305,700 were men and 301,000 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 33,200 and the number of women by 29,900. Of the jobseekers, 234,600 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

Of the jobseekers, 212,900 were employed, 191,300 of them were on the open labour market and 21,600 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 101,700, of whom 22,200 were in services promoting employment and 60,100 in training. Of the jobseekers, 281,000 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 48,700 less than the year before. In August, 24,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 7,800 less than in July. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 36,400 from August a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 11,100, representing a decrease of 5,700 from the year before.

Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in August

At the end of August, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 281,000, down 48,700 on the previous year. Compared with July, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 41,500. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 150,500 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 10,900, down 3,900 from August a year ago. In August, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 33,300, representing a decrease of 20,800 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment decreased by 2,500 from July. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.


The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 33,800, down 1,000 from August last year. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 10,000 at the end of August, down 500 from the year before.

In August, 24,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 7,800 less than in July. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 36,400 from August a year earlier. In August, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 1,200, representing a decrease of 3,300 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 4,700, down 17,500 from August a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs decreased by 2,000 from July. The number of people fully laid off decreased in all occupational groups; the greatest decreases were in the groups of 'unknown' (-8,700), service and sales workers (-5,500), professionals (-5,300), craft and related trades workers (-4,900), and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-3,800).


Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in August in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Ostrobothnia (-30%), South Ostrobothnia (-24%) and Pirkanmaa (-23%). The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased the least in Kainuu (-8%), Central Finland (-9%), Häme (-10%) and Uusimaa (-10%). The number of unemployed jobseekers fell the most in Åland, by -46%. Compared to July, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres; the most in Ostrobothnia (-23%), South Ostrobothnia (-18%) and North Ostrobothnia (-17%). The number of unemployed jobseekers fell the least in Uusimaa (-11%), compared with July.

Unemployed jobseekers and jobs vacant in Employment and Economic Development Office by ELY centre



Unemployment decreased more among women than men


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 157,800 (56%) were men and 123,300 (44%) were women, indicating a decrease of 13,700 for men and 27,900 for women from the figures for July. Compared with August a year ago, unemployment decreased by 25,200 (-14%) among men and by 23,500 (-16%) among women.



Unemployment decreased in all age groups under the age of 60

At the end of August, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 32,800, representing a decrease of 9,200 from August a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from July by 7,500. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 6,900. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 105,200, representing a decrease of 10,100 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 76,100, representing a decrease of 3,500 on the year before. Unemployment decreased the most among those under 30 (-20%) and those between 50 and 54 (-19%). Unemployment rose from the previous year only among those over 59 years of age; the most among those over 64 (26%). Compared with July, unemployment fell in all age groups; the most among those under 30 (-18%).


Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from August last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower-degree level tertiary education (-24%), higher-degree level tertiary education (-22%), lowest level of tertiary education (-18%) and postsecondary non-tertiary education (-17 %). Unemployment fell the least among those with level of education 'unknown' (-3%), higher level basic qualifications (-6 %), and doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-10%).

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased for all groups from August of last year; the greatest decreases were in the groups of 'unknown' (-12,400), service and sales workers (-8,400), professionals (-7,300), craft and related trades workers (-6,900) and associate professionals and technicians (-5,100). Unemployment decreased the least in the groups of armed forces (-2), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-400) and managers (-600).

LONG-TERM UNEMPLOYED



Increase in long-term unemployment

At the end of August, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 111,800, up 32,900 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 66,300 were men and 45,500 were women. The number of men increased by 19,700 (42%) from the previous year and the number of women by 13,200 (41%). The number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 45,700, which is 12,900 more than a year ago.



Services




Slight decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of August, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 105,900, down 100 on the previous year. Compared with July, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 8,100. Of those covered by services, 56,400 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The activation rate at the end of August was 27.4%, which is 3.1 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 3.8% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by these services, the number of men was 50,900, down 700 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 55,000, up 600 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 386,900 at the end of August. This is 48,800 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to a decrease in the number of unemployed.

 03 Private sector 04 Other(private person)


The number of placements increased particularly in local government and the private sector

At the end of August, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 28,600, which is 6,400 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 25% in local government jobs and 73% in the private sector. Since August last year, the number of placements has increased by 7% in government jobs, by 34% in local government jobs and by 28% in the private sector. Of those employed, 54% were men. Placements for men increased by 3,500, and those for women by 2,900 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month




Number of persons in labour market training remains unchanged

At the end of August, labour market training was attended by 19,400 students, which is unchanged from the previous year. Of the students, 9,000 were men and 10,400 were women. The number of men decreased by 300, and the number of women rose by close to 400 from August last year. During August, 5,900 new students began labour market training, representing an decrease of 1,200 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,800), which is the same as the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of August, 1,600 persons were in training, which is 2,700 less than the year before. Of those in training, 800 were men and 800 women. Career coaching was provided to 1,100 participants, which is 2,600 less than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 200 from the year before.

The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 29,600 people, representing a decrease of 3,200 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 11,600, down 1,800 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 18,000, representing a decrease of 1,500 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 8,400 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 1,400 on the previous year.

The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,800 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of August, which is 500 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,400 were men and 2,400 were women. The number of men increased by 200 and the number of women by 300 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 17,800 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of August, which is 1,000 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 10,100 were men and 7,700 were women. The number of men decreased by 800 and the number of women by 200 from the previous year.

Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 5,000 participants at the end of August, which is 100 less than the year before. Of the participants, 2,500 were men and 2,500 were women. The number of men fell by 100 and the number of women remained unchanged from the previous year.

Increase in the number of new vacancies from the year before

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during August totalled 90,100, which is 34,500 more than in August last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in August amounted to 155,300, which is 56,700 more than a year ago. A total of 11,500 of these vacancies were filled during August, 2,900 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 64,800 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 4,900 vacancies were cancelled and 2,000 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of August was 75,800, up 28,300 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased in all occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and sales workers (8,500), craft and related trades workers (7,200), elementary occupations (6,200), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (5,500) and associate professionals and technicians (2,300).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
