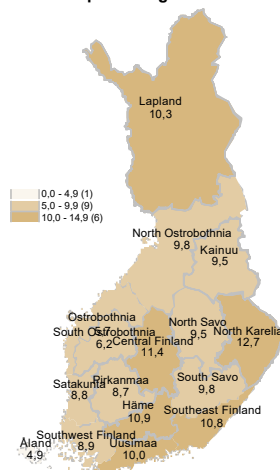

## 252,700 unemployed jobseekers in November

Unemployed jobseekers' percentage of the workforce by ELY centre



At the end of November, a total of 252,700 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 61,800 less than a year earlier, but 24,100 more than in November two years ago. The number of unemployed jobseekers was down by 6,300 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.6% of the labour force, which is 2.4 percentage points less than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

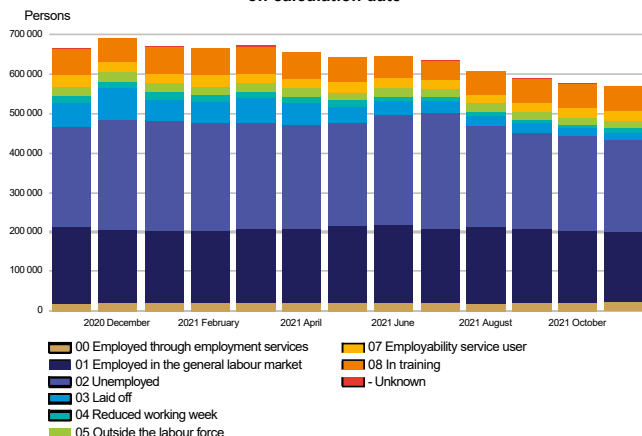

### The total number of jobseekers decreased

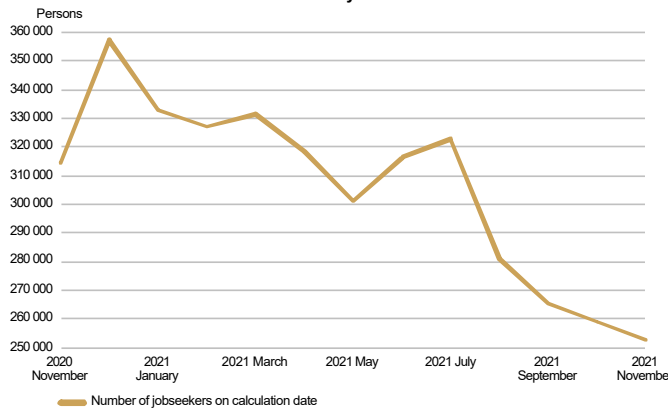
At the end of November, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 568,900, down 94,100 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 288,600 were men and 280,400 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 51,100 and the number of women by 43,000. Of the jobseekers, 230,100 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

Of the jobseekers, 199,700 were employed, 177,800 of them were on the open labour market and 21,800 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 107,300, of whom 26,400 were in services promoting employment and 61,800 in training. Of the jobseekers, 252,700 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 61,800 less than the year before. In November, 18,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,100 less than in October. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 39,300 from November a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 9,200, representing a decrease of 9,200 from the year before.

monthly

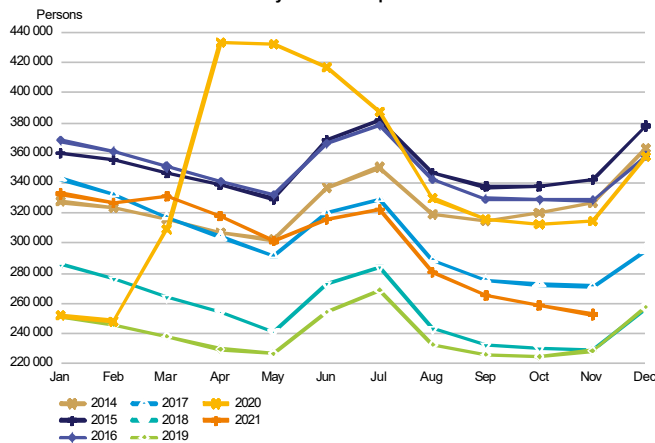


### Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in November

At the end of November, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 252,700, down 61,800 on the previous year. Compared with October, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 6,300. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 134,900 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 11,600, down 3,800 from November a year ago. In November, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 32,400, representing a decrease of 17,900 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment decreased by 3,300 from October. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 29,000, down 3,300 from November a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 8,900 at the end of November, down 1,700 from the year before.

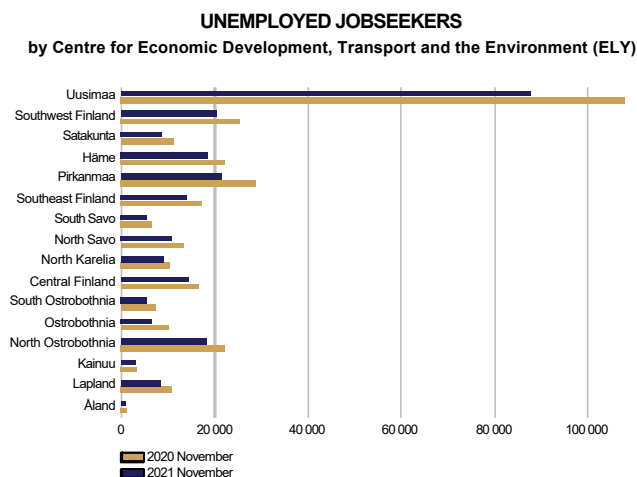
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS**

In November, 18,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,100 less than in October. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 39,300 from November a year earlier. In November, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 2,200, representing a decrease of 3,200 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 5,300, down 14,500 from November a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs decreased by 500 from October. The number of people fully laid off decreased in all occupational groups, with the exception of armed forces. The greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-7,800), 'unknown' (-7,700), craft and related trades workers (-6,400), professionals (-4,300), and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-4,100).

### Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in November in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Ostrobothnia (-36%), Pirkanmaa (-26%), South Ostrobothnia (-25%), Satakunta (-23%) and Lapland (-23%). The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased the least in Kainuu (-12%), Central Finland (-14%), North Karelia (-15%), South Savo (-15%) and Häme (-15%). The number of unemployed jobseekers fell the most in Åland, by 45%. Compared with October, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in the areas of eight ELY centres, the most in Lapland (-6%) and Uusimaa (-5%). The number of unemployed jobseekers increased the most in South Ostrobothnia (3%) and Kainuu (2%) from October.

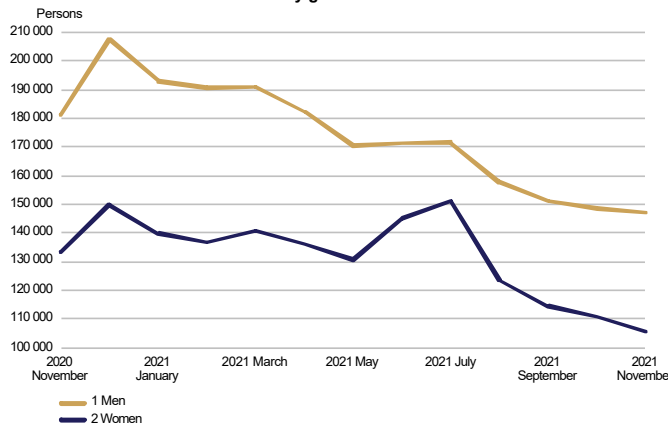

## Unemployed jobseekers by gender and age-group

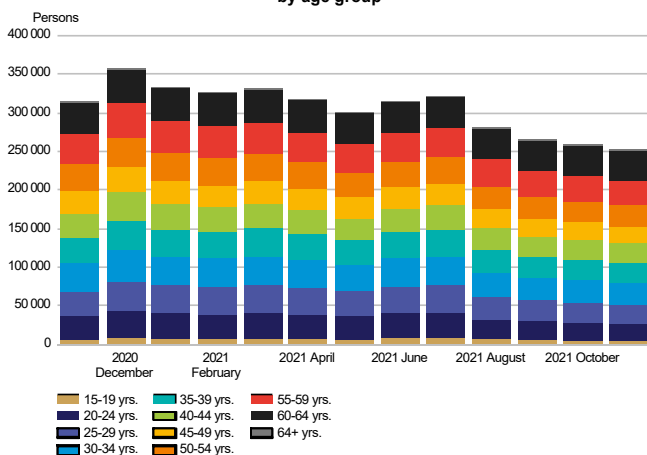
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

### Unemployment decreased more among women than men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 147,100 (58%) were men and 105,600 (42%) were women, indicating a decrease of 1,300 for men and a decrease of 5,000 for women from the figures for October. Compared with November a year ago, unemployment decreased by 34,200 (-19%) among men and by 27,600 (-21%) among women.

by age group**



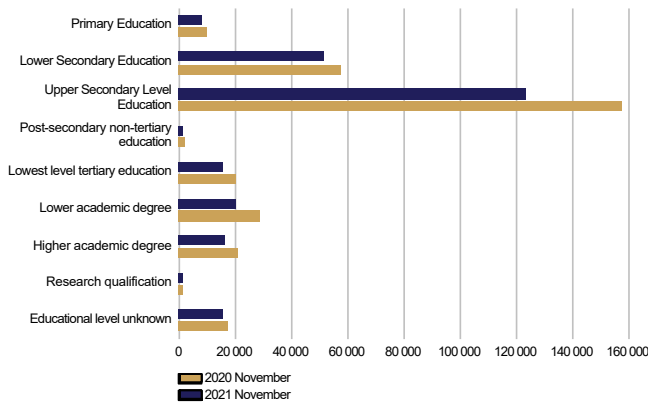
### Unemployment decreased in all age groups under the age of 65

At the end of November, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 26,500, representing a decrease of 9,500 from November a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from October by 1,300. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 5,200. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 99,800, representing a decrease of 16,100 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 73,300, representing a decrease of 7,800 on the year before. Unemployment decreased the most among those under 30 (-25%) and those between 50 and 54 (-24%). Unemployment rose from the previous year only among those over 64 years of age (11%). Compared with October, unemployment fell in all age groups, with the exception of those between 60 and 64 years where the figure was unchanged. Unemployment fell the most among those under 30 (-5%).



## Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group

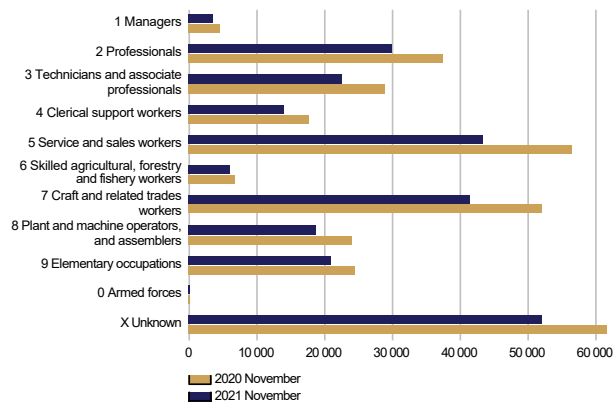
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

### Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from November last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower-degree level tertiary education (-28%), post-secondary non-tertiary education (-25%), higher-degree level tertiary education (-24%) and lowest level of tertiary education (-23%). Unemployment fell the least among those with higher level basic qualifications (-10%), level of education 'unknown' (-11%) and doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (-14%).

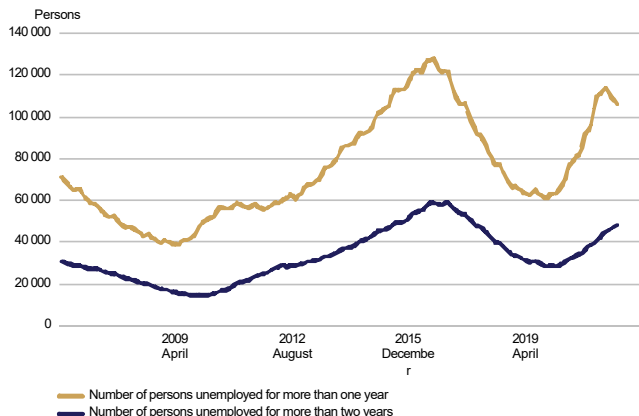
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

### Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from November last year; the most in the groups of service and sales workers (-13,300), craft and related trades workers (-10,700), 'unknown' (-9,600), professionals (-7,500) and technicians and associate professionals (-6,400). Unemployment decreased the least in the groups of armed forces (-11), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-500) and managers (-800).

at the end of the month**

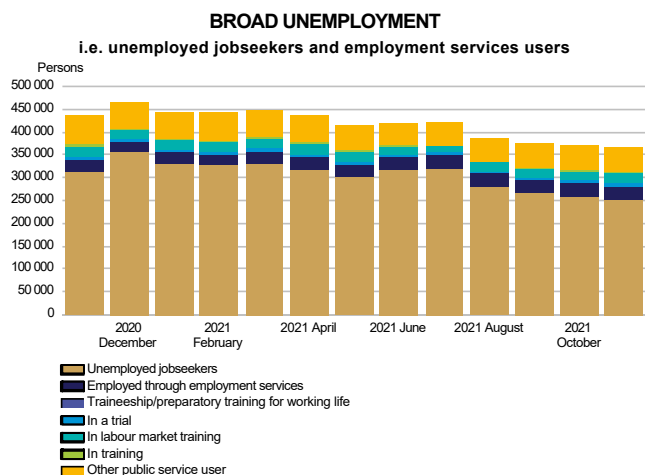


### Increase in long-term unemployment

At the end of November, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 106,200, up 20,900 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 63,600 were men and 42,600 were women. The number of men increased by 12,500 (25%) from the previous year and the number of women by 8,400 (24%). The number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 48,300, which is 13,300 more than a year ago.



## Services

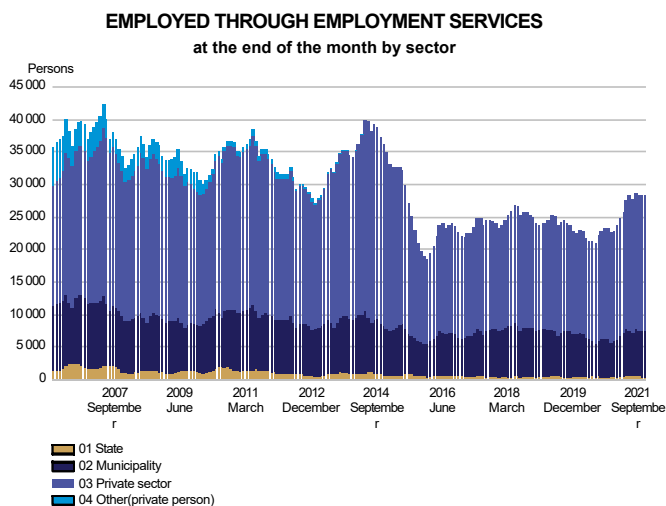


### Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of November, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 115,000, down 5,200 on the previous year. Compared with October, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 2,300. Of those covered by services, 62,200 were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The activation rate at the end of November was 31.3 %, which is 3.7 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.2% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 54,500, down 2,700 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 60,500, down 2,500 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 367,700 at the end of November. This is 67,000 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to a decrease in the number of unemployed.



### The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

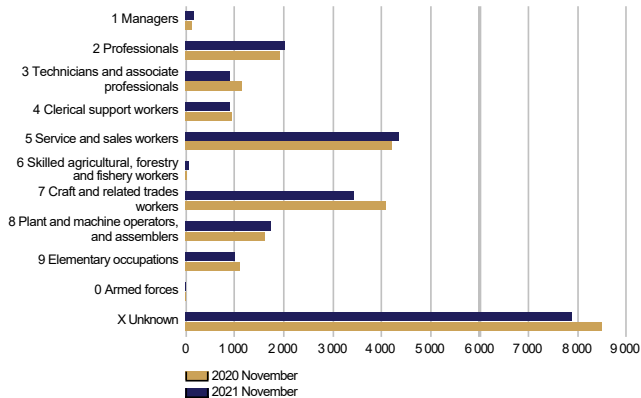
At the end of November, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, placed in employment in central government or receiving start-up grants totalled 28,500, which is 5,100 more than the year before. Of those in placements, 2% were in central government jobs, 25% in local government jobs and 73% in the private sector. Since November last year, the number of placements had increased by 24% in local government and 22% in the private sector. Placements in central government decreased by 6%. Of those employed, 52% were men. Placements for men increased by 2,800, and those for women by 2,300 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month

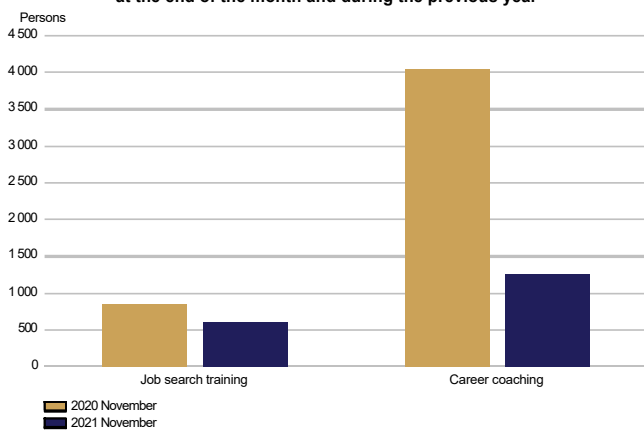


### Number of persons in labour market training decreased

At the end of November, labour market training was attended by 22,300 students, down 1,300 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,500 were men and 11,800 were women. The number of men decreased by 700, and the number of women by 600 from November last year. During November, 5,100 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 100 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,000), which is 600 less than the year before.

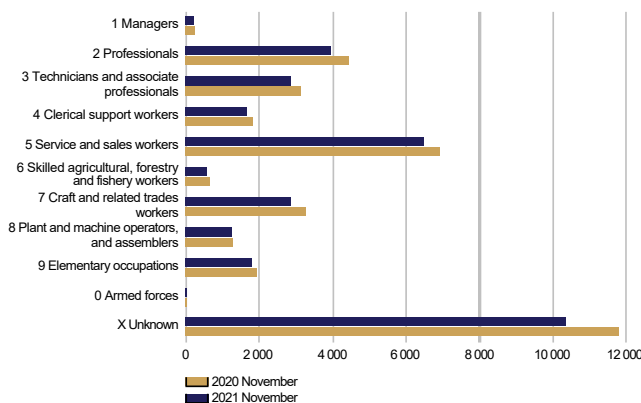
**IN TRAINING**

### The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of November, 1,900 persons were in training, which is 3,000 less than the year before. Of those in training, 1,000 were men and 900 were women. Career coaching was provided to 1,300 participants, which is 2,800 less than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 300 from the year before.

in person's profession at the end of the month



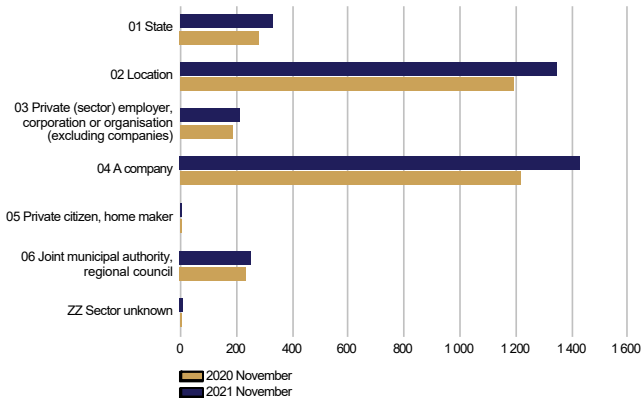
### The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 31,900 people, representing a decrease of 3,600 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 12,500, down 1,900 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 19,400, representing a decrease of 1,700 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 9,200 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 1,100 on the previous year.

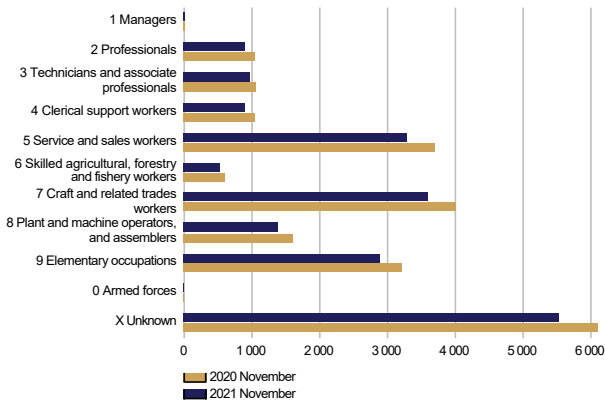
**AS A JOB ALTERNATION SUBSTITUTE**

### The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,600 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of November, which is 500 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,300 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of men increased by 200 and the number of women by 300 from the previous year.

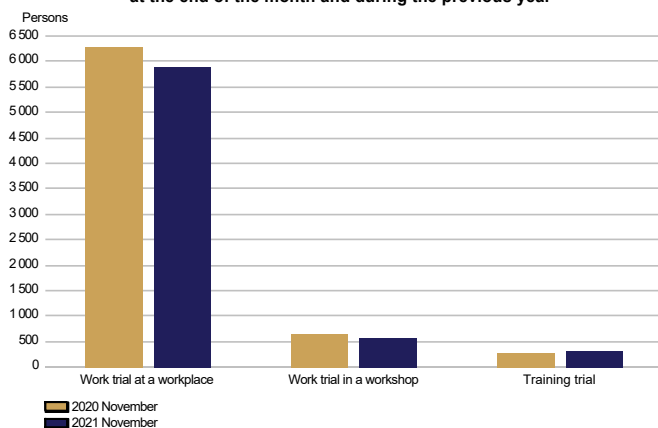
**REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES**

### Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 20,000 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of November, which is 2,400 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 11,200 were men and 8,800 were women. The number of men decreased by 1,400 and the number of women by 1,000 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



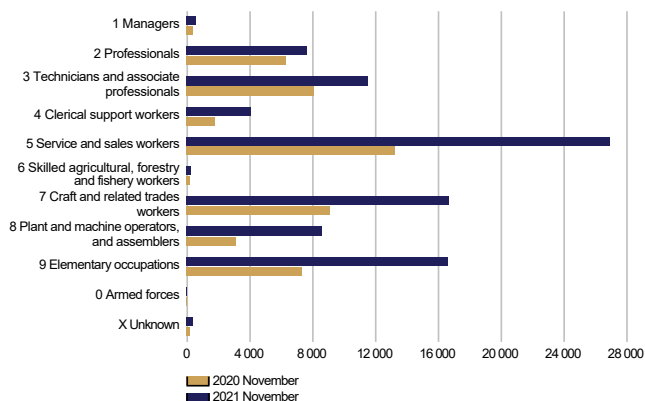
### Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 6,800 participants at the end of November, which is 400 less than the year before. Of the participants, 3,300 were men and 3,500 were women. The number of men decreased by 100 and the number of women by 300 from the previous year.



## Jobs vacant

### Increase in the number of new vacancies from the year before

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during November totalled 93,100, which is 43,700 more than in November last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in November amounted to 168,100, which is 76,800 more than a year ago. A total of 12,100 of these vacancies were filled during November, 3,000 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 74,900 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 5,700 vacancies were cancelled and 2,100 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of November was 77,100, up 32,700 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for all occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of service and sales workers (13,800), elementary occupations (9,200), craft and related trades workers (7,600), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (5,400) and associate professionals and technicians (3,400).

## Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
