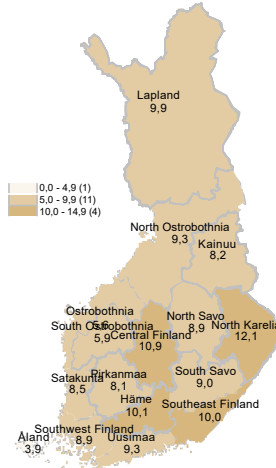

In August 239,100 unemployed jobseekers

Unemployed jobseekers' percentage of the workforce by ELY centre



At the end of August, a total of 239,100 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 41,900 fewer than a year earlier, and 33,100 fewer than the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.1% of the labour force, which is 1.6 percentage points less than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

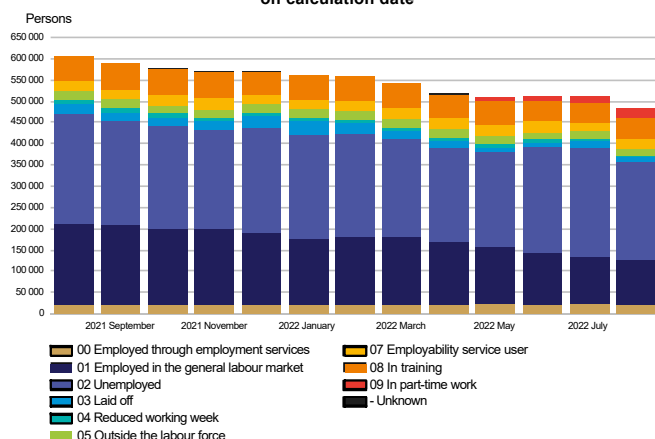
Trends:

- Total number of all jobseekers decreased by 120,900
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 41,900 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off decreased by 15,000
- Services included in the activation rate had the same number of people than a year ago
- 5,400 new job vacancies more compared to last year

The total number of jobseekers decreased

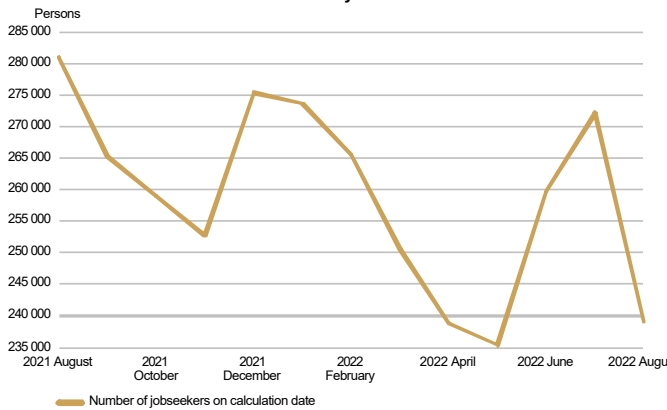
At the end of August, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 485,900, down 120,900 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 243,400 were men and 242,500 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 62,300 and the number of women by 58,600. Of the jobseekers, 231,500, or 3,100 less than a year earlier, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

Of the jobseekers, 150,900 were employed: 105,500 of them were in full-time work, 23,300 were in part-time work and 22,100 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 90,700, of whom 23,500 were in services promoting employment and 50,700 in training. Of the jobseekers, 239,100 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 41,900 less than the year before. In August, 9,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 5,000 less than in July. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 15,000 from August a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 5,200, representing a decrease of 5,900 from the year before.

monthly

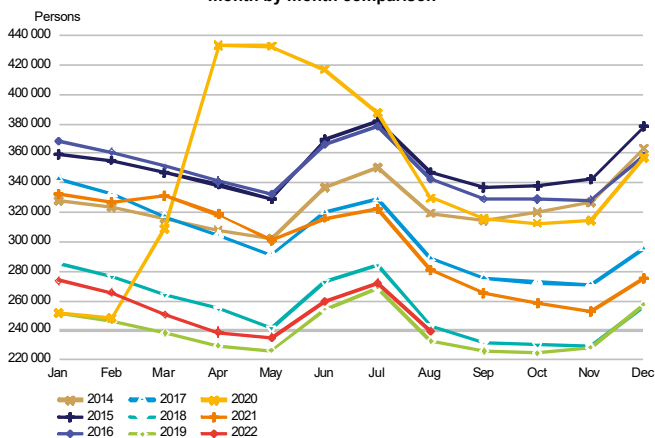


Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in August

At the end of August, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 239,100, down 41,900 on the previous year. Compared with July, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 33,100. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 135,000, or 15,600 fewer than in August a year ago, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 13,400, up 2,500 from August a year ago. In August, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 31,100, representing a decrease of 2,300 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment decreased by 2,200 from July. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 32,900, down 900 from August last year. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 8,300 at the end of August, down 1,700 from the year before.

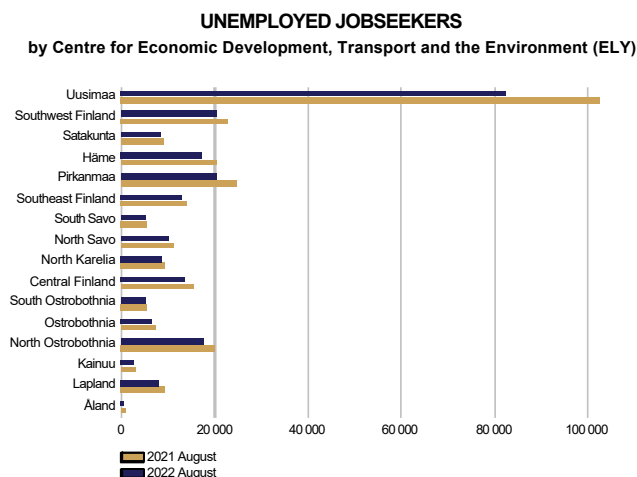
UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

In August, 9,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 5,000 less than in July. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 15,000 from August a year earlier. In August, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 1,100, representing a decrease of 100 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 3,000, down 1,700 from August a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs decreased by 2,800 from July. The number of people fully laid off fell in all occupational groups; the most in the groups of service and sales workers (-5,100), 'unknown' (-2,000), craft and related trades workers (-1,900), and associated professionals and technicians (-1,500).

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in August in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Uusimaa (-20%), Pirkanmaa (-17%), Häme (-14%), Ostrobothnia (-14%) and Kainuu (-14%). The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased the least in South Savo (-8%), North Karelia (-8%) and South Ostrobothnia (-8%). The number of unemployed jobseekers fell the most in Åland, by 31%. Compared to July, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres; the most in Ostrobothnia (-21%), North Ostrobothnia (-17%), Central Finland (-14%), South Ostrobothnia (-14%) and Pirkanmaa (-14%). In Åland, the number of unemployed jobseekers fell by 4% from July.

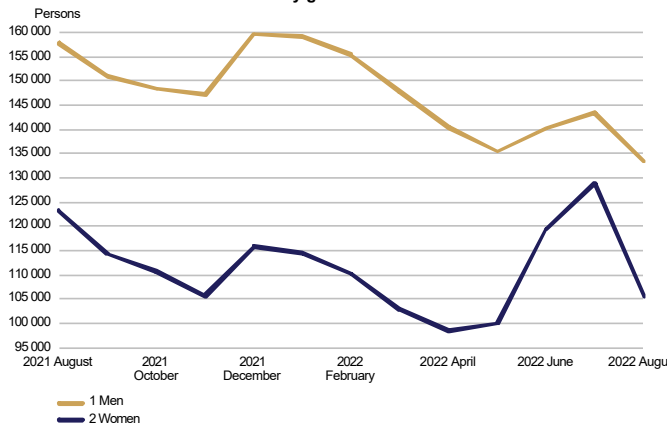

Unemployed jobseekers by gender and age-group

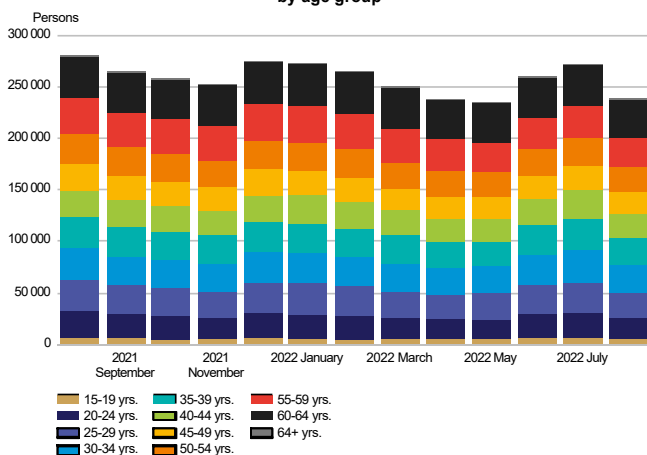
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 133,400 (56%) were men and 105,700 (44%) were women, indicating a decrease of 10,000 for men and 23,100 for women from the figures for July. Compared with August a year ago, unemployment decreased by 24,300 (-15%) among men and by 17,600 (-14%) among women.

by age group**



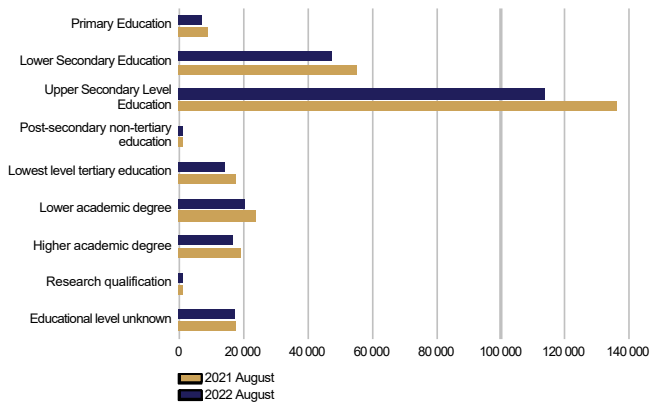
Examined by age group, unemployment decreased for those under the age of 65

At the end of August, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 25,500, representing a decrease of 7,300 from August a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from July by 4,900. There were 5,300 unemployed persons under 20. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 90,300, representing a decrease of 14,900 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 67,000, representing a decrease of 9,100 on the year before. Unemployment decreased the most among those under 25 (-22%) and the least among those between 60 and 64 years of age (-8%). Unemployment remained unchanged for those over 64. Compared with July, unemployment decreased in all age groups; the most among those under 30 (-16%).



Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group

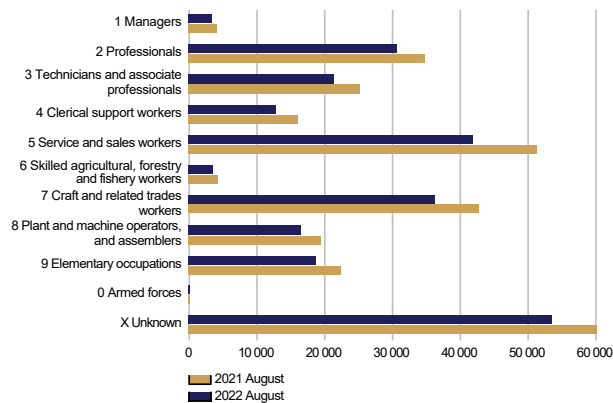
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from August last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-23%), post-secondary non-tertiary education (-20%), lowest level of tertiary education (-19%) and secondary education (-16%). Unemployment decreased the least among those with level of education "unknown" (-1%).

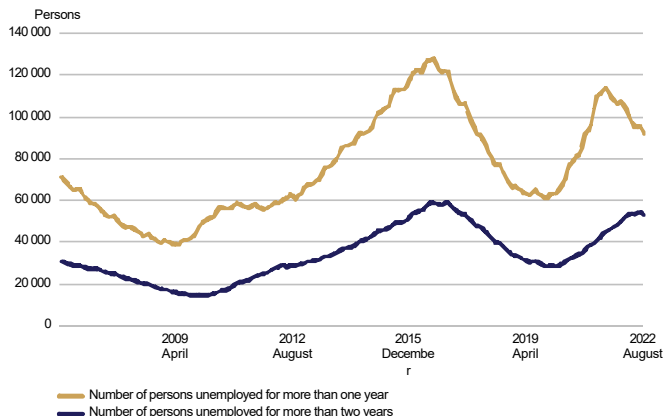
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased for all groups from August of last year. The greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-9,600), 'unknown' (-6,600), craft and related trades workers (-6,500) and professionals (-4,300). Unemployment decreased the least in the groups of armed forces (-30), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-700) and managers (-700).

at the end of the month**

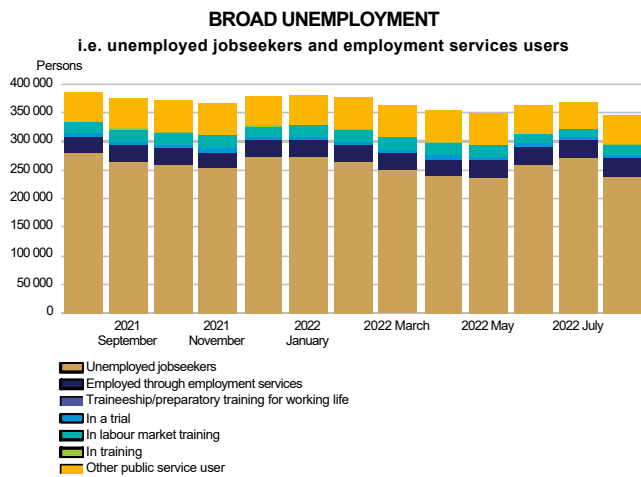


Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of August, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 92,300, down 19,400 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 55,500 were men and 36,800 were women. The number of men decreased by 10,800 (-16%) from the previous year and the number of women by 8,600 (-19%). Of those unemployed in the long term, 53,100 had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years. This is 7,500 more than a year ago.



Services

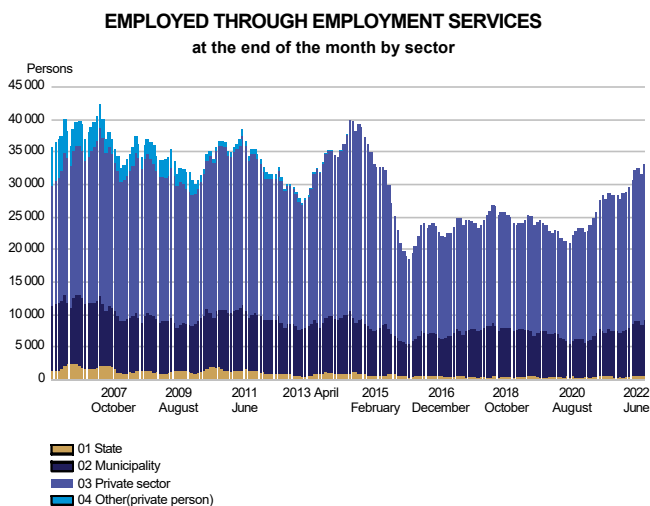


The number of persons covered by services remained the same

At the end of August, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 105,900, which was the same number as the previous year. Compared with July, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 7,900. Of those covered by services, 59,400 were customers of local government pilots, which is 3,000 more than in August last year. The activation rate at the end of August was 30.7%, which is 3.3 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 3.8% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 51,100, up 300 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 54,700, down 300 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 345,000 at the end of August. This is 41,900 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to a decrease in the number of unemployed.



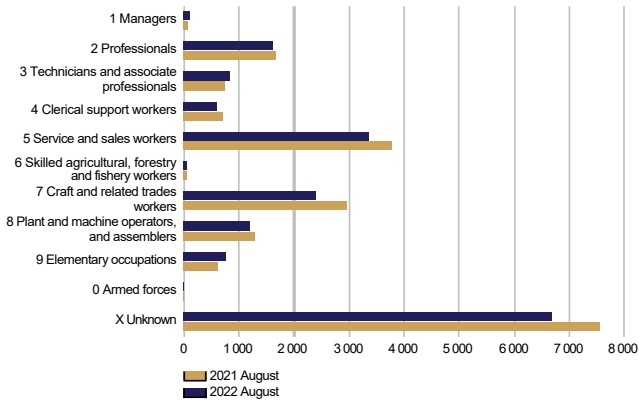
The number of placements increased in all sectors

At the end of August, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 33,100, which is 4,600 more than the year before. Of those in placements, 2% were in central government jobs, 26% in local government jobs and 72% in the private sector. Since August last year, the number of placements has increased by 20% in local government jobs, 15% in the private sector and 7% in central government jobs. Of those in placements, 54% were men. Placements for men increased by 2,400, and those for women by 2,100 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month

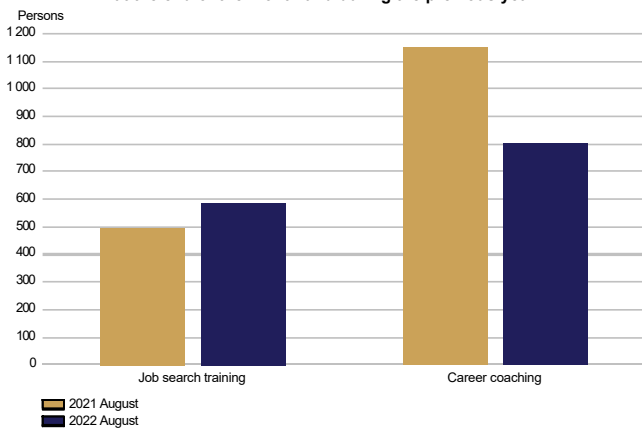


The number of persons in labour market training decreased

At the end of August, labour market training was attended by 17,600 students, down 1,900 on the previous year. Of the students, 8,100 were men and 9,500 were women. The number of men decreased by 1,000, and the number of women by 900 from August last year. During August, 5,600 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 400 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,200), which is 700 less than the year before.

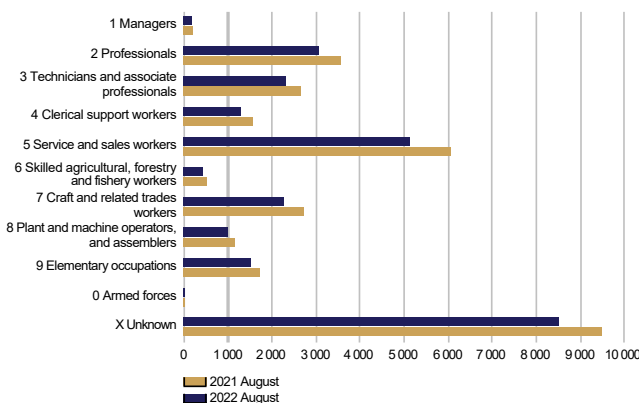

The number of persons in training decreased

At the end of August, 1,400 persons were in training, which is 300 less than the year before. Of those in training, 700 were men and 700 women. Career coaching was provided to 800 participants, which is 300 less than a year earlier. The number of people receiving job search training was 600, which is 100 more than last year.

in person's profession at the end of the month



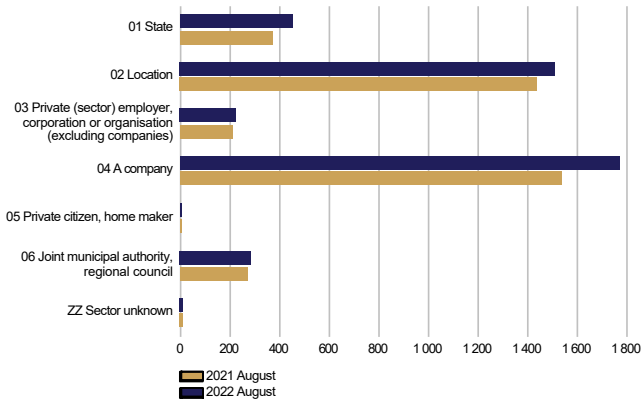
The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 25,700 people, representing a decrease of 3,900 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 9,700, down 1,900 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 16,000, representing a decrease of 2,000 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 7,700 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 800 on the previous year.



Job alternation, rehabilitative work and trials

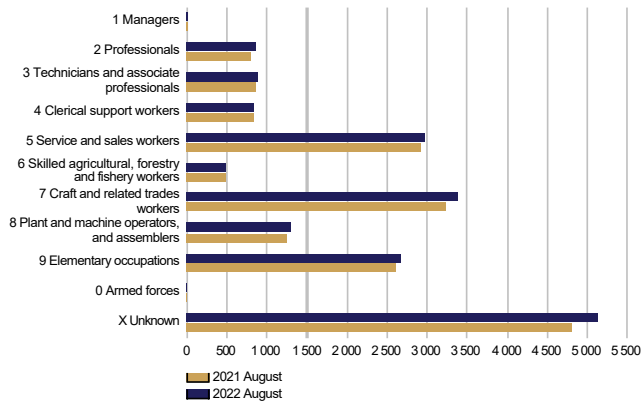
AS A JOB ALTERNATION SUBSTITUTE

The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 4,200 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of August, which is 400 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,600 were men and 2,700 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 200 from the previous year.

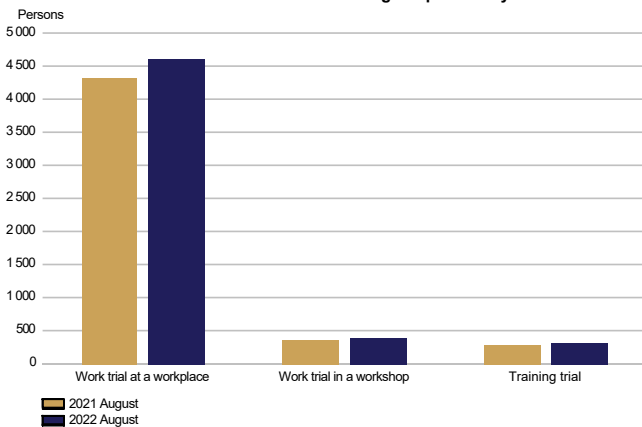
REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES

More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 18,500 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of August, which is 700 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 10,500 were men and 8,000 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 400 and the number of women by 300.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



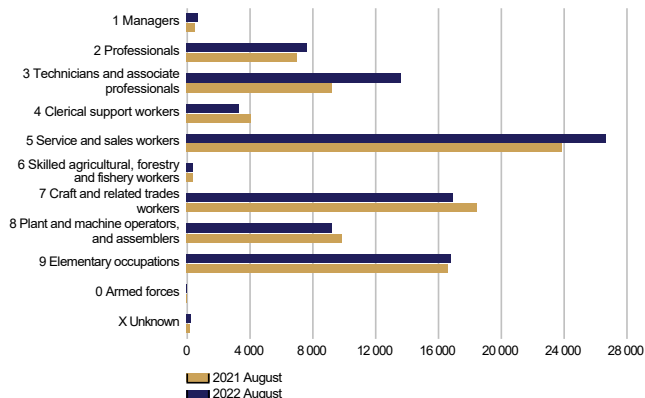
Participation in work and training trials increased

Work and training trials had a total of 5,300 participants at the end of August, which is 400 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 2,800 were men and 2,600 were women. The number of men increased by 200 and the number of women by 100 from the previous year.



Jobs vacant

NEW JOB VACANCIES

Increase in the number of new vacancies from the year before

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during August totalled 95,400, which is 5,400 more than in August last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in August amounted to 175,500, which is 20,100 more than a year ago. A total of 12,800 of these vacancies were filled during August, 3,600 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 64,100 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 12,900 vacancies were cancelled and 2,200 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of August was 87,000, up 11,100 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for seven occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of technicians and associate professionals (4,400), service and sales personnel (2,800), professionals (600) and managers (300). The number of new vacancies decreased the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (-1,600), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-700) and office and customer service workers (-700).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
