



232,400 unemployed jobseekers in October






At the end of October, a total of 232,400 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 26,700 fewer than a year earlier, and 500 fewer than the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 8.8% of the labour force, which is 1.0 percentage points less than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- Total number of all jobseekers decreased by 106,500
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 26,700 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off decreased by 8,900
- Services included in the activation rate had 3,600 more people than a year ago
- The number of new job vacancies decreased by 11,800 from last year




The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of October, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 470,700, down 106,500 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 238,400 were men and 232,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 53,200 and the number of women by 53,300. Of the jobseekers, 228,300, or 2,700 less than a year earlier, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

Of the jobseekers, 137,300 were employed: 84,500 of them were in full-time work, 31,100 were in part-time work and 21,600 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 95,500, of whom 26,000 were in services promoting employment and 54,500 in training. Of the jobseekers, 232,400 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 26,700 less than the year before. In October, 10,900 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,400 more than in September. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 8,900 from October a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 5,600, representing a decrease of 4,200 from the year before.


Unemployed jobseekers



Decrease in unemployed jobseekers in October

At the end of October, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 232,400, down 26,700 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 500. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 129,500, or 9,500 fewer than in October a year ago, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 14,000, up 2,900 from October a year ago. In October, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 35,900, representing an increase of 200 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment increased by 3,600 from September. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of iobseekers

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 31,700, up 1,500 from October a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 8,100 at the end of October, down 1,000 from the year before.




In October, 10,900 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,400 more than in September. The number of people fully laid off decreased by 8,900 from October a year earlier. In October, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 2,100, representing an increase of 400 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 6,300, up 500 from October a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs increased by 3,400 from September. The number of people fully laid off decreased in almost all occupational groups. The greatest decreases were in the groups of service and sales workers (-3,500), craft and related trades workers (-1,200) and 'unknown' (-1,000). The number of laid-off people remained unchanged in the groups of skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers and armed forces.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in October in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Uusimaa (-15%), Häme (-12%), Pirkanmaa (-12%) and Lapland (-11%). The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased the least in South Ostrobothnia (-3%) and Satakunta (-3%). The number of unemployed jobseekers fell the most in Åland, by 22%. Compared with September, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in the areas of five ELY Centres; the most in Uusimaa (-2%), Southwest Finland (-1%), Pirkanmaa (-1%) and Central Finland (-1%). In Åland, the number of unemployed jobseekers fell by 1% from September. From September, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased the most in Kainuu (5%), South Ostrobothnia (3%), Southeast Finland (3%) and North Savo (3%).

Unemployment decreased by an equal percentage among men and women


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 133,000 (57%) were men and 99,400 (43%) were women, indicating an increase of 1,100 for men and a decrease of 1,600 for women from the figures for September. Compared with October a year ago, unemployment decreased by 15,400 (-10%) among men and by 11,300 (-10%) among women.

Examined by age group, unemployment decreased for those under the age of 65

At the end of October, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 23,600, representing a decrease of 4,300 from October a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from September by 500. There were 4,600 unemployed persons under 20. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 89,300, representing a decrease of 11,400 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 66,300, representing a decrease of 7,300 on the year before. Unemployment decreased the most among those under 25 (-15%) and among those between 50 and 59 years of age (-14%). Unemployment decreased the least among 30 to 34-year-olds (-5%). Among those over 64, unemployment increased by 9%. Compared with September, unemployment increased only among those between 40 and 59 years of age (1%).


Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



Unemployment decreased at eight levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from October last year at all levels of education, with the exception of those with level of education 'unknown' whose unemployment increased by 5%. Unemployment decreased the most among those with lower level basic qualifications (-23%), lowest level of tertiary education (-15%) and postsecondary non-tertiary education (-12%). Unemployment decreased the least among those with lower-degree level tertiary education (-9%) and higherdegree level tertiary education (-9%).

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from October last year; the most in the groups of service and sales workers (-6,000), craft and related trades workers (-4,400), 'unknown' (-3,500), technicians and associate professionals (-2,800) and professionals (-2,800). Unemployment decreased the least in the occupational groups of armed forces (-10), managers (-500) and skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-500).



Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of October, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 87,700, down 20,200 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 53,100 were men and 34,700 were women. The number of men decreased by 11,300 (-18%) from the previous year and the number of women by 8,900 (-20%). Of those unemployed in the long term, 51,700 had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years. This is 4,200 more than a year ago



Services




Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of October, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 116,300, up 3,600 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 3,700. Of those covered by services, 65,500 were customers of local government pilots, which is 4,800 more than in October last year. The activation rate at the end of October was 33.3%, which is 3.0 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.2% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 55,300, up 1,900 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 60,900, up 1,700 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 348,600 at the end of October. This is 23,100 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was mainly due to a decrease in the number of unemployed.

01 State 02 Municipality 03 Private sector 04 Other(private person)


The number of placements increased in all sectors

At the end of October, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, in placements in central government jobs or receiving start-up grants totalled 34,700, which is 6,300 more than the year before. Of those in placements, 2% were in central government jobs, 26% in local government jobs and 72% in the private sector. From October last year, the number of placements has increased by 30% in local government jobs, 20% in the private sector and 11% in central government jobs. Of those in placements, 53% were men. Placements for men increased by 3,500, and those for women by 2,900 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month




Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of October, labour market training was attended by 21,800 students, up 500 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,000 were men and 11,900 were women. The number of men remained the same and the number of women increased by 500 on the previous year. During October, 5,500 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 1,100 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,200), which is 500 more than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




The number of persons in training increased

At the end of October, 1,800 persons were in training, which is 100 more than the year before. Of those in training, 900 were men and 900 were women. Career coaching was provided to 1,100 participants, which is unchanged from last year. The number of people receiving job search training was 700, which is 100 more than last year.

The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 27,500 people, representing a decrease of 4,400 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 10,400, down 2,100 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 17,100, representing a decrease of 2,300 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 8,400 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 900 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector




The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 4,000 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of October, which is 300 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,400 were men and 2,500 were women. The number of men increased by 100 and the number of women likewise by 100 from the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 20,000 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of October, which is 500 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 11,200 were men and 8,800 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 300 and the number of women by 200.

Participation in work and training trials increased

Work and training trials had a total of 6,500 participants at the end of October, which is 300 more than the previous year. Of the participants 3,200 were men and 3,300 were women. The number of men increased by 100 and the number of women by 200 from the previous year.

Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during October totalled 79,800, which is 11,800 less than in October last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in October amounted to 160,500, which is 9,100 less than a year ago. A total of 12,100 of these vacancies were filled during October, 2,700 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 62,600 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 12,900 vacancies were cancelled and 2,200 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of October was 77,200, down 3,900 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had decreased in seven occupational groups; the most in the groups of service and sales workers (-3,900), elementary occupations (-2,200), craft and related trades workers (-2,200) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-1,400). The number of new vacancies increased the most in the occupational groups of managers (200) and skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (100).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
