



253,900 unemployed jobseekers in March






At the end of March, a total of 253,900 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 3,200 more than a year earlier. Compared with the previous month, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 4,200. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.6% of the labour force, which is 0.1 percentage points more than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- Total number of all jobseekers decreased by 67,100
- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 3,200 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off increased by 2,000
- Services included in the activation rate had 2,500 more people than a year ago
- The number of new job vacancies decreased by 31,000 from the previous year




The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of March, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 475,500, down 67,100 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 249,700 were men and 225,800 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 27,100 and the number of women by 40,000. Of the jobseekers, 238,900, or 4,100 more than a year earlier, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

Of the jobseekers, 120,700 were employed: 62,200 of them were in full-time work, 39,000 were in part-time work and 19,500 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 94,900, of whom 25,500 were in services promoting employment and 55,500 in training. Of the jobseekers, 253,900 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 3,200 more than the year before. In March, 22,900 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,300 fewer than in February. The number of people fully laid off increased by 2,000 from March a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 6,100, representing a decrease of 1,500 from the year before.


Unemployed jobseekers



Increase in unemployed jobseekers in March

At the end of March, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 253,900, up 3,200 on the previous year. Compared with February, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 4,200. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 140,800, or 5,800 more than in March a year ago, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 13,700, up 3,300 from March a year ago. In March, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 35,400, representing an increase of 5,400 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment increased by 1,900 from February. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 35,900, up 7,200 from March a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 9,600 at the end of March, up 800 from the year before.




In March, 22,900 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,300 fewer than in February. The number of people fully laid off increased by 2,000 from March a year earlier. In March, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 3,200, representing an increase of 1,500 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 10,400, up 5,600 from March a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs increased by 600 from February. Examined by occupation, the number of people fully laid off increased in five groups and decreased in two groups. The number of people fully laid off increased the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (2,600), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (800) and 'unknown' (800). The number of people fully laid off decreased the most in the groups of service and sales workers (-2,400) and office and customer service workers (-200). The number of laid-off people remained unchanged in the groups of armed forces, skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers, elementary occupations, and associate professionals and technicians.


Unemployment decreased in the areas of five ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in March in the areas of five Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Häme (-5%), South Savo (-3%), Lapland (-2%) and Southeast Finland (-2%). The number of unemployed jobseekers grew the most in North Ostrobothnia (12%), Ostrobothnia (7%) and North Savo (6%). In Kainuu, the number of unemployed jobseekers was unchanged. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in the areas of all other Employment and Economic Development Centres except Southwest Finland; most in South Ostrobothnia (-7%), South Savo (-5%), Southeast Finland (-5%), Satakunta (-4%) and Ostrobothnia (-4%). In Åland, the number of unemployed jobseekers fell slightly from February (-0.4%).

Unemployed jobseekers and jobs vacant in Employment and Economic Development Office by ELY centre



Unemployment decreased among women and grew among men


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 151,800 (60%) were men and 102,100 (40%) were women, indicating a decrease of 1,500 for men and 2,700 for women from the figures for February. Compared with March a year ago, unemployment increased by 3,900 (3%) among men and decreased by 800 (-1%) among women.



Unemployment decreased the most among those over 50

At the end of March, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 26,400 representing an increase by 100 from March a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from February by 600. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 4,900. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 94,600, representing a decrease of 4,200 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 69,800, representing a decrease of 3,400 on the year before. Unemployment decreased the most among those between 60 and 64 years of age (-7%), those over 64 (-4%) and those between 50 and 54 (-3%). Unemployment increased the most among those between 30 and 34 and those between 40 and 44 years of age (8%). Compared with February, unemployment decreased in nine age groups. Unemployment decreased the most among those between 50 and 54 and those between 20 and 24 years of age (-3%).


Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



Unemployment decreased at only three levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from March last year at three levels of education. Unemployment decreased among those with lower level basic qualifications (-20%), lowest level of tertiary education (-6%) and higher level basic qualifications (-3%). Unemployment increased the most among those with education level unknown (21%), lower-degree level tertiary education (8%), higher-degree level tertiary education (3%) and secondary education (2%). Unemployment remained unchanged among those with post-secondary non-tertiary education and doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education.

Unemployment decreased in five occupational groups

Examined by occupation, the unemployment fell in five groups from March of last year; the most among service and sales workers (-1,100), office and customer service workers (-900) and associate professionals and technicians (-400) . Unemployment increased the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (2,900), "unknown" (1,800), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (800) and professionals (400). Unemployment remained unchanged in the group of armed forces.


Number of persons unemployed for more than one year

Decrease in long-term unemployment


At the end of March, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 84,700, down 15,800 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 51,700 were men and 33,000 were women. The number of men decreased by 8,700 (-14%) from the previous year and the number of women by 7,100 (-18%). Long-term unemployed who have been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 49,700, which is 3,600 fewer than a year ago.

Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of March, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 116,700, up 2,500 on the previous year. Compared with February, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 2,700. Of those covered by services, 67,600 were customers of the local government pilots, which is 4,500 more than in March last year. The activation rate at the end of March was 31.5%, which is 0.2 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.2% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 55,800, up 1,400 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 60,900, up 1,100 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 370,600 at the end of March. This is 5,700 more than a year earlier. The increase in broad unemployment was due to an increase in the number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services.


The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of March, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the central government or receiving start-up grants totalled 34,400, which is 4,900 more than the year before. Of those in placements, 1% were in central government, 26% in municipalities and 73% in the private sector. Since March last year, the number of placements had increased by 18% in the private sector and by 17% in municipalities, but decreased by 25% in central government. Of those in placements, 53% were men. Placements for men increased by 2,800, and those for women by 2,100 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month




Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of March, labour market training was attended by 24,200 students, up 2,300 on the previous year. Of the students, 11,200 were men and 13,000 were women. The number of men increased by 400, and the number of women by 1,900 from March last year. During March, 4,500 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 500 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (8,400), which is 2,000 more than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




The number of persons in training increased

At the end of March, 2,000 persons were in training, which is 500 more than the year before. Of those in training, 1,000 were men and 900 were women. Career coaching had 1,100 participants in March, which is 200 more than a year earlier. The number of people receiving job search training was 800, which is 400 more than the previous year.

The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 26,700 people, representing a decrease of 4,500 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 10,200, down 1,800 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 16,500, representing a decrease of 2,700 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 8,600 persons in the group of 'unknown', down 700 on the previous year.

The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 3,800 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of March, which is 200 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,400 were men and 2,400 were women. The number of men increased by 100 and the number of women likewise by 100 from the previous year.

REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES

Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 18,700 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of March, which is 1,500 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 10,500 were men and 8,200 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 800 and the number of women by 700.

Participation in work and training trials increased

Work and training trials had a total of 7,000 participants at the end of March, which is 600 more than a year earlier. Of the participants, 3,400 were men and 3,500 were women. The number of men increased by 300 and the number of women also by 300 from the previous year.

Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during March totalled 95,200, which is 31,000 fewer than in March last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in March was 203,400, which is 55,700 fewer than a year ago. A total of 14,100 of these vacancies were filled during March, 2,700 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 78,900 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 13,900 vacancies were cancelled and 1,500 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of March was 99,300, down 33,400 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had decreased in almost all occupational groups; the most among elementary occupations (-8,400), service and sales workers (-7,200), associate professionals and technicians (-4,800), craft and related trades workers (-4,500), and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-3,400). The number of new vacancies remained unchanged in the occupations group of armed forces.

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
