



# 264,300 unemployed jobseekers in November






At the end of November, a total of 264,300 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 29,500 more than a year earlier. Compared with the previous month, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 8,200. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 10.0% of the labour force, which is 1.1 percentage points more than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

#### Trends:

- Total number of all jobseekers increased by 15,900
- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 29,500 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off increased by 12,200
- Services included in the activation rate had 700 fewer participants than a year ago
- The number of new job vacancies decreased by 28,700 from the previous year




# The total number of jobseekers increased

At the end of November, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 485,500, up 15,900 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 258,900 were men and 226,600 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 19,100 and the number of women decreased by 3,200. Of the jobseekers, 250,300, or 22,400 more than a year earlier, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

Of the jobseekers, 116,200 were employed: 55,800 of them were in full-time work, 43,400 were in part-time work and 17,100 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 95,700, of whom 25,300 were in services promoting employment and 57,800 in training. Of the jobseekers, 264,300 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 29,500 more than the year before. In November, 26,000 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 4,800 more than in October. The number of people fully laid off increased by 12,200 from November a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 9,300, representing an increase of 3,400 from the year before.



# Increase in unemployed jobseekers in November

At the end of November, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 264,300, up 29,500 on the previous year. Compared with October, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 8,200. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 147,200, or 17,900 more than in November a year ago, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 18,700, up 4,900 from November a year ago. In November, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 44,900, representing an increase of 11,300 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment decreased by 3,900 from October. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 38,400, up 6,000 from November a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 9,700 at the end of November, up 1,400 from the year before.




In November, 26,000 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 4,800 more than in October. The number of people fully laid off increased by 12,200 from November a year earlier. In November, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 4,900, representing an increase of 2,300 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 14,600, up 7,800 from November a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs decreased by 1,300 from October. Examined by occupation, the number of people fully laid off increased in nine groups and decreased in one. The number of people fully laid off increased the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (5,000), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (2,100), "unknown" (1,900), and professionals (1,300). The number of people fully laid off decreased only among service and sales workers (-100). The number of laid-off people remained unchanged in the groups of armed forces.


#### Unemployment increased in the areas of almost all ELY Centres

The number of unemployed jobseekers increased from November last year in the areas of all ELY Centres, with the exception of Lapland (-5%). The number of unemployed jobseekers grew the most in Pirkanmaa (26%), North Ostrobothnia (18%), Ostrobothnia (16%), South Ostrobothnia (16%), South Savo (15%) and Central Finland (14%). In Åland, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased 4%. Compared with October, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased in the areas of all ELY Centres, with the expection of Lapland (-4%); the most in Ostrobothnia (6%), South Ostrobothnia (6%), North Savo (5%) and Häme (5%). In Åland, the number of unemployed jobseekers grew by 4% from October.

#### Unemployed jobseekers and jobs vacant in Employment and Economic Development Office by ELY centre



# Unemployment increased more among men than women


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 158,100 (60%) were men and 106,200 (40%) were women, indicating an increase of 7,500 for men and a increase of 800 for women from the figures for October. Compared with November a year ago, unemployment increased by 21,700 (16%) among men and by 7,700 (8%) among women.



# Unemployment increased in all age groups

At the end of November, unemployed jobseekers aged under 25 numbered 27,300, representing an increase of 4,100 from November a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from October by 800. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 5,800. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 96,100, representing an increase of 5,800 on the previous year. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 71,000, representing an increase of 4,100 on the year before. Unemployment increased the most among those under 20 (31%), those between 35 and 39 (17%), between 40 and 44 (17%), between 30 and 34 (16%), and between 45 and 49 years of age (16%). Compared with October, unemployment increased in nearly all age groups; the most among those between 50 and 54 (4%), between 30 and 34 (4%), between 45 and 49 (4%) and between 40 and 44 years of age (4%).


### Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



#### Unemployment decreased at only one level of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from November of last year at only one level of education; those with lower level basic qualifications (-13%), Unemployment increased the most among those with post-secondary non-tertiary education (28%), lower-degree level tertiary education (24%), higher-degree level tertiary education (18%) and education level unknown (17%).

#### Unemployment increased in almost all occupations

Examined by occupation, unemployment increased in all groups from November last year, with the exception of armed forces; the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (8,600), 'unknown' (7,500), professionals (3,700) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (2,900). Unemployment remained unchanged in the group of armed forces.

#### LONG-TERM UNEMPLOYED



#### Increase in long-term unemployment


At the end of November, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 89,200, up 3,100 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 53,700 were men and 35,400 were women. The number of men increased by 1,500 (3%) from the previous year and the number of women increased by 1,600 (5%). Longterm unemployed who have been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 46,700, which is 4,200 fewer than a year ago.

# Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of November, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 116,900, down 700 on the previous year. Compared with October, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 1,100. Of those covered by services, 69,700 were customers of the local government pilots, which is 3,300 more than in November last year. The activation rate at the end of November was 30.7%, which is 2.7 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.2% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 55,900, down 100 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 61,000, down 700 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 381,200 at the end of November. This is 28,700 more than a year earlier. The growth in broad unemployment was due to the increase in unemployed jobseekers.


# The number of placements increased in the private sector

At the end of November, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, placed in employment in central government or receiving start-up grants totalled 35,400, which is 700 more than the year before. Of those in placement, 1% were in central government jobs, 24% in municipalities and 75% in the private sector. Since November last year, the number of placements had increased by 6% in the private sector, but decreased by 48% in central government jobs and by 7% in municipalities. Of those in placements, 53% were men. Placements for men increased by 700, and those for women remained unchanged.

in target profession at the end of the month




#### Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of November, labour market training was attended by 25,200 students, up 2,800 on the previous year. Of the students, 11,400 were men and 13,800 were women. The number of men increased by 1,100, and the number of women by 1,700 from November last year. During November, 4,500 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 200 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (9,600), which is 2,100 more than the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




#### The number of persons in training increased

At the end of November, 2,200 persons were in training, which is 100 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,100 and of women 1,000. Career coaching was provided to 1,200 participants, down 100 from the previous year. The number of people receiving job search training was 1,000, which is 200 more than the previous year.

#### The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 25,100 people, representing a decrease of 2,300 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 9,600, down 800 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 15,500, representing a decrease of 1,600 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 8,600 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 100 on the previous year.

# The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 4,100 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of November, which is 300 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,500 were men and 2,700 were women. The number of men increased by 100 and the number of women increased by 200 from the previous year.

# Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 17,900 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of November, which is 2,500 less than a year earlier. Of the participants 10,000 were men and 7,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 1,400 and the number of women by 1,100.



# Participation in work and training trials increased

Work and training trials had a total of 7,100 participants at the end of November, which is 200 more than the year before. Of the participants, 3,500 were men and 3,600 were women. The number of men rose by 100 and the number of women also rose by 100 from the previous year.

# Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during November totalled 44,400, which is 28,700 less than in November last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in November was 87,000, which is 48,600 less than a year ago. A total of 7,800 of these vacancies were filled during November, 1,600 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 33,000 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 8,500 vacancies were cancelled and 600 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of November was 38,900, down 19,400 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had decreased in almost all occupational groups; the most among service and sales workers (-6,400), associate professionals and technicians (-5,700), craft and related trades workers (-5,700), and elementary occupations (-5,400). The number of new vacancies remained unchanged in the occupational group of armed forces.

### Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.

The following symbols have been used:
