




In February, the number of unemployed jobseekers was 361,000






A total of 361,000 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of February. This is 5,600 more than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 7,100 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 13.7% of the labour force which is 0.2 percentage points more than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Employment and the Economy.

Trends:

- The total number of jobseekers increased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 6,000 compared to the year before
- Services included in the activation rate had 7,000 less people than a year ago
- 4,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year




The total number of jobseekers increased


At the end of February, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 649,300, up 29,000 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 340,000 were men and 309,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 10,900 and the number of women by 18,100.

Of the jobseekers, 148,800 were employed, 129,300 of them were on the open labour market and 19,500 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 128,600, of whom 35,200 were in services promoting employment and 60,500 in training. Of the jobseekers, 361,000 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 5,600 more than the year before. In February, 30,500 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 500 less than in January. Since February of the year before, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 4,300. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 10,900, representing an increase of 1,400 from the year before.

The number of unemployed jobseekers increased in February

At the end of February, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 361,000, up 5,600 on the previous year. Compared with January, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 7,100.


In February, 30,500 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 500 less than in January. Since February of the year before, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 4,300.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 32,900, up 900 from February a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 10,700 at the end of February, up 600 from the year before.


Unemployment decreased in six areas

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in February in the areas of six Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-5%), Central Finland (-4%), and Häme (-3%). Unemployment increased in the areas of all other ELY Centres; the most in Uusimaa (6%), Ostrobothnia (6%), South-East Finland (3%) and North Karelia (3%).

Unemployment grew most among women


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 208,600 (58%) were men and 152,400 (42%) were women, indicating a decrease of 3,900 for men and 3,300 for women from the figures for January. Compared with February a year ago, the unemployment among men increased by 200 (0%) and among women by 5,400 (4%).

Unemployment grew only slightly among young people

At the end of February, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 46,100 representing an increase by 200 from February a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from January by 2,200. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 7,600. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 133,900, representing an increase of 2,800 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 93,300, representing an increase of 2,400 on the year before.

Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group



Unemployment increased especially among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, the unemployment rose from February of last year at all other levels of education, except among those with lower level basic qualifications (-11%) and higher level of basic qualifications (-1%); the increase was greatest among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (10%), lower-degree level tertiary education (7%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (5%).

Unemployment decreased in four occupational groups


Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in four groups from February of last year; the most in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (-1,700) and process and transport workers (-900). Consequently, unemployment grew the most in the groups; service and sales personnel (3,900), specialised experts (1,900) and skilled workers (1,300).


Long-term unemployment continued to grow

At the end of February, the number of long-term unemployed who have been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted 122,000, up 19,500 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 71,500 were men and 50,500 were women. The number of men increased by 11,200 (19%) from the previous year and the number of women by 8,300 (20%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 54,100, which is 8,400 more than a year ago.

Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of February, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 118,900, down 6,600 on the previous year. Compared with January, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 4,200. The activation rate at the end of February was 24.8 %, which is 1.3 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.5 % of the labour force was covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 56,700, down 2,900 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 62,300, down 3,700 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 480,000 at the end of February. This is 1,000 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to the decrease in the number of persons covered by services.


The number of placements decreased in all sectors

At the end of February, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 19,500, which is 13,200 less than the year before. Of those employed, 3% were in government jobs, 28% in local government jobs and 70% in the private sector. Since February of the year before, the number of placements has decreased by 11% in government jobs, by 25% in local government jobs and by 46% in the private sector. Of those employed, 52% were men. Placements for men decreased by 6,300, and those for women by 6,900 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month




Decrease in labour market training

At the end of February, labour market training was attended by 21,500 students, down 3,400 on the previous year. Of the students, 11,200 were men and 10,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 1,500 and the number of women by 2,000. During February, 4,100 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 700 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,400), which is 700 more than the year before. In February, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 1,000, which is 300 less than in February last year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




The number of persons in training decreased slightly

At the end of February, 2,200 persons were in training, which is 100 less than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,200 and of women 1,000. Career training had 500 participants less than the year before. The number of participants in job search training increased by 400 compared to February last year.

in person's profession at the end of the month




The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 36,000 people, representing an increase of 5,600 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 14,200, up 2,400 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 21,800, representing an increase of 3,200 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 7,100 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,200 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector




The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 5,000 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of February, which is 300 less than a year earlier. Of these job alternation substitutes, a total of 1,600 were men, representing a decrease of 100 on the year before. The corresponding number for women was 3,400, down 100 on February the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 21,700 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of February, which is 3,900 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 12,500 were men and 9,200 were women. The number of men increased by 2,100 a year earlier, and the number of women by 1,700.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




Participation in work and training trials increased from the previous year

Work and training trials had a total of 13,200 participants at the end of February, which is 900 more than the previous year. Of the participants, 6,000 were men and 7,200 were women. The number of men increased by 500, and the number of women by 400.

Jobs vacant

NEW JOB VACANCIES during the month and during the previous year



Increase in new job vacancies compared to last year

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during February totalled 59,500, which is 3,500 more than February in the previous year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 106,600 in February, which is 5,200 more than a year ago. A total of 9,200 of these vacancies were filled during February, 4,600 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of February was 59,900, down 1,300 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for eight occupational groups; the most in the groups of skilled workers (1,300) other workers (1,200), specialised experts (800) and construction, repair and manufacturing workers (800). The number of new job vacancies had decreased in three occupational groups; the most in the group of service and sales personnel (-1,800).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Employment and the Economy's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Employment and the Economy compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
