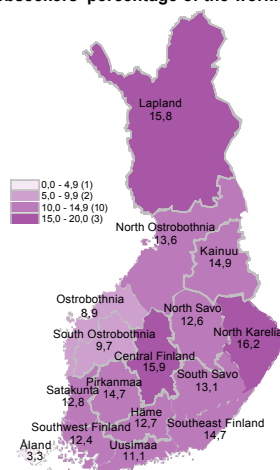

In May, the number of unemployed jobseekers was 332,100

A total of 332,100 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of May. This is 2,500 more than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 8,800 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 12.6% of the labour force which is 0.1 percentage points more than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Employment and the Economy.

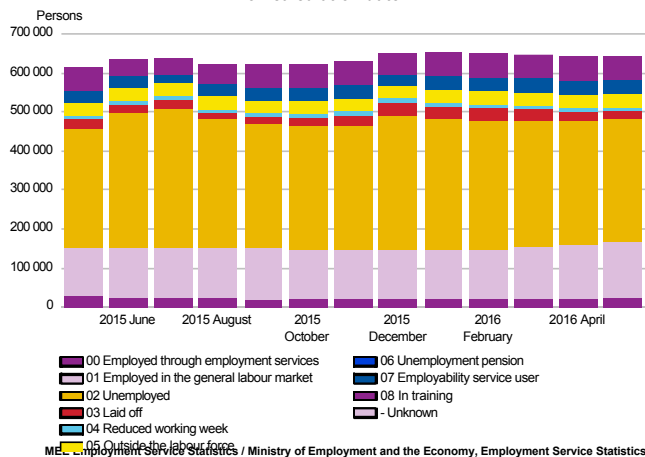
Trends:

- The total number of jobseekers increased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 3,000 compared to the year before
- Services included in the activation rate had 3,000 less people than a year ago
- 9,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year

The total number of jobseekers increased

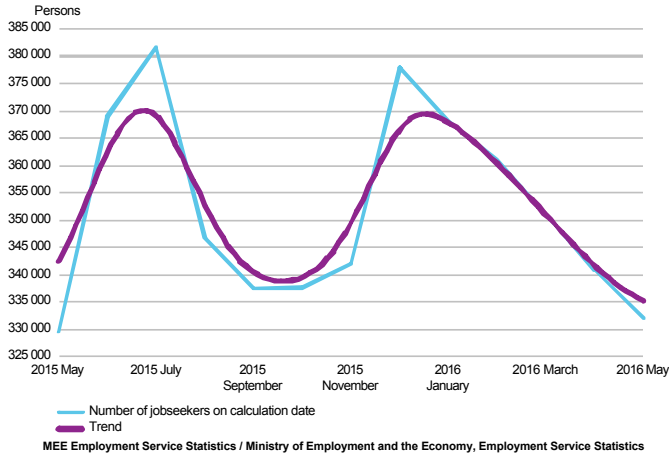
At the end of May, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 641,900, up 29,700 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 328,700 were men and 313,200 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 11,600 and the number of women by 18,200.

Of the jobseekers, 169,600 were employed, 146,800 of them were on the open labour market and 22,800 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 129,300, of whom 35,200 were in services promoting employment and 59,900 in training. Of the jobseekers, 332,100 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 2,500 more than the year before. In May, 20,000 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 4,300 less than in April. Since May last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 3,400. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 10,800, representing an increase of 1,900 from the year before.

monthly and trend



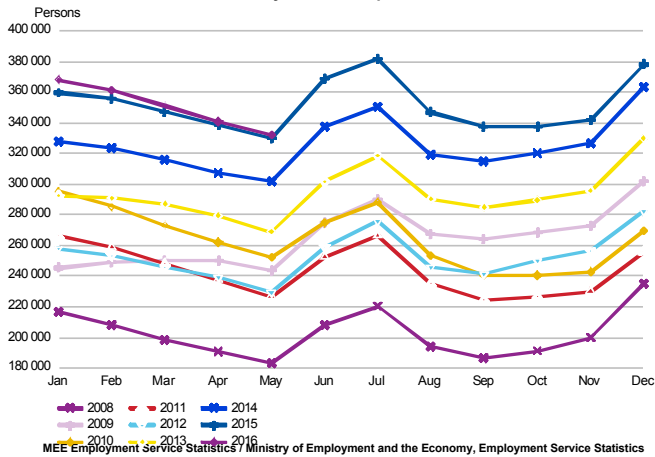
The number of unemployed jobseekers increased in May

At the end of May, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 332,100, up 2,500 on the previous year. Compared with April, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 8,800.

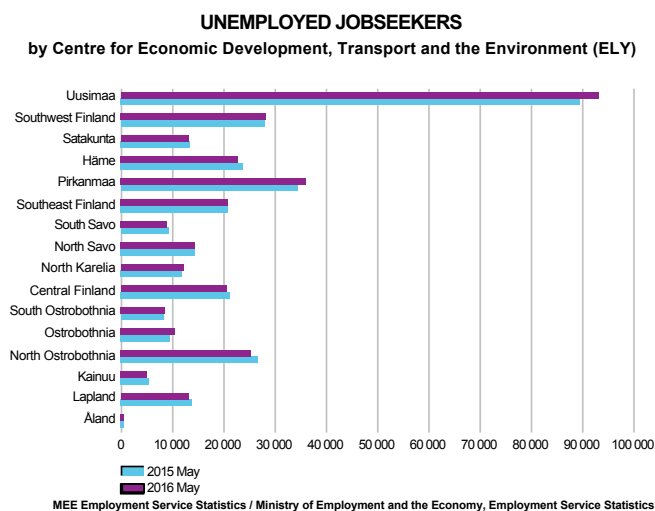
In May, 20,000 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 4,300 less than in April. Since May last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 3,400.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 33,600, up 1,200 from May a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 9,900 at the end of May, up 400 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in eight areas

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in May in the areas of eight Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-6%), Häme (-5%), North Ostrobothnia (-4%) and Lapland (-4%). Unemployment increased the most in Ostrobothnia (9%), Pirkanmaa (4%), and Uusimaa (4%).

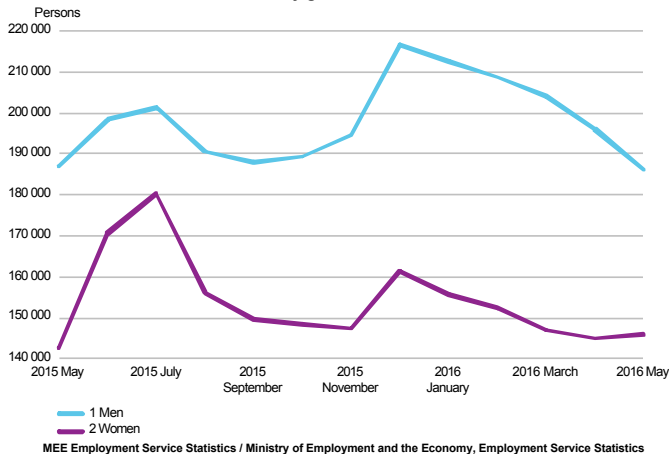

Unemployed jobseekers by gender and age-group

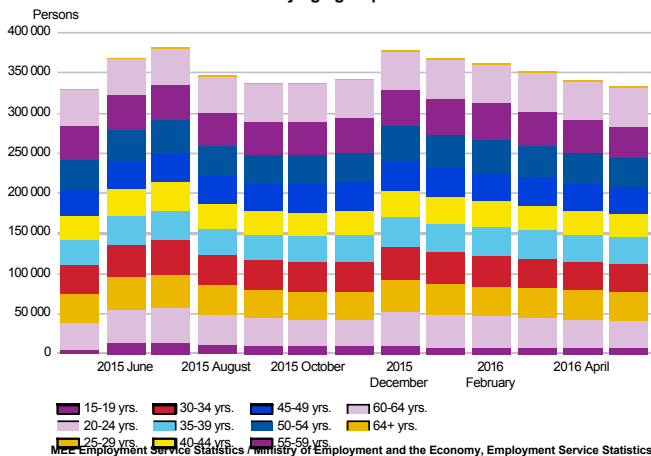

Unemployment decreased among men

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 186,200 (56%) were men and 145,900 (44%) were women, indicating a decrease of 9,700 for men and an increase of 900 for women from the figures for April. Compared with May a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 700 (-0%) and increased among women by 3,300 (2%).

by age group**



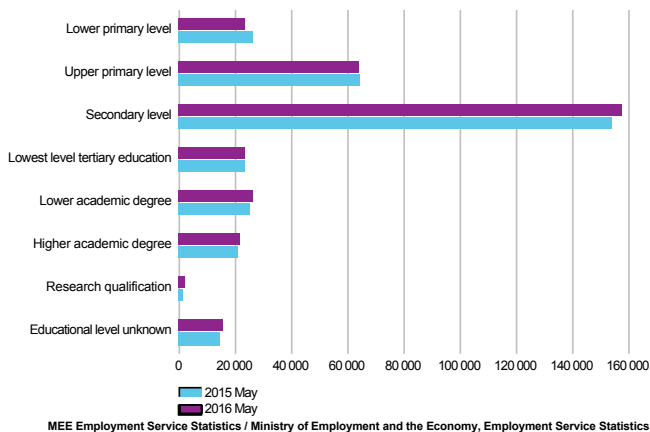
Unemployment grew in almost all age groups

At the end of May, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 41,800, representing an increase of 1,700 from May a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from April by 1,100. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 7,300. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 125,000, representing an increase of 1,400 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 88,300, representing an increase of 1,500 on the year before.



Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group

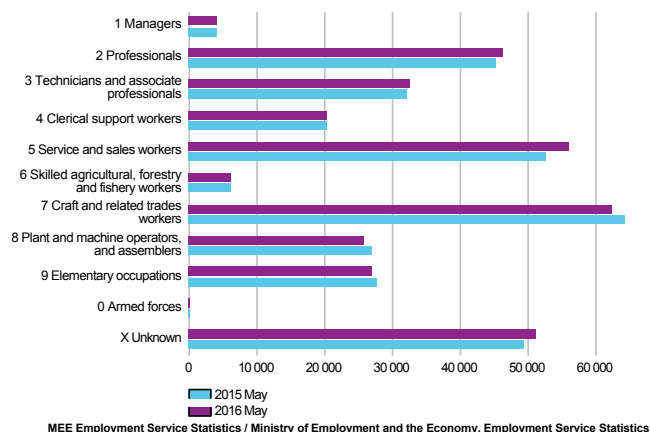
UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment increased especially among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, the unemployment decreased from May last year among those with lower level basic qualifications (-11%), lowest level of tertiary education (-1%) and higher level basic qualifications (-1%). Unemployment grew the most among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (5%), lower-degree level tertiary education (4%) and higher-degree level tertiary education (3%).

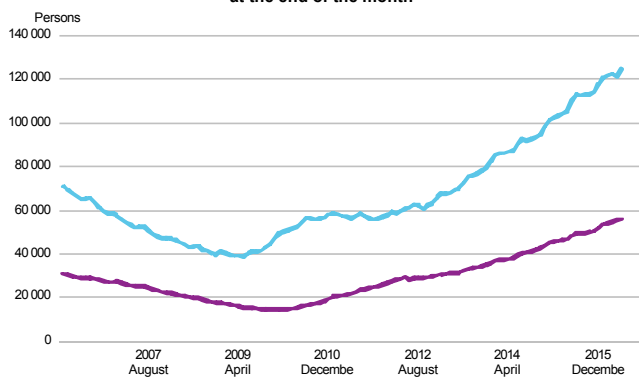
UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased in four occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in four groups from May last year; the most in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (-2,100) and process and transport workers (-1,200). At the same time, unemployment grew the most in the groups of service and sales personnel (3,400), 'unknown' (1,700) specialised experts (1,200) and skilled workers (400).

Long-term unemployment continued to grow

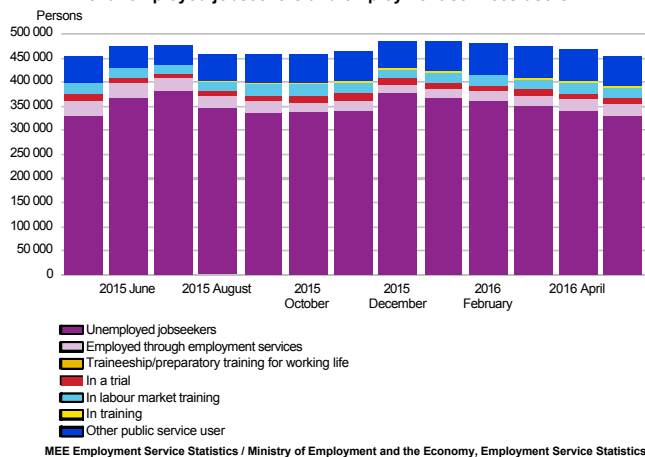
At the end of May, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 125,000, up 19,500 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 72,000 were men and 53,000 were women. The number of men increased by 10,400 (17%) from the previous year and the number of women by 9,100 (21%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 55,900, which is 9,100 more than a year ago.

i.e. unemployed jobseekers and employment services users



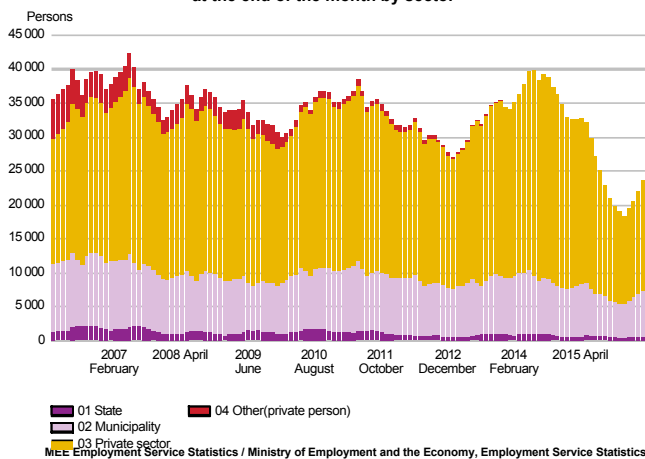
Decrease in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of May, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 121,600, down 3,200 on the previous year. Compared with April, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 3,400. The activation rate at the end of May was 26.8%, which is 0.7 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.4% of the labour force was covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 58,700, down 1,600 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 62,900, down 1,600 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 453,800 at the end of May. This is 700 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to the decrease in the number of persons covered by services.

EMPLOYED THROUGH EMPLOYMENT SERVICES at the end of the month by sector



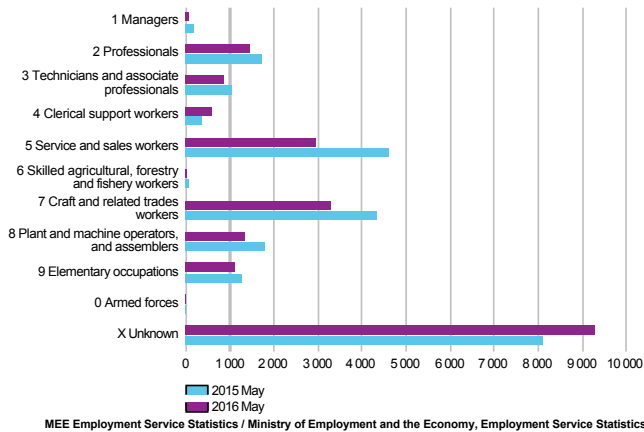
The number of placements decreased in all sectors

At the end of May, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 23,700, which is 8,600 less than the year before. Of those employed, 3% were in government jobs, 29% in local government jobs and 68% in the private sector. Since May last year, the number of placements has decreased by 12% in government jobs, by 12% in local government jobs and by 32% in the private sector. Of those employed, 53% were men. Placements for men decreased by 4,000, and those for women by 4,600 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month

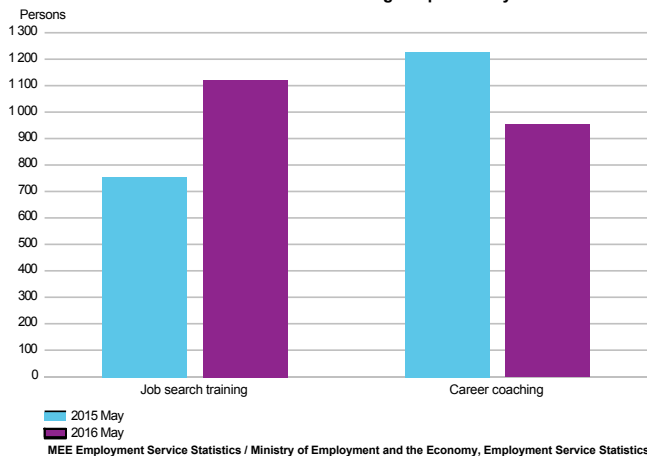


Decrease in labour market training

At the end of May, labour market training was attended by 21,000 students, down 2,400 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,800 were men and 10,100 were women. The number of both men and women decreased by 1,200 from the previous year. During May, 3,300 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 400 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,400), which is 1,100 more than the year before. In May, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 1,000, which is 200 less than in May last year.

The number of persons in training increased slightly

At the end of May, 2,100 persons were in training, which is 100 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,100 and of women 1,000. Work and training trials had 300 participants less than the year before. The number of participants in job search training increased by 400 compared to May last year.

in person's profession at the end of the month



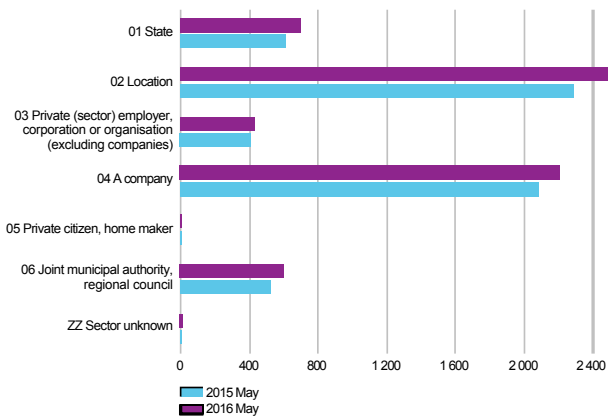
The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 33,000 people, representing an increase of 3,900 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 13,000, up 1,600 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 20,000, representing an increase of 2,300 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 6,200 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 700 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector

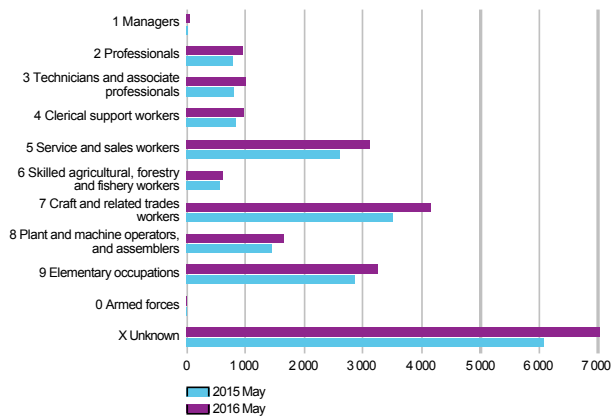

The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 6,500 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of May, which is 600 more than a year earlier. Of these job alternation substitutes, a total of 2,100 were men, representing an increase of 100 on the year before. The corresponding number for women was 4,400, up 500 on May the year before.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

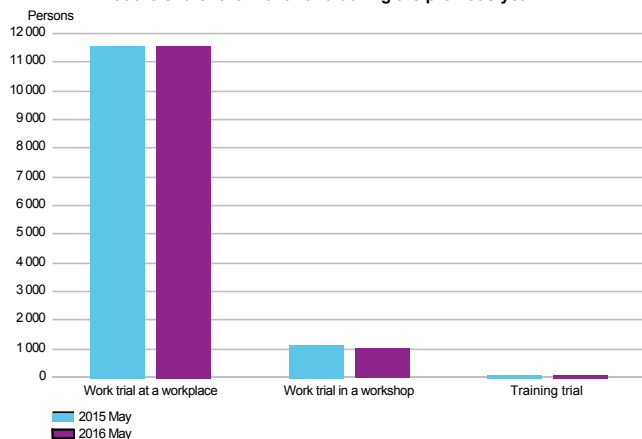

More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 22,800 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of May, which is 3,300 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,100 were men and 9,600 were women. The number of men increased by 1,900 from the year before, and the number of women by 1,400.

Participation in work and training trials almost the same as the previous year

Work and training trials had a total of 12,700 participants at the end of May, which is 100 less than the year before. Of the participants, 6,000 were men and 6,700 were women. The number of men remained the same, and the number of women decreased by 100.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during May totalled 48,200, which is 8,800 more than in May last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 92,200 in May, which is 6,300 more than a year ago. A total of 11,600 of these vacancies were filled during May, 5,900 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of May was 36,200, down 700 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for all occupational groups except for one; the greatest increases were in the groups of skilled workers (2,500), service and sales personnel (1,900), construction, repair and manufacturing workers (1,300) and other workers (1,100). The number of new job vacancies had remained the same in the group of farmers and forest workers (-2).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Employment and the Economy's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Employment and the Economy compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
