



# In June, the number of unemployed jobseekers was 366,100







A total of 366,100 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of June. This is 2,800 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 33,900 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 13.9 % of the labour force which is 0.1 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

### Trends:

### The total number of jobseekers increased

At the end of June, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 661,300, up 26,200 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 334,500 were men and 326,800 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 10,200 and the number of women by 16,000.


Of the jobseekers, 171,600 were employed, 148,400 of them were on the open labour market and 23,200 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 113,200, of whom 30,300 were in services promoting employment and 48,900 in training. Of the jobseekers, 366,100 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 2,800 less than the year before. In June, 20,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 600 more than in May. Since June last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 2,200. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 10,400, representing an increase of 1,900 from the year before.

## The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in June

At the end of June, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 366,100, down 2,800 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 33,900. Typical of the summer period, the increase was brought about by the entry into the labour market of the young graduates from various education institutions and termination of certain fixed-term employment contracts for the summer months. The termination of fixed-term contracts in summer increased unemployment particularly among women. Women's unemployment increased from May by 24,600.


In June, 20,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 600 more than in May. Since June last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 2,200.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 38,700, up 800 from June a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 10,800 at the end of June, up 300 from the year before.


### Unemployment decreased in eleven areas

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in June in the areas of eleven Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-10 %), Häme (-6 %), North Ostrobothnia (-5 %) and Central Finland (-5 %). Unemployment increased the most in Ostrobothnia (6 %), Pirkanmaa (3 %), and Uusimaa (2 %).

### Unemployment decreased among men


Of the unemployed jobseekers, 195,600 (53 %) were men and 170,500 (47 %) were women, indicating an increase of 9,300 for men and an increase of 24,600 for women from the figures for May. Compared with June a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 2,700 (-1 %) and among women by 100 (-0 %).

### Unemployment decreased in almost all age groups

At the end of June, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 54,200 representing a decrease of 1,500 from June a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from May by 12,400. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 13,900. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 128,200, representing an increase of 900 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 89,900, representing an increase of 1,200 on the year before.

### Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group




### Unemployment increased slightly among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, the unemployment decreased from June of last year among those with lower level basic qualifications (-12 %), higher level basic qualifications (-2 %) and lowest level of tertiary education (-2 %). Unemployment grew the most among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (4 %), lower-degree level tertiary education (2 %) and higher-degree level tertiary education (2 %).

### Unemployment decreased in seven occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in seven groups from June of last year; the most in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (-3,100), process and transport workers (-1,000) and other workers (-900). Consequently, unemployment grew the most in the groups of service and sales personnel (2,000) and specialised experts (400).




### Long-term unemployment continued to grow

At the end of June, the number of long-term unemployed who have been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 126,800, up 16,600 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 72,800 were men and 54,100 were women. The number of men increased by 9,000 (14 %) from the previous year and the number of women by 7,600 (16 %). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 57,500, which is 9,300 more than a year ago.





# The number of persons covered by services remained almost unchanged

At the end of June, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 107,900, up 1,000 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 13,700. The activation rate at the end of June was 22.8 %, which is 0.3 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 3.8 % of the labour force was covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 53,800, up 600 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 54,100, up 400 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 474,000 at the end of June. This is 1,800 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to the decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


### The number of placements decreased in all sectors

At the end of June, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 24,100, which is 5,800 less than the year before. Of those employed, 3 % were in government jobs, 28 % in local government jobs and 69 % in the private sector. Since June of the year before, the number of placements has decreased by 14 % in government jobs, by 4 % in local government jobs and by 24 % in the private sector. Of those employed, 55 % were men. Placements for men decreased by 2,700, and those for women by 3,000 from the previous year.

### Decrease in labour market training


At the end of June, labour market training was attended by 17,800 students, down 1,700 on the previous year. Of the students, 9,300 were men and 8,500 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 800 and the number of women by 900. During June, 2,300 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 300 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,500), which is 700 more than the year before. In June, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 900, which is 100 less than in June last year.



### The number of persons in training increased

At the end of June, 1,400 persons were in training, which is 500 more than the year before. Of those in training, the number of both men and women was 700. In June, work and training trials had 100 participants more than the year before. The number of participants in job search training increased by 400 compared to June last year.

in person's profession at the end of the month




### The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 27,400 people, representing an increase of 4,200 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 10,900, up 1,900 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 16,400, representing an increase of 2,300 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 4,700 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 800 on the previous year.



at the end of the month and during the previous year





A total of 20,100 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of June, which is 3,400 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 12,000 were men and 8,100 were women. The number of men increased by 2,000 a year earlier, and the number of women by 1,500.

at the end of the month and during the previous year




# The number of persons in work and training trials increased slightly

Work and training trials had a total of 10,800 participants at the end of June, which is 100 more than the previous year. Of the participants, 5,500 were men and 5,300 were women. The number of men decreased slightly, and the number of women increased by 200.

#### Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during June totalled 39,200, which is 5,200 more than in June the previous year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 75,000 in June, which is 6,700 more than a year ago. A total of 9,700 of these vacancies were filled during June, 5,400 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of June was 31,300, up 3,900 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for eight occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (1,800), process and transport workers (1,100), skilled workers (800), office and customer service workers (800) and specialised experts (600). The number of new job vacancies had decreased in three occupational groups; the most in the group of service and sales personnel (-200).

### Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
