

In October, the number of unemployed jobseekers was 328,900

A total of 328,900 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of October. This is 8,700 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 600 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 12.5% of the labour force which is 0.3 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.


Trends:

The total number of jobseekers increased

At the end of October, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 642,200, up 18,900 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 325,000 were men and 317,200 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 3,800 and the number of women by 15,000.


Of the jobseekers, 168,500 were employed, 145,500 of them were on the open labour market and 23,000 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 134,600, of whom 35,600 were in services promoting employment and 66,200 in training. Of the jobseekers, 328,900 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 8,700 less than the year before. In October, 19,700 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 2,400 more than in September. Since October last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 2,600.

Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 10,200, representing an increase of 400 from the year before.


The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in October

At the end of October, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 328,900, down 8,700 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 600.

In October, 19,700 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 2,400 more than in September. Since October last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 2,600.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 30,500, down 200 from October a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 9,400 at the end of October, down 200 from the year before.


UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased in eleven areas

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in October in the areas of eleven Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-14%), South Ostrobothnia (-9%), North Savo (-8%), Lapland (-7%), South Savo (-7%) and Häme (-7%). Unemployment increased only in Satakunta (7%), Ostrobothnia (5%), North Karelia (1%) and Pirkanmaa (1%).



by gender



Unemployment decreased considerably more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 180,900 (55%) were men and 148,000 (45%) were women indicating a decrease of 100 for men and 400 for women from the figures for September. Compared with October a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 8,400 (-4%) and among women by 300 (-0%).


Unemployment decreased in almost all age groups

At the end of October, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 41,000 representing a decrease of 2,400 from October a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from September by 1,300. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 9,000. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 125,400, representing a decrease of 1,200 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 88,400, representing a decrease of 500 on the year before.

Unemployment increased slightly among those with a higher level of education

Examined by level of education, the unemployment decreased from October of last year among those with lower level basic qualifications (-14%), higher level basic qualifications (-4%), lowest level of tertiary education (-2%) and upper secondary level of education (-2%). Unemployment grew among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (2%), higher-degree level tertiary education (2%) and lower-degree level tertiary education (1%).

by occupational group**



Unemployment decreased in nine occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in nine groups from October last year; the most in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (-6,200), process and transport workers (-2,100) and other workers (-1,400). At the same time, unemployment grew only in the groups of service and sales personnel (1,600) and specialised experts (400).

at the end of the month**





Long-term unemployment continued to grow

At the end of October, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 122,700, up 9,600 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 70,900 were men and 51,800 were women. The number of men increased by 4,800 (7%) from the previous year and the number of women by 4,800 (10%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 58,100, which is 8,200 more than a year ago.



Services




An increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of October, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 128,800, up 7,900 on the previous year. Compared with September, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 4,700. The activation rate at the end of October was 28.1%, which is 1.7 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.8% of the labour force was covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 61,600, up 4,400 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 67,200, up 3,500 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 457,800 at the end of October. This is 800 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.




The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of October, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 23,500, which is 2,600 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 27% in local government jobs and 71% in the private sector. Since October last year, the number of placements has decreased by 13% in government jobs and increased by 18% in local government jobs and by 12% in the private sector. Of those employed, 53% were men. Placements for men increased by 1,400, and those for women by 1,200 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month





Increase in labour market training

At the end of October, labour market training was attended by 23,400 students, up 400 on the previous year. Of the students, 12,100 were men and 11,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 600 and the number of women decreased by 200. During October, 6,500 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 1,800 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (9,100), which is 1,500 more than the year before. In October, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 1,000, which is 100 less than in October last year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



The number of persons in training increased

At the end of October, 3,300 persons were in training, which is 300 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,600 and of women 1,700. Career coaching had 1,800 participants, which is as many as the year before. The number of participants in job search training increased by 300 compared to October last year.


The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 38,800 people, representing an increase of 4,300 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 15,400, up 1,900 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 23,400, representing an increase of 2,400 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 8,000 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,300 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector



The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 4,300 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of October, which is 800 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,400 were men and 2,900 were women. The number of men decreased by 300, and the number of women by 600.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 23,200 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of October, which is 2,300 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,200 were men and 10,000 were women. The number of men increased by 1,200 from the year before, and the number of women by 1,100.


Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 12,400 participants at the end of October, which is 1,100 less than the year before. Of the participants, 5,500 were men and 6,900 were women. The number of men decreased by 600, and the number of women by 500.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during October totalled 40,000, which is 3,700 more than in October the previous year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 76,400 in October, which is 11,400 more than a year ago. A total of 8,700 of these vacancies were filled during October, 4,000 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 34,900 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number applicants. In addition, a total of 1,800 vacancies were cancelled and 1,900 vacancies could not be fulfilled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of October was 33,500, up 4,600 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for seven occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (2,100), process and transport workers (600), other workers (500) and skilled workers (400). The number of new job vacancies had decreased the most within the category of 'unknown' (-400).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
