



In December, the number of unemployed jobseekers was 358,100







A total of 358,100 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of December. This is 19,800 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 29,600 from the previous month. The increase in unemployment in December is a phenomenon occurring each year due to graduations from certain vocational education institutions, increases in lay-offs and a higher than normal number of fixed-term employment contracts ending during December. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 13.6% of the labour force, which is 0.8 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

The total number of jobseekers increased

At the end of December, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 657,300, up 4,500 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 336,300 were men and 321,000 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 5,400 and the number of women increased by 9,900.


Of the jobseekers, 165,100 were employed, 143,200 of them were on the open labour market and 21,900 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 123,600, of whom 30,200 were in services promoting employment and 60,600 in training. Of the jobseekers, 358,100 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 19,800 less than the year before. In December, 27,500 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 6,300 more than in November. Since December last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 7,100. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 10,400, representing a decrease of 100 from the year before.

The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in December

At the end of December, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 358,100, down 19,800 on the previous year. Compared with November, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 29,600.


In December, 27,500 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 6,300 more than in November. Since December last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 7,100.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 35,200, down 100 from December a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 10,400 at the end of December, down 600 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres



Unemployment decreased considerably more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 200,800 (56%) were men and 157,300 (44%) were women indicating an increase of 17,500 for men and 12,000 for women from the figures for November. Compared with December a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 15,800 (-7%) and among women by 4,100 (-3%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of December, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 48,100, representing a decrease of 4,300 from December a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from November by 7,900. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 10,500. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 131,600, representing a decrease of 4,600 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 91,200, representing a decrease of 3,000 on the year before.

Unemployment increased among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from December last year at six levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-16%), higher level basic qualifications (-6%) and lowest level of tertiary education (-5%). Unemployment grew only among those with doctorate or equivalent level tertiary education (4%).

Unemployment decreased in ten occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in ten groups from December last year; the most in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (-9,700), process and transport workers (-3,900) and other workers (-2,200). At the same time, unemployment grew only in the groups of service and sales personnel (200).



Long-term unemployment continued to grow

At the end of December, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 122,000, up 3,800 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 70,900 were men and 51,100 were women. The number of men increased by 1,400 (2%) from the previous year and the number of women by 2,400 (5%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 58,900, which is 6,900 more than a year ago.



An increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of December, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 114,100, up 6,500 on the previous year. Compared with November, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 15,300. The activation rate at the end of December was 24.2%, which is 2.0 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.3% of the labour force was covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 54,900, up 3,300 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 59,300, up 3,200 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 472,200 at the end of December. This is 13,400 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of December, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 22,000, which is 3,000 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 26% in local government jobs and 72% in the private sector. Since December last year, the number of placements has decreased by 8% in government jobs and increased by 15% in local government jobs and by 17% in the private sector. Of those employed, 51% were men. Placements for men increased by 1,500, and those for women also by 1,500 from the previous year.


The number of persons in labour market training remained the same

At the end of December, labour market training was attended by 20,000 students, which was the same as the year before. Of the students, 10,500 were men and 9,500 were women. The number of both men and women remained the same as the previous year. During December, 2,100 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 600 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,800), which is 1,100 more than the year before. In December, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 900, which is almost the same as in December last year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



The number of persons in training increased

At the end of December, 1,300 persons were in training, which is 300 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 700 and of women 600. Work and training trials had 400 participants, which is 200 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training increased by 100 compared to December last year.

The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 36,300 people, representing an increase of 3,900 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 14,600, up 1,800 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 21,700, representing an increase of 2,200 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 7,600 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,200 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector





The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,700 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of December, which is 1,100 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,200 were men and 2,500 were women. The number of men decreased by 300, and the number of women by 800.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 21,000 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of December, which is 1,500 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 12,200 were men and 8,800 were women. The number of men increased by 800 from the previous year and the number of women by 700.

Participation in work and training trials decreased


Work and training trials had a total of 9,800 participants at the end of December, which is 1,100 less than the year before. Of the participants 4,500 were men and 5,300 were women. The number of men decreased by 600, and the number of women by 500.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during December totalled 37,100, which is 1,700 more than December in the previous year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 68,500 in December, which is 7,400 more than a year ago. A total of 7,200 of these vacancies were filled during December, 3,700 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 28,500 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,000 vacancies were cancelled and 900 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of December was 32,900, up 4,800 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for six occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (1,900), process and transport workers (1,300) and other workers (600). The number of new job vacancies had decreased most in the category of service and sales personnel (-1,400), skilled workers (-900) and specialised experts (-400).

The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
