




In February, the number of unemployed jobseekers was 332,200







A total of 332,200 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of February. This is 28,800 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 10,700 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 12.6% of the labour force, which is 1.1 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- The total number of jobseekers decreased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 29,000 compared to the year before
- Services included in the activation rate had 7,000 more people than a year ago
- 2,000 new job vacancies less compared to last year

The total number of jobseekers decreased


At the end of February, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 645,800, down 3,500 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 330,000 were men and 315,800 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 9,900 and the number of women increased by 6,500.

Of the jobseekers, 167,500 were employed, 145,300 of them were on the open labour market and 22,200 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 135,800, of whom 35,800 were in services promoting employment and 67,000 in training. Of the jobseekers, 332,200 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 28,800 less than the year before. In February, 23,300 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 200 less than in January. Since February last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 7,100. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 10,300, representing a decrease of 600 from the year before.

The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in **February**

At the end of February, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 332,200, down 28,800 on the previous year. Compared with January, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 10,700.


In February, 23,300 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 200 less than in January. Since February last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 7,100.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 30,900, down 2,000 from February a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 9,600 at the end of February, down 1,100 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in February in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Kainuu (-17%), South Ostrobothnia (-12%), Pirkanmaa (-11%) and Central Finland (-10%).

Unemployment decreased considerably more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 188,500 (57%) were men and 143,700 (43%) were women, indicating a decrease of 5,200 for men and 5,500 for women from the figures for January. Compared with February a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 20,100 (-10%) and among women by 8,700 (-6%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of February, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 40,800 representing a decrease of 5,300 from February a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from January by 2,600. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 7,000. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 126,200, representing a decrease of 7,700 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 88,200, representing a decrease of 5,000 on the year before.

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from February last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-18%), lowest level of tertiary education (-8%), higher level basic qualifications (-8%) and upper secondary level of education (-7%).

Unemployment decreased in ten occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in ten groups from February last year; the most in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (-10,800), process and transport workers (-3,700) and specialised experts (-3,000). Unemployment remained unchanged in the group of armed forces (9).



Long-term unemployment decreased

At the end of February, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 117,300, down 4,700 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 68,200 were men and 49,100 were women. The number of men decreased by 3,300 (-5%) from the previous year and the number of women by 1,400 (-3%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 58,000, which is 3,900 more than a year ago.



An increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of February, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 126,000, up 7,000 on the previous year. Compared with January, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 4,200. The activation rate at the end of February was 27.5%, which is 2.7 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 4.8% of the labour force was covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 60,400, up 3,700 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 65,600, up 3,300 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 458,100 at the end of February. This is 21,800 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.

The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of February, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 22,400, which is 3,000 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 28% in local government jobs and 70% in the private sector. Since February last year, the number of placements has decreased by 7% in government jobs and increased by 15% in local government jobs and by 16% in the private sector. Of those employed, 51% were men. Placements for men increased by 1,300, and those for women by 1,700 from the previous year.


The number of persons in labour market training increased

At the end of February, labour market training was attended by 22,900 students, up 1,400 on the previous year. Of the students, 12,000 were men and 10,900 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 800 and the number of women by 500. During February, 5,100 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 1,000 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (9,400), which is 2,000 more than the year before. In February, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 900, which is 100 less than in February last year.

The number of persons in training increased

At the end of February, 2,300 persons were in training, which is 100 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,200 and of women 1,100. Work and training trials had 1,200 participants, which is 200 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training decreased by 100 compared to February last year.

The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 39,500 people, representing an increase of 3,500 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 16,000, up 1,800 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 23,500, representing an increase of 1,700 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 8,600 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,500 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector





The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,300 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of February, which is 1,600 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,100 were men and 2,300 were women. The number of men decreased by 500, and the number of women by 1,100.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



A total of 23,300 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of February, which is 1,600 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 13,200 were men and 10,000 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 800 from the previous year.

Participation in work and training trials decreased


Work and training trials had a total of 12,200 participants at the end of February, which is 900 less than a year earlier. Of the participants, 5,400 were men and 6,800 were women. The number of men decreased by 500, and the number of women by 400.

Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during February totalled 57,300, which is 2,200 less than February in the previous year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 109,900 in February, which is 3,300 more than a year ago. A total of 7,900 of these vacancies were filled during February, 4,000 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 38,100 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,400 vacancies were cancelled and 900 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of February was 63,800, up 4,000 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for five occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (1,300), other workers (1,100) and process and transport workers (500). The number of new job vacancies had decreased most in the category of skilled workers (-2,600), service and sales personnel (-1,900) and managers (-500).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
