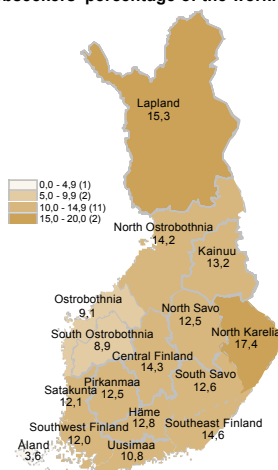

In June, the number of unemployed jobseekers was 320,100.

A total of 320,100 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of June. This is 46,000 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 28,600 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 12.2% of the labour force, which is 1.7 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

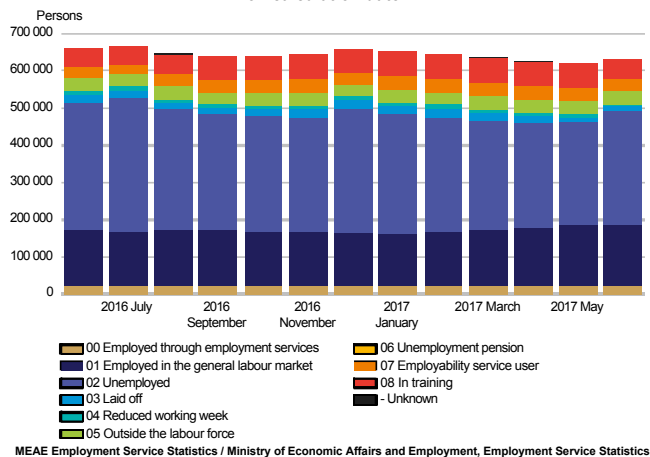

The total number of jobseekers decreased

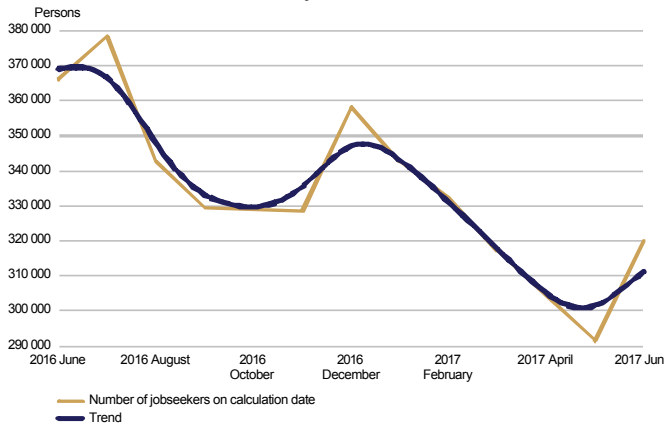
At the end of June, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 630,100, down 31,100 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 309,800 were men and 320,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 24,700 and the number of women by 6,400.

Of the jobseekers, 184,500 were employed, 160,300 of them were on the open labour market and 24,200 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 116,800, of whom 31,600 were in services promoting employment and 51,800 in training. Of the jobseekers, 320,100 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 46,000 less than the year before. In June, 12,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is the same number as in May. Since June last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 8,000. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 8,700, representing a decrease of 1,700 from the year before.

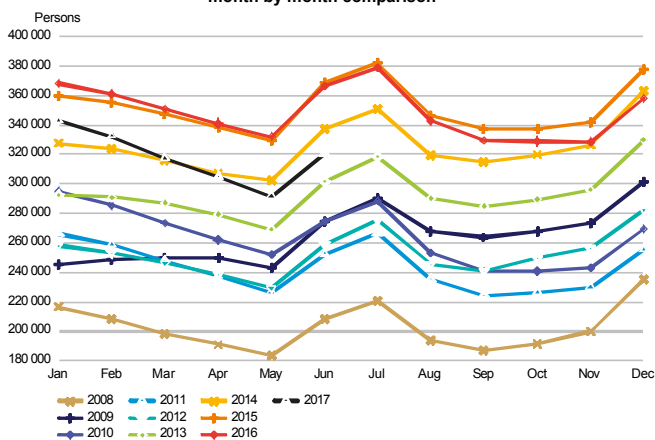
The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in June

At the end of June, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 320,100, down 46,000 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 28,600. Typical of the summer period, the increase was brought about by the entry into the labour market of the young graduates from various education institutions and termination of certain fixed-term employment contracts for the summer months. The termination of fixed-term contracts in summer increased unemployment particularly among women. Women's unemployment increased from May by 22,500.

In June, 12,600 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is the same number as in May. Since June last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 8,000.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 34,900, down 3,800 from June a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 9,200 at the end of June, down 1,600 from the year before.

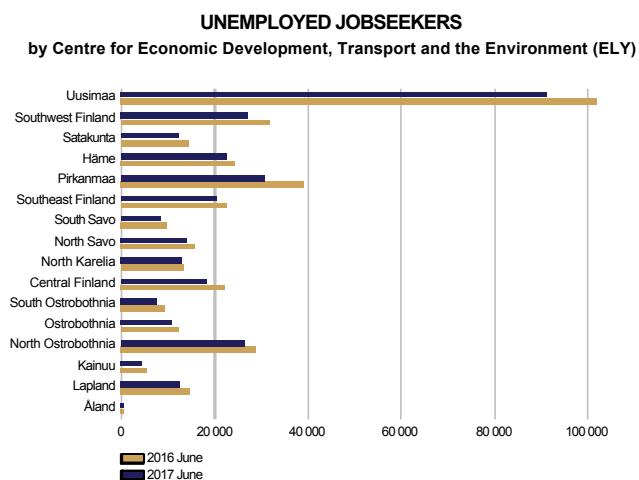
UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in June in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Pirkanmaa (-22%), Kainuu (-19%), Central Finland (-18%) and South Ostrobothnia (-16%).

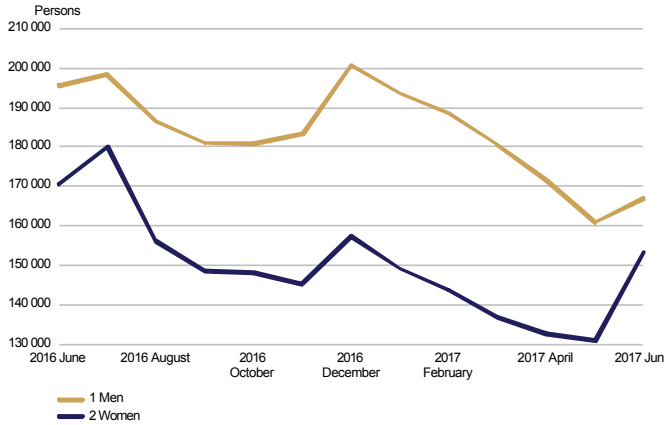

by gender**

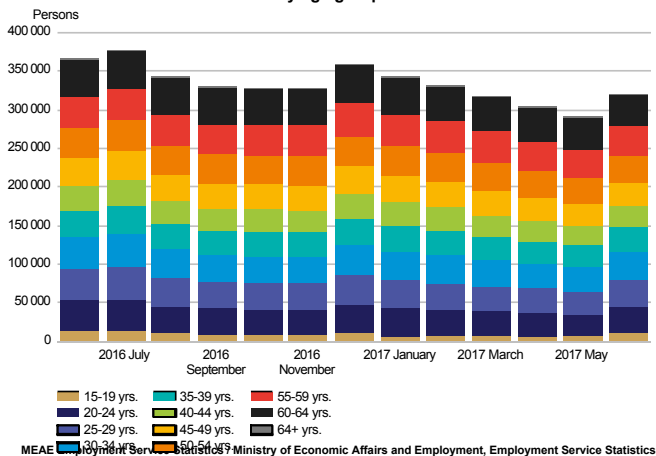

Unemployment decreased considerably more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 166,900 (52%) were men and 153,200 (48%) were women, indicating an increase of 6,200 for men and 22,500 for women compared to the figures in May. Compared with June a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 28,600 (-15%) and among women by 17,300 (-10%).

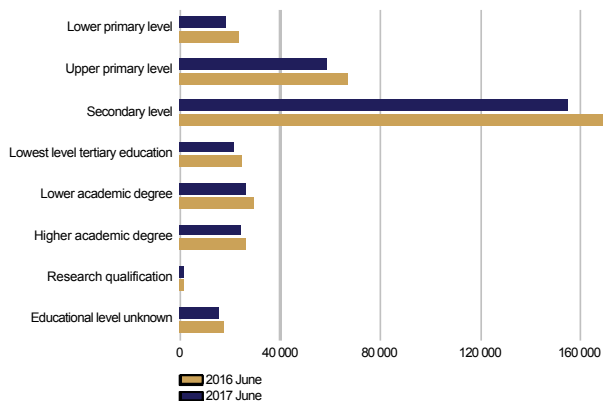
Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of June, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 45,800 representing a decrease of 8,400 from June a year ago. Youth unemployment increased from May by 10,800. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 12,100. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 113,600, representing a decrease of 14,600 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 79,500, representing a decrease of 10,400 on the year before.

by level of education

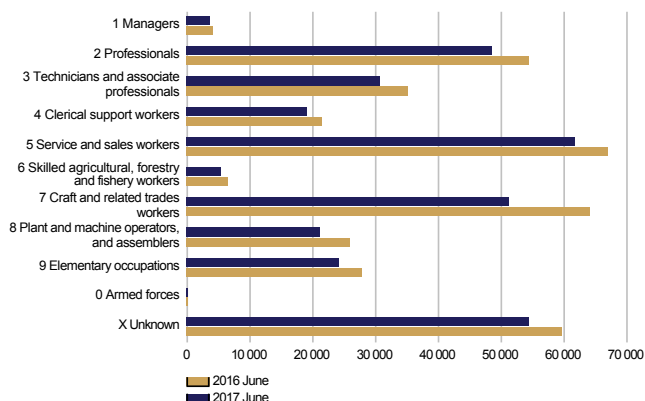

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from June last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-22%), lowest level of tertiary education (-14%), upper secondary level of education (-12%), higher level basic qualifications (-12%) and lower-degree level tertiary education (-12%).

by occupational group

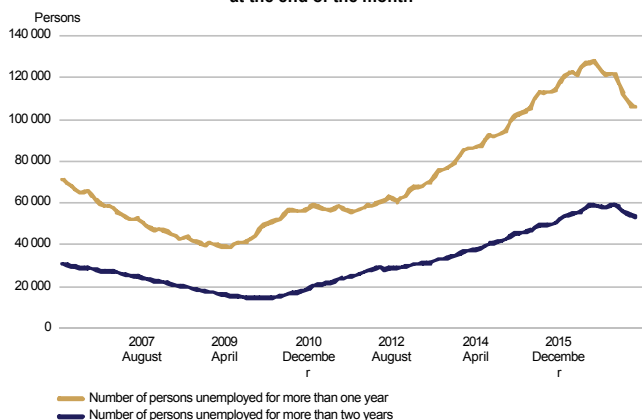

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from June last year; the most in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (-13,000), specialised experts (-5,700), service and sales workers (-5,300) and 'unknown' (-5,100).

Decrease in long-term unemployment

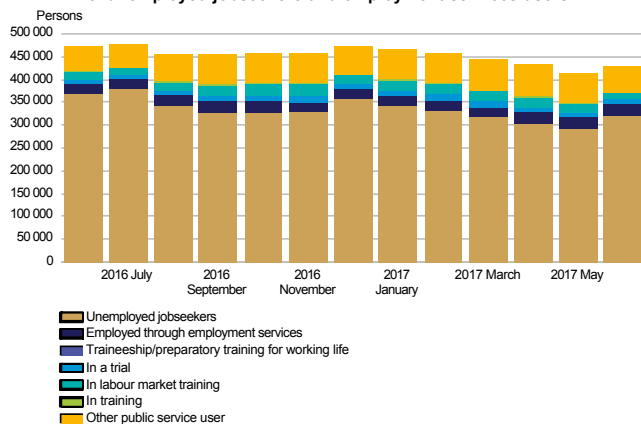
At the end of June, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 105,900, down 21,000 from the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 60,100 were men and 45,800 were women. The number of men decreased by 12,700 (-17%) from the previous year and the number of women by 8,300 (-15%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 53,200, which is 4,300 less than a year ago.

i.e. unemployed jobseekers and employment services users



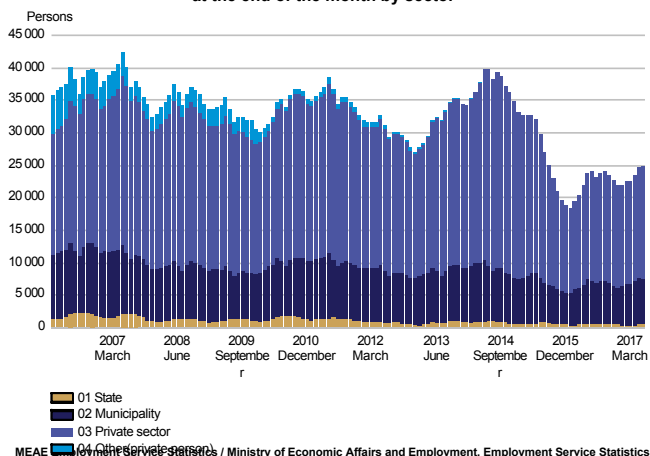
Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of June, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 108,300, up 400 on the previous year. Compared with May, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 16,000. The activation rate at the end of June was 25.3%, which is 2.5 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 3.8% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 54,400, up 600 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 53,900, down 200 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 428,400 at the end of June. This is 45,600 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers

EMPLOYED THROUGH EMPLOYMENT SERVICES at the end of the month by sector



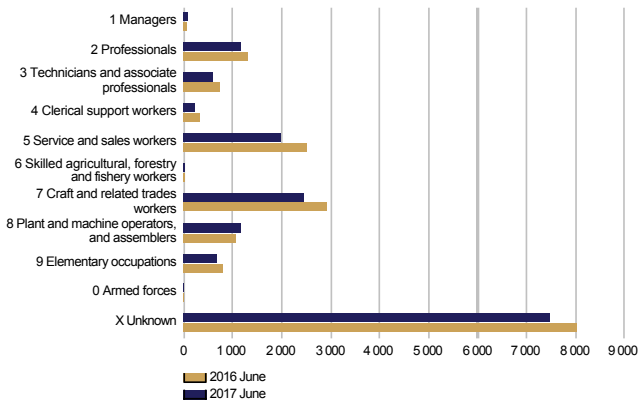
The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of June, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 24,700, which is 600 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 28% in local government jobs and 70% in the private sector. Since June last year, the number of placements has decreased by 19% in government jobs and increased by 4% in local government jobs and by 3% in the private sector. Of those employed, 53% were men. Placements for men have remained unchanged, and those for women increased by 600 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month



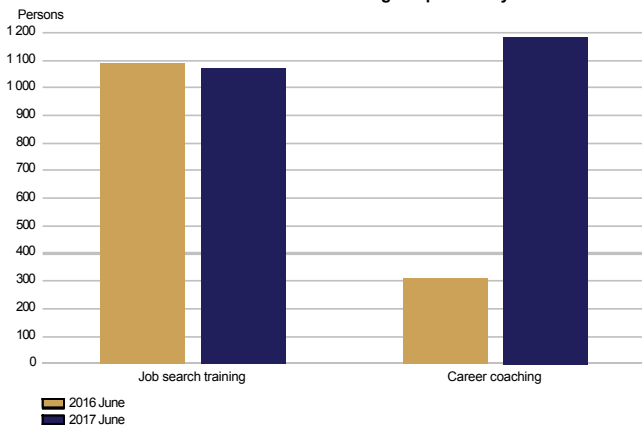

The number of persons in labour market training decreased

At the end of June, labour market training was attended by 15,800 students, down 2,000 on the previous year. Of the students, 8,600 were men and 7,200 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 700 and the number of women by 1,200. During June, 2,400 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 100 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (7,000), which is 500 more than the year before. In June, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 100, which is 900 less than in June last year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

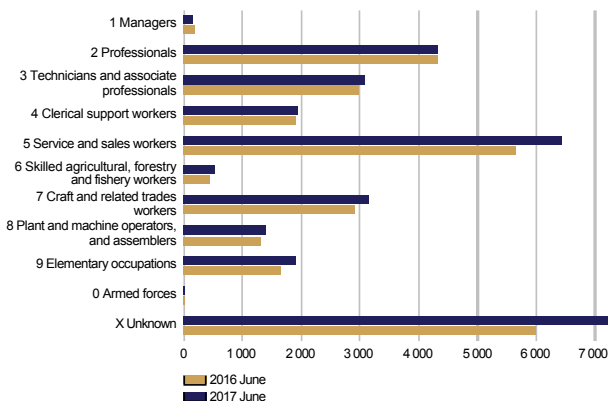

The number of persons in training increased

At the end of June, 2,300 persons were in training, which is 900 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 1,200 and of women 1,100. Work and training trials had 1,200 participants, which is 900 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training was unchanged from the previous year.

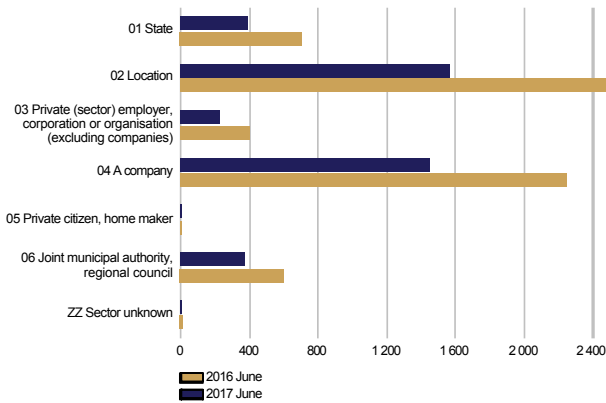
The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 30,200 people, representing an increase of 2,900 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 12,300, up 1,300 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 18,000, representing an increase of 1,500 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 5,900 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,100 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector

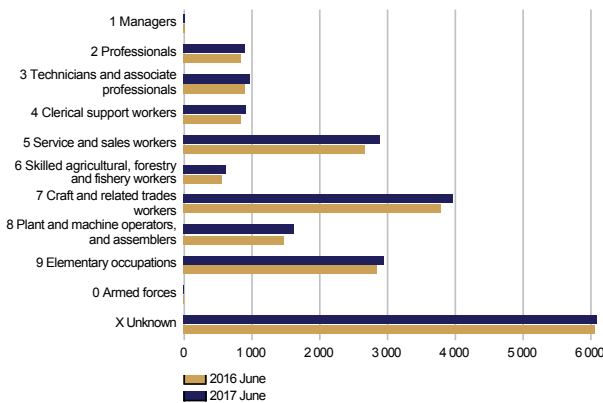

The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 4,000 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of June, which is 2,500 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,300 were men and 2,700 were women. The number of men decreased by 800, and the number of women by 1,700.

at the end of the month and during the previous year

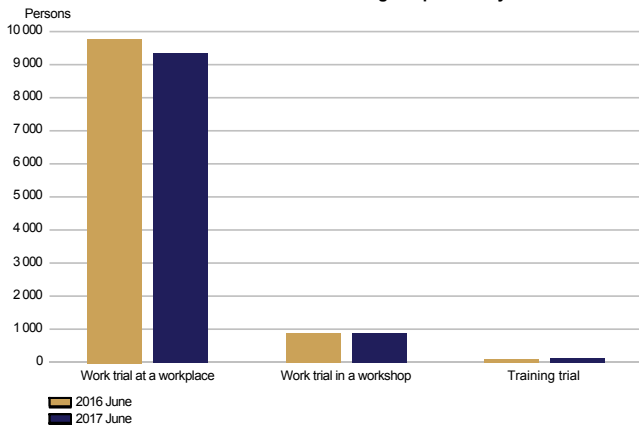

More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 20,900 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of June, which is 900 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 12,400 were men and 8,500 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 400 and the number of women by 500.

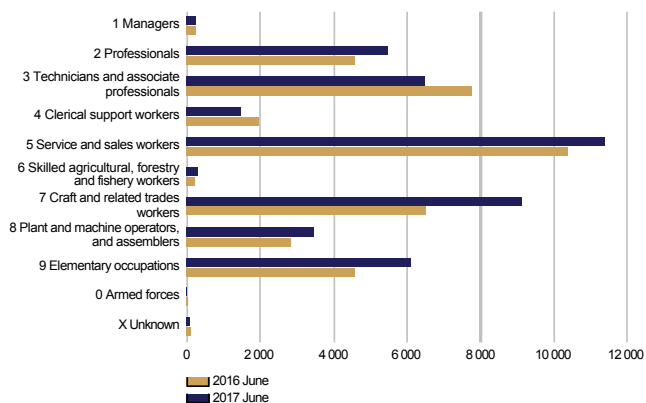
Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 10,400 participants at the end of June, which is 400 less than the year before. Of the participants, 5,400 were men and 4,900 were women. The number of men decreased by 100 from the previous year and the number of women by 300.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during June totalled 44,100, which is 4,900 more than in June the previous year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 85,000 in June, which is 10,000 more than a year ago. A total of 9,100 of these vacancies were filled during June, 5,500 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 37,400 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 1,800 vacancies were cancelled and 1,300 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of June was 36,500, up 5,200 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for six occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of construction, repair and manufacturing workers (2,600), other workers (1,500), service and sales workers (1,000), specialised experts (900) and process and transport workers (700). The number of new job vacancies had decreased most in the category of skilled workers (-1,300) and office and customer service workers (-500).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
