

In July 329,000 unemployed jobseekers


A total of 329,000 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices at the end of July. This is 49,400 less than a year earlier. The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 8,900 from the previous month. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 12.5% of the labour force, which is 1.9 percentage points less than a year ago. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:

- The total number of jobseekers decreased
- The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased by 49,000 compared to the year before
- Services included in the activation rate had 400 more people than a year ago
- 3,000 new job vacancies more compared to last year




The total number of jobseekers decreased

At the end of July, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 627,700, down 37,200 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 306,300 were men and 321,300 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 27,600 and the number of women by 9,600.


Of the jobseekers, 181,200 were employed, 157,700 of them were on the open labour market and 23,600 were employed through the services of the employment and economic development administration. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 109,000, of whom 28,000 were in services promoting employment and 48,500 in training. Of the jobseekers, 329,000 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 49,400 less than the year before. In July, 13,900 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,300 more than in June. Since July last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 7,700. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 8,400, representing a decrease of 1,600 from the year before.

The number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in July

At the end of July, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices totalled 329,000, down 49,400 on the previous year. Compared with June, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 8,900.

In July, 13,900 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 1,300 more than in June. Since July last year, the number of people fully laid off has decreased by 7,700.


The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 37,200, down 3,700 from July a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 9,500 at the end of July, down 1,600 from the year before.

Unemployment decreased in the areas of all ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in July in the areas of all Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); the most in Pirkanmaa (-21%), Central Finland (-19%) and Kainuu (-17%).



Unemployment decreased considerably more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 168,100 (51%) were men and 161,000 (49%) were women, indicating an increase of 1,100 for men and 7,800 for women compared to the figures in June. Compared with July a year ago, the unemployment among men decreased by 30,200 (-15%) and among women by 19,100 (-11%).

Unemployment decreased in all age groups

At the end of July, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 45,700, representing a decrease of 9,100 from July a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased from June by 100. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 11,200. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 115,700, representing a decrease of 15,600 on the year before. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 80,300, representing a decrease of 11,300 on the year before.

Unemployment decreased at all levels of education


Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from July last year at all levels of education; the decrease was greatest among those with lower level basic qualifications (-23%), lowest level of tertiary education (-14%), lower-degree level tertiary education (-13%) and upper secondary level of education (-13%).

Unemployment decreased in all occupational groups

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in all groups from July last year; the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (-13,000), professionals (-6,900), service and sales workers (-6,300) and 'unknown' (-5,500).





Decrease in long-term unemployment

At the end of July, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 106,100, down 21,000 on the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 60,000 were men and 46,200 were women. The number of men decreased by 12,900 (-18%) from the previous year and the number of women by 8,100 (-15%). Long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 53,200, which is 5,600 less than a year ago.



Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of July, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 99,800, up 400 on the previous year. Compared with June, the number of persons covered by such services decreased by 8,500. The activation rate at the end of July was 23.3%, which is 2.5 percentage points higher than a year earlier. In all, 3.6% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 50,200, up 200 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 49,600, also up 200 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 428,800 at the end of July. This is 49,000 less than a year earlier. The decrease in broad unemployment was due to a decrease in the number of unemployed jobseekers.


The number of placements increased in local government and the private sector

At the end of July, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, employed by the State or receiving start-up grants totalled 23,800, which is 500 more than the year before. Of those employed, 2% were in government jobs, 28% in local government jobs and 70% in the private sector. Since July last year, the number of placements has decreased by 23% in government jobs and increased by 5% in local government jobs and by 2% in the private sector. Of those employed, 54% were men. Placements for men decreased by 100, and those for women increased by 600 from the previous year.


The number of persons in labour market training decreased

At the end of July, labour market training was attended by 14,100 students, down 2,200 on the previous year. Of the students, 7,500 were men and 6,600 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 1,000 and the number of women by 1,100. During July, 900 new students began labour market training, representing an increase of 400 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (6,400), which is 300 more than the year before. In July, the number of people without a specified target occupation was 100, which is 800 less than in July last year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year





The number of persons in training increased

At the end of July, 1,600 persons were in training, which is 600 more than the year before. The number of men in training was 800 and of women 700. Career coaching had 800 participants, which is 600 more than a year earlier. The number of participants in job search training was unchanged from the previous year.

The number of people in self-motivated study increased from the previous year


Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 29,500 people, representing an increase of 2,700 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 12,000, up 1,300 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 17,500, representing an increase of 1,400 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 5,700 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 1,100 on the previous year.

at the end of the month and during the previous year by sector





The number of job alternation substitutes decreased

A total of 3,900 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of July, which is 2,100 less than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,300 were men and 2,600 were women. The number of men decreased by 700, and the number of women by 1,400.

More participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 18,700 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of July, which is 1,000 more than a year earlier. Of the participants 11,200 were men and 7,500 were women. The number of both men and women increased by 500 from the previous year.


Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 8,300 participants at the end of July, which is 200 less than the year before. Of the participants, 4,600 were men and 3,700 were women. The number of men remained the same and the number of women decreased by 200 on the previous year.

Increase in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices during July totalled 39,200, which is 3,200 more than in July last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies at Employment and Economic Development Offices amounted to 75,200 in July, which is 7,500 more than a year ago. A total of 6,400 of these vacancies were filled during July, 3,600 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 30,100 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number of applicants. In addition, a total of 2,400 vacancies were cancelled and 900 vacancies could not be filled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at the end of July was 38,300, up 5,900 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had increased for seven occupational groups; the greatest increases were in the groups of craft and related trades workers (2,400), service and sales workers (1,800), other workers (1,600) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,000). The number of new job vacancies had decreased most in the category of technicians and associate professionals (-3,100) and clerical support workers (-600).

Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
