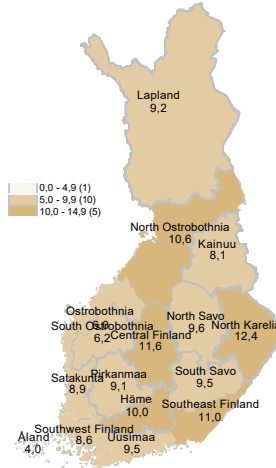

# In September 249,800 unemployed jobseekers

Unemployed jobseekers' percentage of the workforce by ELY centre



At the end of September, a total of 249,800 unemployed jobseekers were registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. This is 16,900 more than a year earlier. Compared with the previous month, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 300. Unemployed jobseekers accounted for 9.4% of the labour force, which is 0.6 percentage points more than the year before. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

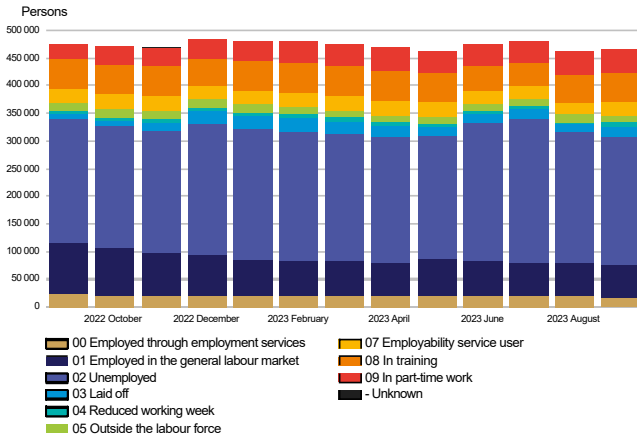
## Trends:

- Total number of all jobseekers decreased by 9,600
- The number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 16,900 from the previous year
- The number of people fully laid off increased by 8,300
- Services included in the activation rate had 200 more people than a year ago
- The number of new job vacancies decreased by 32,500 from the previous year

### The total number of jobseekers decreased

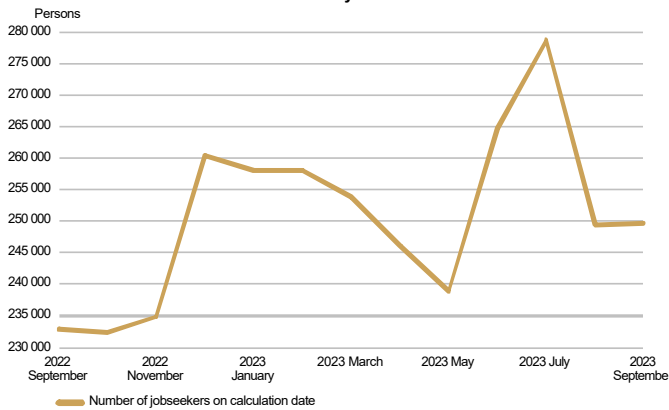
At the end of September, the number of jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 466,000, down 9,600 on the previous year. Of the jobseekers, 243,000 were men and 223,100 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men increased by 3,600 and the number of women decreased by 13,100. Of the jobseekers, 243,600, or 14,100 more than a year earlier, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment.

Of the jobseekers, 118,700 were employed: 58,200 of them were in full-time work, 42,400 were in part-time work and 18,100 were employed through the services organised by the employment and economic development administration and local government pilots on employment. The number of jobseekers outside the labour force was 90,800, of whom 23,300 were in services promoting employment and 54,900 in training. Of the jobseekers, 249,800 were unemployed jobseekers, which is 16,900 more than the year before. In September, 17,700 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 3,000 more than in August. The number of people fully laid off increased by 8,300 from September a year earlier. Furthermore, jobseekers on a reduced working week numbered 6,700, representing an increase of 1,500 from the year before.

monthly**

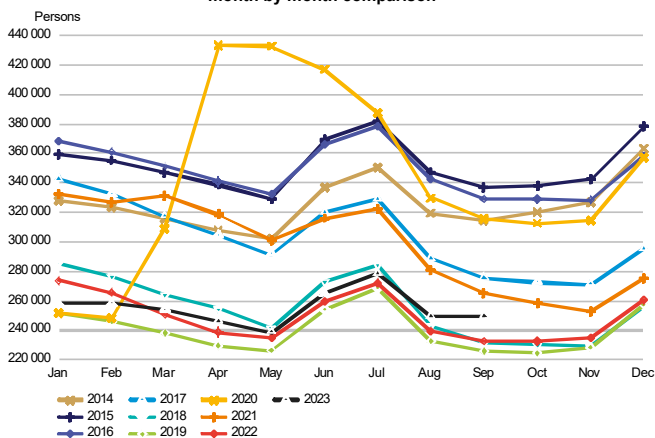


### Increase in unemployed jobseekers in September

At the end of September, the number of unemployed jobseekers registered at the Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment totalled 249,800, up 16,900 on the previous year. Compared with August, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 300. Of the unemployed jobseekers, 143,000, or 11,300 more than in September a year ago, were customers of municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment. The number of new job searches among unemployed jobseekers totalled 16,200, up 3,100 from September a year ago. In September, the number of starting periods of unemployment totalled 43,900, representing an increase of 11,600 on the year before. The number of starting periods of unemployment increased by 6,300 from August. The number of starting periods is always greater than the number of job searches because new unemployment periods are also registered from the existing groups of jobseekers.

The number of foreign citizens among unemployed jobseekers totalled 36,600, up 4,600 from September a year ago. Of these foreign unemployed jobseekers, EU/EEA citizens accounted for 8,900 at the end of September, up 800 from the year before.

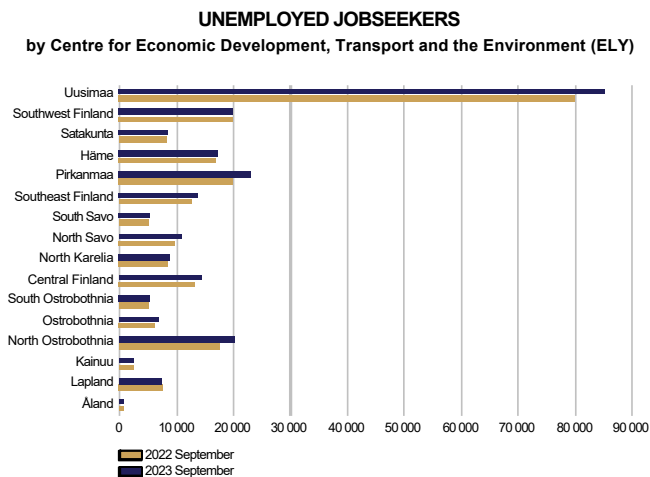
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

In September, 17,700 of unemployed jobseekers were fully laid off, which is 3,000 more than in August. The number of people fully laid off increased by 8,300 from September a year earlier. In September, the number of job searches among the fully laid off people totalled 2,600, representing an increase of 1,500 on the year before. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs was 11,000, up 8,000 from September a year ago. The number of starting periods of full lay-offs increased by 2,800 from August. Examined by occupation, the number of people fully laid off increased in eight groups and decreased in one. The number of people fully laid off increased the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (3,000), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (1,900), "unknown" (1,500), and professionals (900). The number of people fully laid off decreased only among service and sales workers (-200). The number of laid-off people remained unchanged in the groups of armed forces and skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers.



## Unemployed jobseekers by region



### Unemployment decreased in the areas of two ELY Centres

Compared to the same period in the previous year, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in September in the areas of two Centres for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment (ELY Centres); in Lapland (-5%) and Kainuu (-1%). The number of unemployed jobseekers grew the most in Pirkanmaa (16%), North Ostrobothnia (15%), Ostrobothnia (11%), Southeast Finland (11%) and North Savo (11%). In Åland, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased 2%. Compared with August, the number of unemployed jobseekers decreased in the areas of six ELY Centres; the most in Lapland (-3%), Southwest Finland (-2%), North Karelia (-2%) and Ostrobothnia (-2%). In Åland, the number of unemployed jobseekers increased by 6% from August.

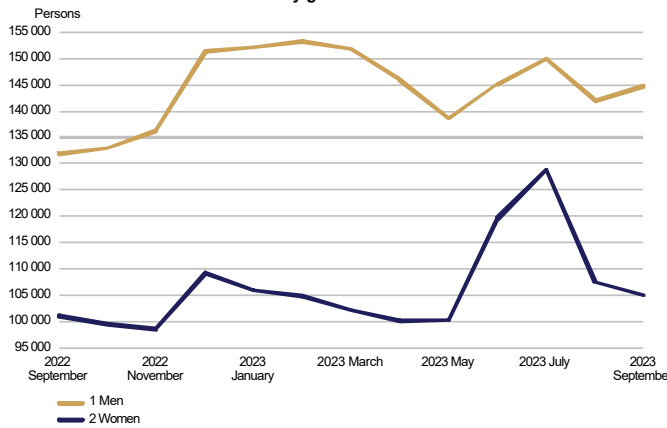

## Unemployed jobseekers by gender and age-group

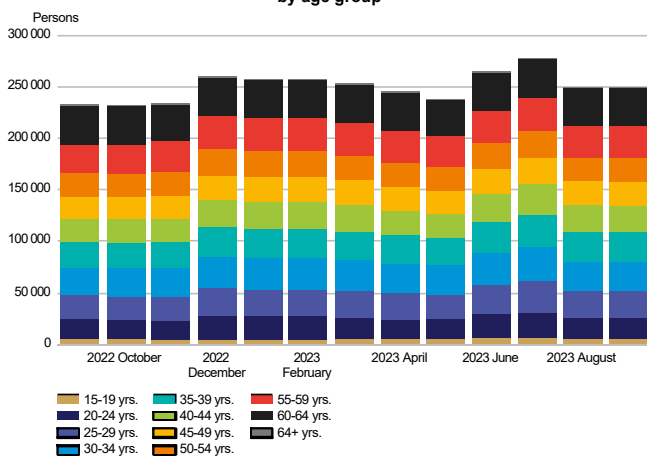
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

### Unemployment increased more among men than women

Of the unemployed jobseekers, 144,800 (58%) were men and 104,900 (42%) were women, indicating an increase of 2,800 for men and a decrease of 2,600 for women from the figures for August. Compared with September a year ago, unemployment increased by 13,000 (10%) among men and by 3,900 (4%) among women.

by age group**



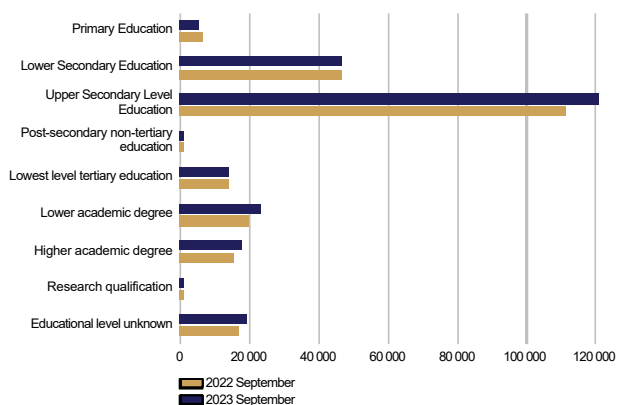
### Unemployment decreased only among those 64 years of age or more

At the end of September, unemployed jobseekers under 25 years of age numbered 26,000, representing an increase of 1,900 from September a year ago. Youth unemployment decreased by 100 from August. For those under 20, the number of unemployed was 5,700. Among those over 50, the number of unemployed was 91,300, representing an increase of 2,400 on the previous year. Among those over 55, the number of unemployed was 67,700, representing an increase of 1,600 on the year before. Unemployment decreased among those over 64 years of age (-8%). Unemployment increased the most among those between 15 and 19 (18%), those between 40 and 44 (13%) and those between 45 and 49 years of age (12%). Compared with August, unemployment decreased in three age groups; those between 35 and 39, those between 40 and 44 and those between 20 and 24 years of age (-1%).



## Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group

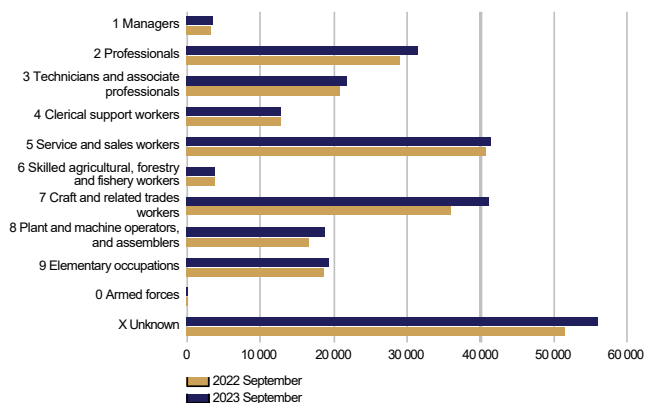
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

### Unemployment decreased at only one level of education

Examined by level of education, unemployment decreased from September of last year at only one level of education; those with lower level basic qualifications (-14%). Unemployment increased the most among those with post-secondary non-tertiary education (18%), lower-degree level tertiary education (17%), education level unknown (14%), and higher-degree level tertiary education (14%). Unemployment remained unchanged among those with higher level basic qualifications.

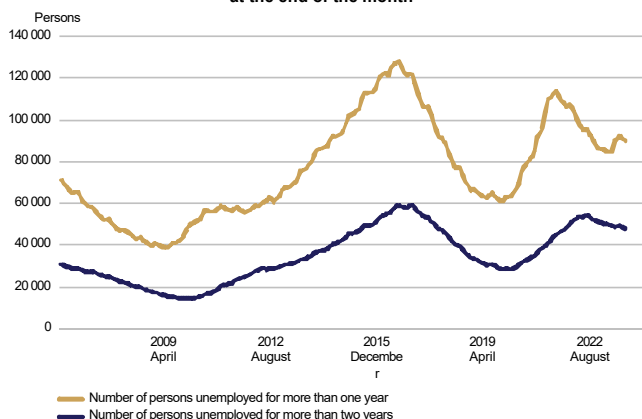
**UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS

### Unemployment decreased in only one occupational group

Examined by occupation, unemployment decreased in only one group from September of last year; skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (-100). Unemployment increased the most in the groups of craft and related trades workers (5,100), "unknown" (4,400), professionals (2,500), and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (2,400). Unemployment remained unchanged among armed forces and office and customer service workers.

at the end of the month**

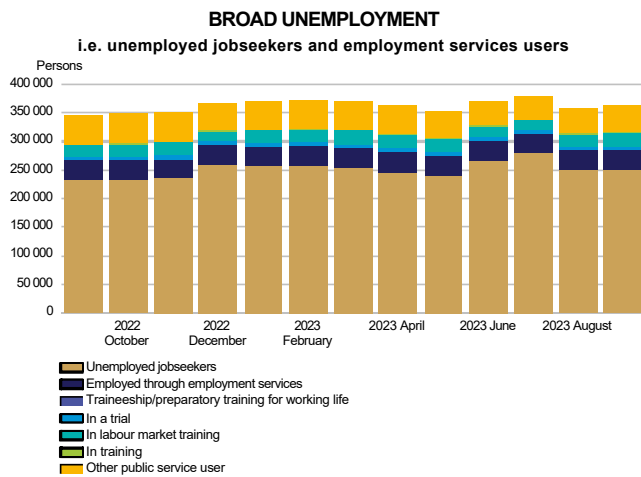


### Long-term unemployment remained unchanged

At the end of September, the number of long-term unemployed who had been unemployed without interruption for more than a year amounted to 89,900, unchanged from the previous year. Of the long-term unemployed, 54,000 were men and 35,900 were women. The number of men decreased by 200 (-0.4%) from the previous year and the number of women increased by 200 (1%). Long-term unemployed who have been unemployed without interruption for more than two years numbered 47,800, which is 4,600 fewer than a year ago.



## Services



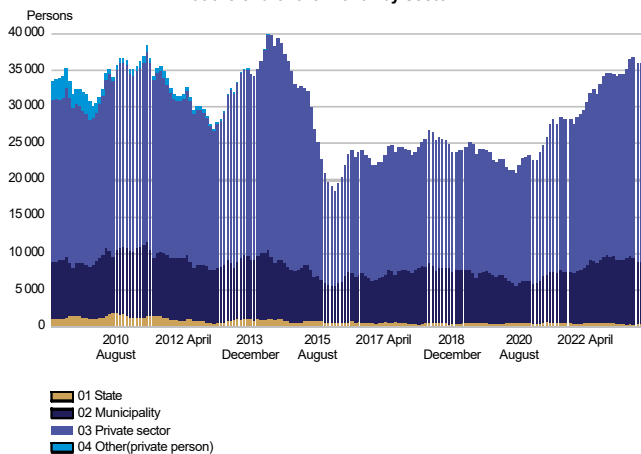
### Increase in the number of persons covered by services

At the end of September, the number of persons covered by services included in the activation rate amounted to 112,700, up 200 on the previous year. Compared with August, the number of persons covered by such services increased by 4,700. Of those covered by services, 66,800 were customers of the local government pilots, which is 3,500 more than in September last year. The activation rate at the end of September was 31.1%, which is 1.5 percentage points lower than a year earlier. In all, 4.0% of the labour force were covered by these services.

Of those covered by services, the number of men was 54,100, up 300 on the previous year. The number of women covered by these services was 58,600, down 200 on the previous year.

Broad unemployment, or the total number of unemployed jobseekers and those covered by services, was 362,500 at the end of September. This is 17,100 more than a year earlier. The growth in broad unemployment was primarily due to the increase in unemployed jobseekers.

### The number of placements increased in the private sector

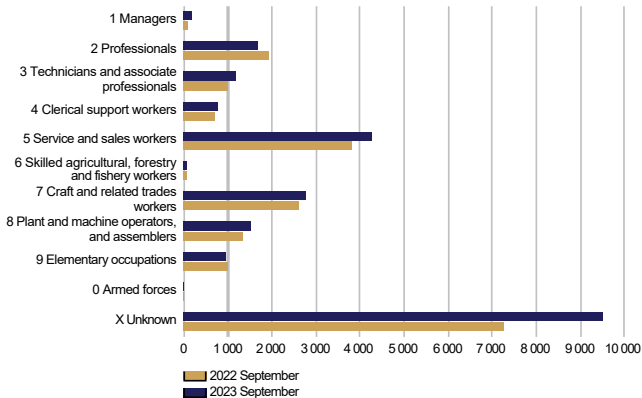
At the end of September, the number of persons claiming pay subsidies, in placement in central government jobs or receiving start-up grants totalled 35,700, which is 1,500 more than the year before. Of those in placement, 1% were in central government jobs, 24% in municipalities and 75% in the private sector. Since September last year, the number of placements had increased by 9% in the private sector, but decreased by 43% in central government jobs and by 6% in municipalities. Of those in placements, 54% were men. Placements for men increased by 1,100, and those for women by 300 from the previous year.

in target profession at the end of the month

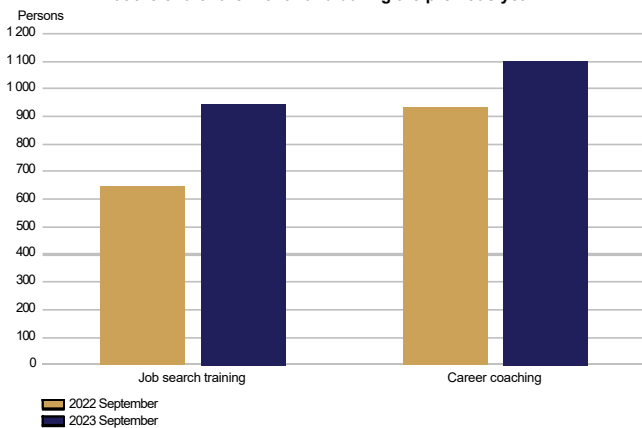


### Increase in the number of persons in labour market training

At the end of September, labour market training was attended by 22,900 students, up 3,100 on the previous year. Of the students, 10,200 were men and 12,700 were women. The number of men increased by 1,100, and the number of women by 2,000 from September last year. During September, 5,400 new students began labour market training, representing a decrease of 200 on the year before.

Based on target occupation, the largest subgroup within the category of 'unknown' were people in integration training (8,800), which is 2,200 more than the year before.

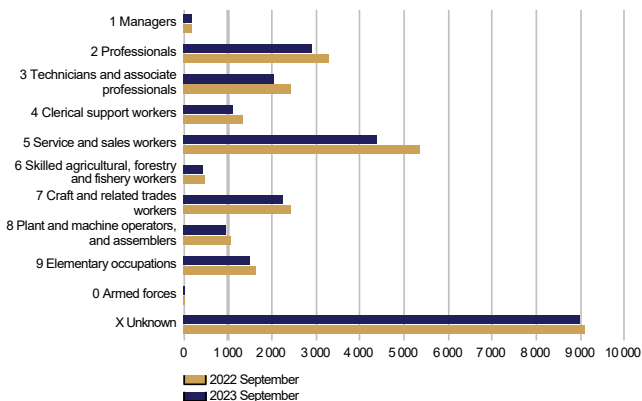
**IN TRAINING**

### The number of persons in training increased

At the end of September, 2,000 persons were in training, which is 500 more than the year before. Of those in training, 1,000 were men and 1,000 were women. Career coaching had 1,100 participants in September, which is 200 more than a year earlier. The number of people receiving job search training was 900, which is 300 more than the previous year.

in person's profession at the end of the month



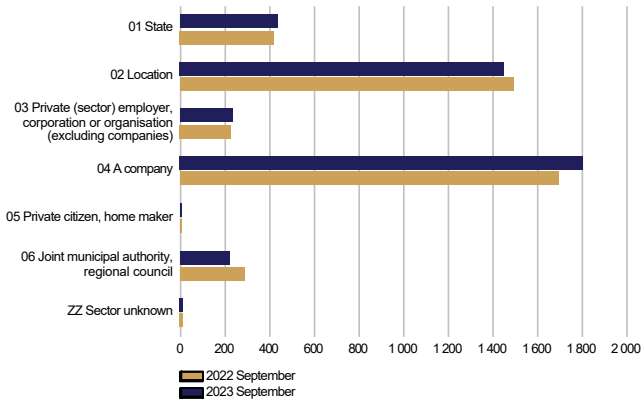
### The number of people in self-motivated study decreased from the previous year

Self-motivated studies supported by unemployment benefits were attended by a total of 24,700 people, representing a decrease of 2,600 on the year before. The number of men receiving unemployment benefits for studies was 9,400, down 900 on the previous year. Among women, the number was 15,300, representing a decrease of 1,700 on the year before. Occupation was undetermined in case of 8,300 persons in the group of 'unknown', up 100 on the previous year.

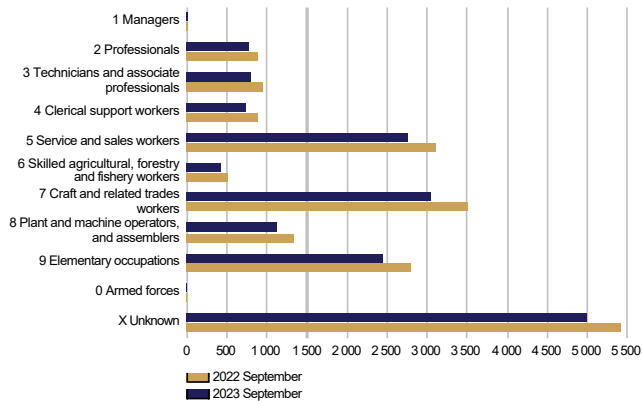
**AS A JOB ALTERNATION SUBSTITUTE**

### The number of job alternation substitutes increased

A total of 4,200 persons were job alternation substitutes at the end of September, which is 100 more than a year earlier. Of the substitutes, 1,600 were men and 2,700 were women. Compared with last year, the number of men remained the same, and the number of women increased by 100.

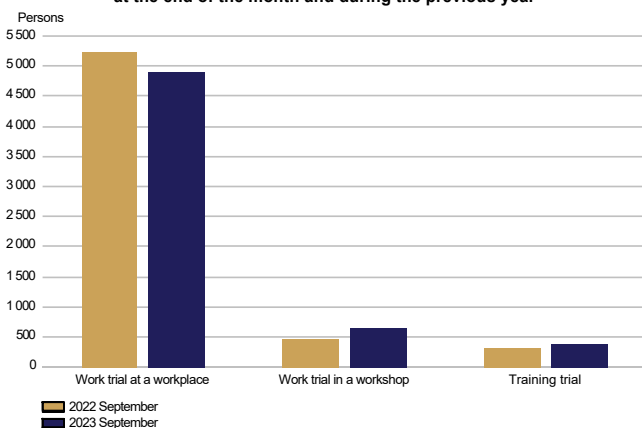
**REHABILITATIVE WORK ACTIVITIES**

### Fewer participants in rehabilitative work activities than in the previous year

A total of 17,100 persons participated in rehabilitative work activities at the end of September, which is 2,200 fewer than a year earlier. Of the participants 9,600 were men and 7,600 were women. Compared to the situation a year ago, the number of men decreased by 1,300 and the number of women by 900.

at the end of the month and during the previous year



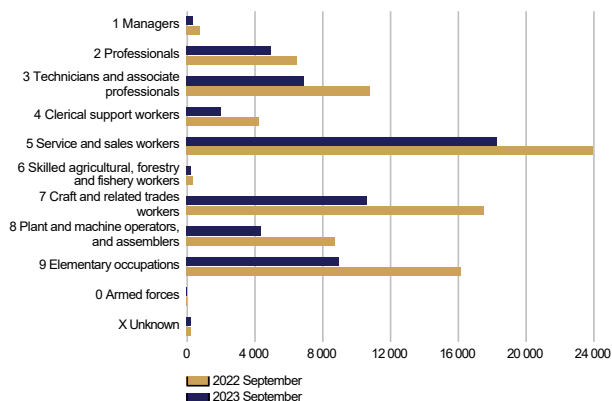
### Participation in work and training trials decreased

Work and training trials had a total of 5,900 participants at the end of September, which is 100 fewer than the year before. Of the participants, 3,000 were men and 2,900 were women. The number of men increased by 100 and the number of women decreased by 200 from the previous year.



## Jobs vacant

### Decrease in the number of new vacancies

The number of new vacancies reported to Employment and Economic Development Offices and municipalities participating in the local government pilots on employment during September totalled 56,900, which is 32,500 fewer than in September last year. In all, the number of unfilled vacancies in September was 109,300, which is 62,200 fewer than a year ago. A total of 9,100 of these vacancies were filled during September, 1,600 of them through Employment and Economic Development Offices. A total of 42,800 vacancies were closed for applications because the application period had ended or because there was a sufficient number applicants. In addition, a total of 9,400 vacancies were cancelled and 700 vacancies could not be fulfilled. The number of vacancies remaining unfilled at Employment and Economic Development Offices and in local government pilots at the end of September was 52,100, down 32,000 on the previous year.

The number of new vacancies had decreased in almost all occupational groups; the most in the groups of elementary occupations (-7,300), craft and related trades workers (-6,900), service and sales workers (-5,700), plant and machine operators, and assemblers (-4,400), and technicians and associate professionals (-3,900). The number of new vacancies remained unchanged in the occupational group of armed forces.
